Premier Jason Kenney resigns



On Wednesday evening, Premier Jason Kenney resigned as leader following a split vote from the United Conservative Party membership on whether he should remain leading. Though he won the vote by 51.4 percent, Premier Kenney felt it wasn't enough to continue as the UCP leader but still retains the spot for now.

Leadership change is coming to the UCP, and multiple names are already in the ring

Premier Jason Kenney shocked much of the province on Wednesday night when he announced he would step down as the leader of the United Conservative Party (UCP). After months of infighting within the cabinet and party, a leadership review was called to allow UCP members to decide if Premier Kenney should remain.

UCP President Cynthia Moore began a livestream shortly after 6 pm and spoke of the process, which was hotly contested leading up. Criticism grew of the process after there was a surge in new party memberships and a last-minute change from in-person voting to mail-in voting. Moore said that the rise in party memberships was due to them being "open and transparent" and responding to all member and media queries.

"As a result, record numbers of our members have participated in this leadership review. More than any other party in Canada. The engagement of our members has been extraordinary. Thank you to everyone who participated. It's through your commitment that we have such a strong process." Moore said tens of thousands of Albertans signed up to take part. "Our UCP

membership more than doubled. The mail-in ballot allowed every eligible member to choose to have their say," she said.

Moore added that "we need to focus on being the United Conservative Party" no matter the result. Tomorrow is the start of the 2023 election campaign. We have a lot of work to do, and we need to do that together as a team." She then handed the mic over to chief returning officer Rick Orman who presented the results. The question on the ballot was, "do you approve of the current leader?" Orman said that there were 34,298 votes cast and that 17,638 said yes and 16,660 said no. "These numbers represent 51.4 percent yes and 48.6 percent no," he said.

Moore then reappeared and said that since the leader received more than 50 percent of the vote in support of his leadership, a leadership election would not be automatically triggered. The livestream then switched to a Calgary location where Premier Jason Kenney spoke. "Friends, tonight, the members of our party completed a democratic exercise in accountability. The result is not what I hoped for or,

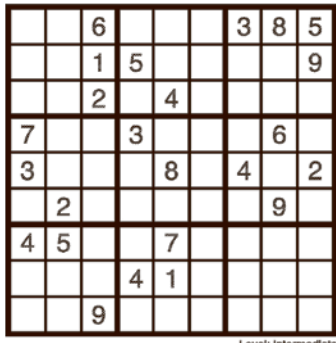

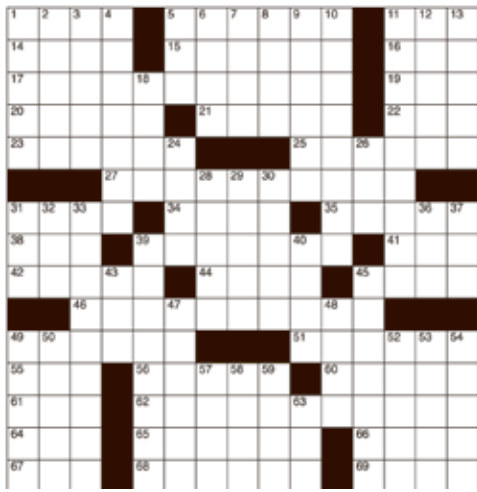

ANNUAL VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

Every year, CN is required to clear its right-of-way of any vegetation that may pose a safety hazard. Vegetation on railway right-of-way, if left uncontrolled, can contribute to trackside fires and impair proper inspection of track infrastructure.

For safe railway operations, CN will conduct its annual vegetation control program on its rail lines in the province of Alberta.

A certified professional will be applying herbicides on and around the railway tracks (primarily along the 16 – 24 feet graveled area/ ballast). All product requirements for setbacks in the vicinity of dwellings, aquatic environments, and municipal water supplies will be met.

**TRAPPING INCENTIVE PROGRAM
Pocket Gophers**

The Pocket Gopher (sometimes referred to as a mole) is a burrowing rodent, named because of the fur-lined pouches they have on each cheek. Rarely seen above ground, **loose soil mounds are characteristic evidence of their presence.** Pocket gophers will infest hayfields and uncultivated grass areas, causing some degree of forage loss while the dirt mounds create costly problems for agricultural producers during haying and forage harvesting activities.

