She opened the retail store in 2016 after converting it from her family-operated restaurant launched in 2001.

counter tops."

- · Improve visibility and safety for motorists
- Reduce road maintenance costs
- Reduce fire risk and allow for proper drainage
- Prevent the spread of weed species

### Limited Control Area Agreements

Landowners who wish to restrict herbicide applications from occurring on municipal lands adjacent to their property can enter into a Limited Control Area Agreement with Sturgeon County. Limited Control Area Agreements are only valid for the year that they are issued and must be renewed on an annual basis.

Property owners/residents who choose to participate in this program will be responsible for vegetation control on municipal lands for which their Limited Control Area Agreement applies.

The deadline to complete a Limited Control Area Agreement is May 9, 2022.






