The Alberta government tabled new legislation on April 21 to increase unpaid job leave for military Reservists and people who suffer the loss of a child from miscarriage or stillbirth.

Premier Jason Ken-

ney and other dignitaries delivered the announcement at the Prince of Wales Armouries in Edmonton. Bill

17, the Labour Statutes Amendment Act, eliminates the current 20day cap on the number of unpaid days military Reservists can attend training. The bill also includes parents who have a miscarriage or stillbirth, so they are eligible for three unpaid days of bereavement leave from work.

"We must honour and support those who uniformly serve our country," said Kenney. "The introduction of this legislation will provide stronger protection for parents who have lost an unborn child due to stillbirth or miscarriage, and longer job protection for Reservists who

have more extended training or military service periods."

The current bereavement leave enables employees - who worked at least 90 days for the same employer - to take up to three days of unpaid leave per year when a family member dies without worrying about losing their job.

The current military Reservist leave enables employees - who worked at least 12 consecutive weeks for the same employer - to take up to 20 days in unpaid leave to participate in annual training and Canadian Armed Forces operations.

According to Labour Minister Kaycee Madu, this 20-day cap means Reservists sometimes use their vacation days to complete their military training. "Reservists perform valuable services for our province and country," said Madu. "We want to honour their commitment and sacrifice by allowing them enough time to train for the many challenges they face."

Carolyn Patton is the Alberta Chair for the Canadian Forces Liaison Council (CFLC), a national organization that works with the Department of National Defence. She spoke at the news conference about the CFLC and how Bill 17 will impact Reservists.

Patton noted the CFLC comprises business leaders and Reserve

military members who act as a bridge between employers to highlight the value of employing Reservists.

"Reservists are employees, co-workers, students, and neighbours," said Patton. "They bring valuable skills to their civilian workplaces, such as leadership, commitment, strong communications, teamwork and hard work."

Patton described Bill 17 as welcome news for Alberta Reservists. "Removing the 20-day limit provides Reservists greater flexibility to pursue civilian career paths without giving up on their mission of serving their country," she said.

"When we as a society take steps to support our Reservists, we help ensure the dedicated men and women of our military can support us. This bill will provide an opportunity to further their military training and develop transferable skills that enhance the workplace."

Captain (Ret'd) Rick Dumas also spoke about what Bill 17 means to Reservists. The former soldier joined the Reserves in 1977 and served 42 years in the military, most of it with Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

"The vast array of employers can do more to support the Reservists," "There said Dumas. is payback for the

employer by character building and enhancing unique skill sets unavailable elsewhere."

Dumas noted that a trained private soldier can provide leadership within a civilian environment, with an emphasis on teamwork. "Employers give up a soldier for whatever time it takes, getting a better trained and fulfilled employee in return," he said. "Supporting those that serve us makes the civilian employer an actual force multiplier and a community asset."

The changes to leave for bereavement and Reservists in the new labour law will be implemented when Bill 17 receives royal assent.

I like to make my cupcakes with light filling, not heavy, and I think that appeals people", Tara to

explains. Cupcakes are their leading seller, cake pops are just in their early stages, and she makes cakes for birthdays and other occasions. Tara also makes pretzel rods and cupcake bouquets. 

# **Community agencies bundle forces in Smoky Lake**



Community agencies are engaging in increased collaboration in Smoky Lake to serve the community better.

Small towns typically have several community groups delivering services. Sometimes community groups aren't entirely knowledgeable about each other's mandate, resulting in gaps or overlaps in service delivery. Rachelle Amyotte, who recently became the Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) coordinator in Smoky Lake, took it upon her to get community groups together and discuss partnerships in Smoky Lake for enhanced service delivery. On April 27, several groups got together. The overall goal was threefold; The first goal is to increase awareness of agency priorities and mandates.