Because of this problem, **a trapping incentive of \$2 per tail is available to Thorhild County residents** that register as a trapper.

Thorhild County residents may submit tails collected (dried or frozen) to the Agricultural Services Department to apply for the \$2 per tail trapping incentive. Residents presenting pocket gopher tails must provide the legal land location(s) as confirmation that the pocket gophers were trapped from lands within Thorhild County boundaries.

Payment incentive will be based on the verified number of Pocket Gopher tails counted. This incentive applies only to Pocket Gopher tails, **NOT** Richardson Ground Squirrels. The discretion of the Agricultural Fieldman, or designate, on the determination of the species of tails collected will be final. Tails not stored so they are recognizable and in manageable condition, will be refused.

**TRAPPING INCENTIVE PROGRAM
Beaver Tails**

The Beaver creates a costly problem when it comes to our waterways and creek crossings.

In order for beavers to create a habitat, beavers build a dam in a stream, flooding an area of the woods and creating a pond in which the beaver can build a lodge. This beaver lodge or den is located away from shore and has an underwater entrance. This makes it difficult for most predators to enter the lodge. In winter, the water around the lodge usually freezes, protecting the beaver almost completely. Some beavers live by rivers and do not need to build dams. Instead, they live in burrows that they build on the river bank. This is what causes problems in the Agriculture industry as it causes flooding to lands and it also changes the flow of water causing water to build up in places where water normally does not sit.

Because of this problem, **a trapping incentive of \$20 per tail to a max of 30 per landowner per year is available to Thorhild County residents** that register with us as trappers.

Thorhild County residents may submit tails collected (dried or frozen) to the Agricultural Services Department to apply for the \$20 per tail trapping incentive. Residents presenting beaver tails must provide the legal land location(s) as confirmation that the beavers were trapped from lands within Thorhild County boundaries. Payment of the incentive will be based on the verified number of beaver tails counted.

