Raelynn, a 1st-year junior club member, won Grand Champion with her heifer and Reserved Champion with her steer, Jube Jube. Jube Jube came in at 1280lbs and had the highest rate of gain at 3.06/day. Jube Jube was sold to Dr. Joannes Botha. Thank you to Dr. Botha for purchasing a steer and two market swines at the show. She also placed 1st in both Junior Showmanship and Grooming.

Shelby Dowhan won Grand Champion for her 2-year-old Cow/Calf pair. While in Juniors steers, second places were awarded to Daniel

Quaghebeur in Showmanship and Harper MacMillian with Grooming. In Intermediates, Carter Stevens won 1st in Showmanship, and Gavin Ollikka placed 1st in Grooming. Gus Shwetz placed second in both Showmanship and Grooming.

In Market Swine, Grand Champion went to Gavin Ollikka with his hog, Matilda, weighing in at 209lbs. purchased by Serben Farms for \$525.00. Huge thank you to Jered Serben. Gavin also won 1st in Showmanship. Reserve Champion went to Mackenzie Steven with her hog, Bacon, which weighed 231lbs and purchased by Dr. Botha. Carter Ollikka won 2nd in Showmanship.

The Smoky Lake solar panels almost a year after installation



Snow coverage on solar panels only reduces their effectiveness by three percent, as a NAIT study shows.

It has been close to a year since the installation of solar panels in Smoky Lake was completed. How do they work, and what is their benefit? Solar panels contain PV cells (photo voltaic cells, an energy harvesting technology that converts solar energy into useful electricity). These cells absorb energy from the sunlight. This energy creates electrical charges and produces electricity. This would suggest that solar panels only work when the sun shines. In 2018, NAIT published a study into the effectiveness of solar panels when they are covered with snow, a common situation in this part of the world that raised some questions among Smoky Lake residents in the past winter. It was an extensive study in cooperation with the city of Edmonton, the Solar Energy Society of Alberta and Howell-Mayhew Engineering. Twelve solar modules situated atop the Shaw Theatre on NAIT's main campus were studied. Data was collected every day every five minutes for five years, an extensive study in which the panels would have faced a

large variety of weather. Until then, the industry had estimated that the energy loss due to cloudy weather (or panel coverage such as snow) would be close to 20 percent.

However, the study's results showed that the energy loss is only three percent. In addition, researchers found that the angle at which solar panels are installed has a far more significant impact on energy production than the weather. The panels in Smoky Lake are located next to the arena, a location free of shade and across the road from the future (new) H.A. Kostash school. The place is perfect for catching as much sunshine as possible. It is also an eye-catching project for those debating moving to the community and touring around. The town decided to purchase the panels to reduce costs over the long term. The project "demonstrates a commitment to renewable energy to attract environmentally conscious business growth," per the words of the then-mayor Hank Halowaychuk. The town did not pay for the total amount of the installation and infrastructure (a total of \$366,598.69):

it acquired a grant from the Alberta Municipal Solar Program (AMSP) in the amount of \$143,616, which reduced the cost for the town to \$352,232.69.

The installation purpose has been to minimize town infrastructure power costs, such as the Smoky Lake Museum, Seniors, Drop-In centre, CN Station Museum, Town of Smoky Lake Public Works Maintenance Shop/Fire Hall and the Town Office. The project was expected to save the Town of Smoky Lake close to \$16,000 per year, and as per information acquired from the town, the project delivers the anticipated cost savings though the numbers vary per month. Is solar energy the future? Opinions vary: though installation is costly, there is undoubtedly a cost-saving, and some countries (for example, the Netherlands) have widely embraced solar power for municipal and residential use and are offering subsidies for the installation. In Canada, the Canada Greener Homes Grant offers up to \$5,000 off the total solar system cost. With the cost of energy rising, it may be something to consider.

and can be reached at 306-498-4407.

Jeanne added they refer to Raphi as the trainee son and the host as mom and dad. "It should have something better than saying trainee son," she laughed. "It sounds like he's training to be our son."