The second goal is to support the proactive planning of initiatives and programs. The third goal is to raise awareness of community needs or themes identified. There is a tremendous advantage for community groups to work together; one of them has already been mentioned: cooperation to avoid gaps and overlaps in service delivery. Another, perhaps even more significant advantage is that they can identify programs where they can work together and apply for more substantial funding. Groups that collaborate can identify bigger goals to serve the community better. Thus, they will be more strategic in effecting a community impact. Participants in

this initial meeting already brought up some great ideas to move this agenda forward. The next significant event will be seniors' week in the first week of June. The idea is to have speakers address specific addictions and mental health issues. Evelynne Kobes serves on the Smoky Lake Seniors' Centre board and points out the "Strawberry Tea" event at the seniors' centre during seniors week on June 8. The community awareness day, which typically takes place in the fall, can be used to draw attention to the initiatives developed so far and possibly lead to new activities. Rochelle brings up the youth council in Smoky Lake: "FCSS is there to enhance the activities for youth. The group from 12-18 more or less falls between the cracks at the moment as there is not much organized for them in town. I would like to see that changed. We

are actively seeking to start a youth council with the ultimate goal to have a youth centre here to have a go-to place for this group." The group agrees that they would like to see Smoky Lake become an actively welcoming community with many activities and programs for newcomers and immigrants. Program coordination will lead to bundling forces, enabling more programs to benefit the community. For example, the first Ukrainian refugees are expected in Smoky Lake shortly, and Smoky Lake Community Learning Council can support them with English Language Learning. The library can offer programs for the children, and Primary Care Network can help with healthcare, both physical and mental health. Upon finalizing the meeting, the group decides to stay in touch through a shared calendar on which they will plan significant events.



tribulations of this war in Ukraine, they wanted to do something. They didn't know how to take that step."

The lodge and Homeland Housing staff had a meeting and decided to reach out to the community. "We were so grateful to find out that there were people in the community that were ready and willing and wanting to help," said Danake.

# **Resort in the** making is a tourism **boost for Smoky** Lake County

With the weather warming up, many Canadians are getting their RVs ready to hit the road and enjoy the great outdoors. Whereas Banff and Jasper are trendy and busy areas, there is another location to consider The campground is open right in the heart of Smoky Lake County: Northern Lights RV resort near Hamlin. This new resort surrounded by jackpine forests is in the making of becoming a major tourist attraction and a novelty for Canada. Owner and manager Richard Kimmitt talks about his resort:" I bought the land in July 2021 to build a resort here. We have a quarter section of beautiful land here where we are developing back-in and drive-through sites which will have power and water. The resort is designed to accommodate larger RVs. What is unique is a 'members-only' section with an indoor activity centre, swimming pool, hot tubs, an observation deck, paved hiking trails, a licensed adult centre and chalets. We are also developing an off-leash dog area." The resort is set up in areas for different interests. There is one area for those who would like to do karaoke and singing. That is a less quiet area, but the rule that quiet time starts at 11:00 pm applies to the entire campground. Families with children have an area of their own, so children do not need to cross the whole campground to connect and play together. There is an area for those who want to enjoy more peace and quiet. The fourth area is a blend of the other three. Additionally, the campground design

contains a day-use area. That area is for everyone, whereas the membership area can be accessed by members only. One can buy a membership for 35 years, which guarantees a site, but that may not always be the same site. year-round, but those who want to avoid the cold weather and store their RV for the winter can keep it on the campground. Much work needs to be done yet, but around 40 campsites have been developed, roads have been built, and the work is ongoing every day. With the campground being in the initial stages of its development, the membership rate for 35 years is accordingly; as more facilities are finalized, that fee will increase, so purchasing early can be an investment for the future. Members are subject to and agree with regulations to keep the campground enjoyable. For Richard Kimmitt, this is not the first time: he started a similar campground near Rocky Mountain House many years ago. He was the manager there for a long time, and he is taking those experiences and implementing new ideas into this resort, which is the second of its kind in Canada. A massive project like this brings employment opportunities to the region, currently during the construction and after completion. It stands to reason that it is also an enormous boost for tourism in the area from which surrounding communities will benefit. 