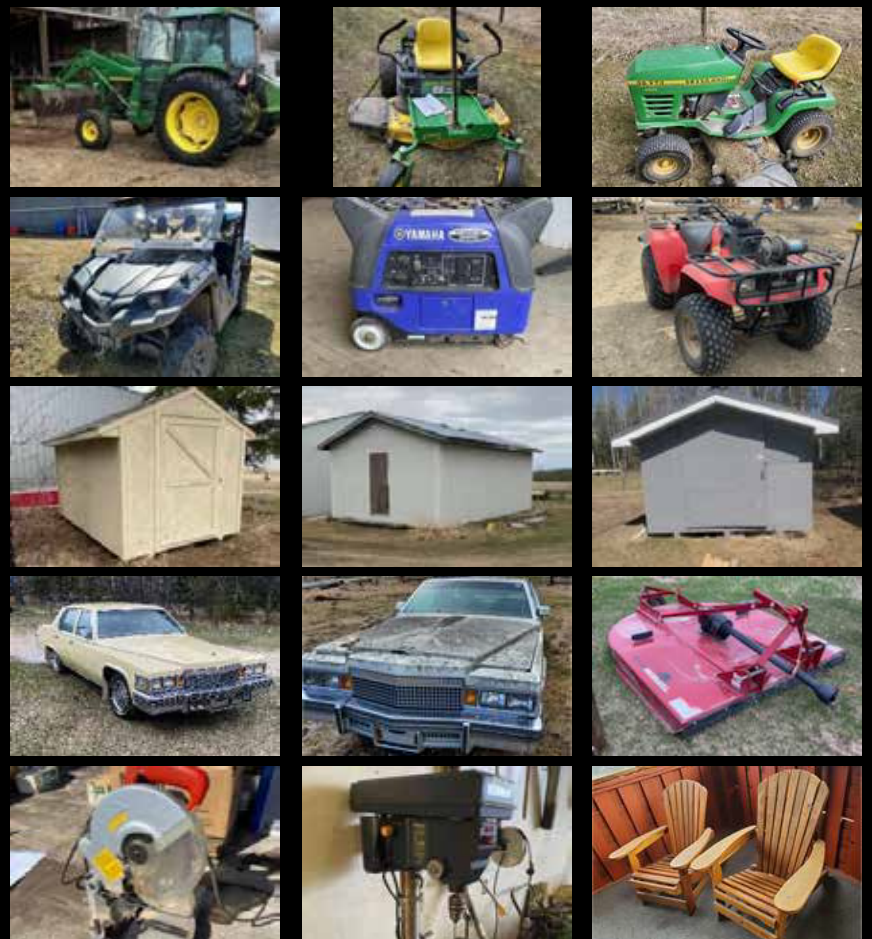

Impossible choices: 1 in 8 Canadians struggle to access the food they need

(NC) Although many of us are excited to go back to indoor dining and welcome family and friends back into our homes, millions of Canadians struggle to access the nutritious food they need due to a lack of money, which has led to an on-going epidemic of food insecurity.

One charity working on the problem is the Maple Leaf Centre for Action on Food Security, which is committed to working collaboratively across sectors to reduce food insecurity in Canada by 50 per cent by 2030. Sarah Stern, leader of the centre, provides these eye-opening statistics on food insecurity across the country:

Daily impossible choices.

"Food insecurity is a reality for one in eight households in the country, and it forces hard-working people to compromise the quality and quantity of the food they buy for their family so they can pay fixed expenses like rent and heat," explains Stern.

These difficult choices include whether to pay for rent or feed their children, or whether to buy winter boots for their growing child or feed them breakfast before school.

Food charities won't solve food insecurity.

"Hunger in Canada will not be solved through food charity; it requires concerted action from all levels of government," says Stern. "For too

Rural crime watch group is instrumental in crime prevention in Smoky Lake County

The Smoky Lake County Rural Crime Watch Association AGM on May 16 highlighted the importance of keeping your property safe. The president, Penny Tychkovsky, referred in her annual report to the newly developed webpage, www.smokylakeruralcrimewatch.ca. With the majority of meetings and communication being online during COVID, it made sense to create a website that provides valuable tips on improving and maintaining home safety. A home safety checklist ensures nothing is missed. "We are looking for new directions

and enhancing our visibility in the communities," Penny said. "Visibility and awareness will remind people that we are here to help and that crime is a real thing in the area." The RCMP and Fish and Wildlife officers work closely together, and if someone calls in distress, whoever is closest will respond. Over the past years, incidents had occurred where homeowners had tried to protect their property themselves when there was a break-in, sometimes using their firearms. The RCMP strongly points out that this is not a good idea: call 911. The risk of getting injured, injuring someone else or being

sued when homeowners step up in case of a crime on their property is not worth taking. Crime prevention is enhanced through the Citizens on Patrol (COP) teams. COP has been very active in the area (Waskatenau, Vilna, Bellis); they are the eyes and ears for law enforcement. Any patrol works with two people per vehicle and must do six patrols per year. They watch what happens in the area and report suspicious activity. As people usually know their neighbours and their vehicles, COP is a highly efficient instrument as any unusual activity or unknown vehicle will immediately draw

attention. Smoky Lake Rural Crime Watch Association is a member of the Alberta Provincial Rural Crime Watch Association (APRCWA). Trevor Tychkovsky of

the APRCWA informs the public about crime prevention. "Research has been done on why your house or car has been broken into and not the neighbours'.

Throughout the county, we will do an assessment at your request on the security of your property. That does not necessarily mean you'll have to spend much money to improve security; it may be a simple light in a certain spot. We will give you clues on what you can improve on. We do not advise on a certain brand of instruments, just the type you can use to enhance security". A critical part of any AGM is the election of board members. All sitting board members let their names stand and were re-elected for another year of assisting in crime prevention in Smoky Lake County. long, food banks have borne responsibility for responding with emergency food relief, but this is not a sustainable solution."

