

"To sell things like hockey cards, they require you to have a brick and mortar store," said Gawluk. "That was why I started this. I wanted to sell hockey cards. And so I get to sell hockey cards now, which is pretty awesome."

Gawluk had to wait a while before he could finally open his store to offer hockey cards, so he kept busy with other things. "I have grading company now, which just we just signed on [recently], so it's kind of a big deal, especially for the Town of Redwater and Edmonton area."

His retail store carries a variety of items ranging from hockey cards, Pokemon, action figures and board games. A recent arrival is Dragon Ball Card Super action figures. "They are kind of a big deal," said Gawluk."Two movies are coming out for that

this year, so that will be a big deal."

Jethro's Cards & Collectibles doesn't carry puzzles or comics, although Gawluk might consider ordering a few comic supplies. But retailers globally are facing supply challenges. "It's tough to get plastics; there's a real shortage," he said. "When the plastic market in the world dropped, one of the first things that got hit was collectibles.'

Gawluk began collecting hockey cards when he was three years old. "I've always been collecting hockey cards," he said. "So I want to get more hockey cards in here. I love the town and started up the store, and it's been really good."

He manages a store Facebook page and recently created a You-Tube channel to connect with customers of all ages. He also enjoys meeting them when they visit to compare

cards and talk shop. "The kids of Redwater are fantastic," he said. "They're really excited to have a store in town, and I'm super excited to be here."

Gawluck estimates his customers are a 50-50 mix of youth and adults.

He's noticed a few trends. For example, some adult customers only collect hockey cards, others collect Pokemon cards with their kids, and many adults enjoy playing games like Digimon and Dragon Ball.

"I don't think a single demographic comes into the store that doesn't surprise me," he said. "I've had senior citizens come in and pick stuff up for their grandkids. Everybody wants to hang out with their kids and their grandkids. And this is a really good platform for that because you're collecting, and it's super fun art, games, and all of it."

In this renewal application, Waste Management of Canada Corporation also proposed changes to the existing design and monitoring requirements for this landfill.

A look inside the Hutterian Brethren of Smoky Lake Colony

Anyone driving north from highway 45 on highway 855 can see the Hutterite Colony of Smoky Lake County just across the North Saskatchewan River. The official name of the colony is the Hutterian Brethren of Smoky Lake Colony. The colony is a society in itself, largely self-sustaining and organized like a well-oiled machine. The history of the Hutterites originates in Tirol, Austria. From there, they moved Moravia (currently the Czech Republic), to Ukraine and then crossed the Atlantic to the United States and Canada. Their religion is anabaptist and originates from the 16th century. The colony executive consists of a chief, a manager and a field manager. The chief is in charge of everything; the manager looks after the everyday business.



The field manager looks after all the agricultural work, which entails everything from harrowing, fertilizing, and seeding to harvesting and everything in between. These three executives meet daily for planning and organizing purposes. Every colony member has a job, but as some have a seasonal job, they have

a second job. An example is a combination of working in the greenhouse (seasonal) and being a school teacher or having another assignment. A quick look into the greenhouse shows that flowers, vegetables and garden decorations are sold. Some of these decorations are made locally, and others are made elsewhere in the

region. The colony children attend the school with colony members as school teachers. The teachings are in high German as the books in the church are all written in high German, the colony's everyday language is low German, and everyone speaks English. The colony owns a massive herd of dairy cows. These cows

produce sufficient milk for the colony for all sorts of dairy products, which – by the way – cannot be sold to the general public due to government regulations. A barn full of chickens ensures regular production of eggs for the colony and anyone looking for farm-fresh eggs. Everything grown or produced is fully organic

environmentally responsible: the fertilizer for the greenhouse plants is organic, and the manure produced by the cows is injected into the land to avoid run-off into ditches and prevent a penetrating stench in the area. The colony is very welcoming to anyone wanting to drop in to buy products or a chat. There is no "store" where the products are sold but drive into the colony yard and ask someone for what a person is looking for, and they will be guided in the right direction. Although the colony is a society in itself, all colony members embrace good neighbourship and like connecting with the surrounding community. Colony members can always be found at the Smoky Lake Farmers' Market on Saturday mornings during the summer, offering their fresh produce and homemade products.

2022 final budgets & tax bylaw approved

Town of Redwater Council has approved budget amendments for the Final Budget that addresses long term and current challenges while providing valuable services for residents. Further, the Tax Bylaw was approved and tax notices will be prepared and mailed.

The Town of Redwater Administration presented the 2022 Operating and Capital Budget amendments at the Council meeting on May 3, 2022. Council approved the amendments and approved the resulting Tax Bylaw which was prepared by Administration.

The amendments included some additional projects on both the Capital and Operating sides (funded by reserves) and further utilized a tax mitigation strategy utilizing some of the 2021 surplus which was allocated for future tax mitigation. This resulted in a change

in budgeted municipal tax increase, bringing the change down from 4.5% to 3%.

For the average Redwater home (assessed at \$197,500), 2022 taxes will be \$1,962 annually or \$164 monthly. The budget increase equates to \$47 annually or \$4 monthly. This increase not only allows the Town to have sufficient operating revenue to pay for existing town services and asset maintenance, but

it also allows Redwater to plan for growth and improvements that will benefit Redwater residents and businesses.

Mayor McRae acknowledges the difficulties experienced developing this year's budget and points out its successes, stating:

Budgeting this year was extremely difficult in part due to two years of o% Covid increases and current inflation rates expected to exceed 5%. Council reduced

an initial 4.5% budget by using reserve funds strategically to meet our operational and capital needs and to reduce the impact on taxpayers. Budgeting increases at a rate less than inflation is not sustainable but was attainable this year. Overall, a 3% increase over 3 years wasn't overwhelming for residents and manageable for administration.

The 2022 Operating and Capital Budget includes protecting residents, providing safe transportation through good road and sidewalk maintenance, and promoting health and wellness through Pembina Place and other recreational amenities. Removing snow, cutting grass, and maintaining green spaces adds to community beauty. Other initiatives will support and grow the community economics.

Now that the 2022 Tax Rate Bylaw has been approved, Administration will work on preparing the combined tax notices & assessment, which are currently planned to be sent out in the third week of May.