No one in Canada should have to rely on charity relief to ensure adequate nutrition for themselves and their loved ones. While charitable giving of food or monetary donations is important and supports those in need, Stern

believes it should not be viewed as a long-term solution to food insecurity. To make a lasting impact, the priority should be to change the systems that perpetuate food insecurity.

Canadians helping Canadians.

As Canadians, we pride ourselves on strong community values and having an equitable society where everyone can thrive.

"Food insecurity has become even more

prevalent since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, but this can change," says Stern. "Social change happens because people get behind it. We make noise. We band together. We commit and contribute. We have the means and the public will. Let's act now. Because at its heart this is a social justice issue, not a food issue or a matter of charity."

frankly, what I expected. But I've been clear from day one that I will respect the members' decision in this leadership review, and I expect all members of our party to do just that."

Kenney said that while 51 percent passed the constitutional threshold of a majority, it wasn't adequate support to continue as leader. "That is why tonight, I have informed the President of the party of my intention to step down as leader of the United Conservative Party. I'm sorry, but, friends, I truly believe we need to move forward united. We need to put the past behind us, and a large number of our members have asked for an opportunity to clear the air through a leadership election. I've recommended that the provincial board schedule a leadership review in

a timely fashion. It is my fervent hope that in the months to come, we all move on past the division of COVID and disappointing as this result is for me, I'm incredibly proud of the work that this team has done."

Premier Kenney then highlighted some of the work. "Together, we reunited the free enterprise movement in Alberta politics, and we won the largest electoral mandate in our province's history. We inherited profound fiscal and economic challenges, and then we went through three once-in-a-century crises; the largest public health crisis in a century, the largest collapse of the world economy in nearly a century, and the first time ever we experienced negative oil prices. And yet, despite all of that, we got the job done, delivering on nearly 90 percent of our election

commitments." He spoke about leading Canada in economic job growth, balancing the budget for the first time in fourteen years, and putting parents back in charge of education through the Choice in Education Act.

He asked the crowd if they had heard about the victory won against Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's No More Pipelines law during the week prior. He also said he had been in Washington fighting for Alberta energy jobs the day before. "While we have our internal differences, we must remember the shared values that unite us as conservatives. And we must always remember the promise of Alberta. This great land of opportunity where dreams come true, and anyone can achieve their God-given potential. God bless you all, and God bless the province of Alberta."

One of Premier Kenney's loudest critics responded very quickly following the announcement. Brian Jean said he intends to put his name forward in the leadership race. In a Facebook post, Jean said he would run on a series of ideas and approaches that would "renew" the UCP. His campaign would "demonstrate how we can do things differently, together, to recapture the enthusiastic support of the over one million Albertans who elected us in 2019."

Opposition leader Rachel Notley also took to social media and thanked Kenney for his public service. "There are obviously many things about which we don't agree, but that doesn't negate the time and sacrifice that goes into taking on the role of Premier." On Thursday, May 19, one day after the Premier's announcement, Notley began the 2023 push by

introducing NDP candidates in next year's provincial election. One of the twenty-one individuals on her list was Oneil Carlier for Lac Ste Anne-Parkland.

Another name that popped up within twenty-four hours was Danielle Smith, the past Wildrose Party leader who infamously crossed the floor from the Wildrose Party to the Progressive Conservative Party and eight fellow members in 2014. Since 2015, Smith has worked extensively in media and business, including the President of the Alberta Enterprise Group.

Since handling COVID restrictions was one of the most significant areas of contention in the UCP, leading to the leadership review, Smith spoke out on her thoughts on what should happen going forward. "We never should have come down on pastors the

way we did. Every other jurisdiction, it seems we're able to enforce their measures without putting pastors in jail, and this created so much division in our communities," she said in a Rebel News interview with Adam Soos. "We should also drop charges against small businesses," she added. Smith is running for the UCP nomination in Livingstone-Macleod and the leadership race.

Thursday evening, UCP caucus chair Nathan Neudorf released a statement following a six-hour caucus meeting to discuss the party's future and decide on an interim leader. "We have affirmed Premier Jason Kenney's continued leadership of our caucus and government until such a time as a new leader is chosen." A date for a leadership election has not been set as of this writing.