The Frederiksen's first got involved with IRE Canada when Steen was a 19-year-old student in Denmark who participated as a trainee in a similar international rural exchange program.

"Then he went home to Denmark, and they wrote him and said, 'Will you come and manage the farm? So, he returned to Canada to become a permanent resident,'" said Jeanne. She noted since they were finally working on their farm, they've hosted numerous trainees from other countries.

"We've had them from Sweden, Denmark, France, Norway, a couple from Switzerland, one from New Zealand," said Jeanne. She added IRE Canada has since expanded to include trainees from Japan, the United States, and

South Africa.

The rural exchange program enables all participants to share best practices at work and enjoy learning a new culture at home. Raphi is a bricklayer in Switzerland but decided to try something new. He arrived in Redwater in March, excited to begin a six-month adventure working at Dane's Pride Dairy Farm.

"It's different from here to Switzerland and to work here," said Raphi. "In Switzerland, we have more intensive field works. We have smaller farms, and here it's a lot bigger. But it's cool, with many new experiences and a lot to learn."

For example, he noticed about 140 cows at Dane's Pride Dairy Farm, compared to a typical Swiss dairy farm with between 20 to 40 cows.

Although Raphi is comfortable with English, he's still getting used to Canadian geography. "It's so big here, and we are a small country in Switzerland," he said. "We have a one-and-a-half-hour drive to another country on every side. Here I drove to Drumheller Valley,

and it was a three-and-a-half-hour drive. And most of the people here say that's nothing."

Raphi also visited Jasper, Banff and other locations in the Canadian Rockies.

"It looks like kind of the same," he said about the Swiss Alps, comparing the mountain snow and lakes. "I saw a lot of animals, like coyotes and a black bear. I first saw a black bear in Jasper, but I'm waiting for a moose; I hope I can see a moose once."

He's enjoying his rural living experiences while training at Dane's Pride Dairy Farm, where Jeanne and his family invite other farm families to consider getting involved with IRE Canada.

"If you're interested in being a host family, you have to be willing to let them into your home and family and kitchen table. As well as your workplace," said Jeanne.

"When you do this, your trainee son or daughter will generally work their way into your hearts on their own. You'll build good relationships that will last across miles and cultures for years."

The bank Southern Cross tunes in with the audience

Not too long ago, the band Southern Cross treated an audience at the Smoky Lake Inn to an evening of outstanding musical entertainment. Southern Cross is a relatively new band with members so well in tune that they sound like they have been playing together for years. In 2020, Perry Phillips and Kyler Schogen started Southern Cross along with two musicians from Edmonton; the original band went through some changes until it resulted in its current version in January 2022 with Perry Phillips (vocals/guitar/harmonicas) from Vilna, Kyler Schogen (guitar and vocals) from Bellis, Randy Padlesky (drums and vocals) and Jeff Katerynych (bass guitar and vocals), both from Bonnyville. All band members are professional musicians and bring many years of collective experience. Schogen and Phillips came up with the band name based on their appreciation for southern rock and how it has generally influenced music, especially country music. There's also a connection for both with the Southern Cross constellation, which is only visible in the southern hemisphere, where they both spent time. "It's hard to explain where exactly the name 'Southern Cross' came from, but it is based on that connection with the southern

rock, blues and rhythm & blues and country music, primarily from the south-eastern United States," Perry explains. "It's a style that remains very popular and has had a huge impact on country music. We tend to play music with strong rhythms, driving beats and a prominent guitar sound that makes people want to dance. We know that people appreciate good music, even if every song is not well known. The band has an extensive music roster, ranging from country classics to alternative country, along with rock/blues. Our extensive song list allows us to customize it to our audience, venue and occasion," Kyler mentions. "We have diverse backgrounds in music and an appreciation for a broad range of styles, and if there's a category we want to fit into, it is good music played well. People's appreciation for music

seems to be becoming much broader, and while country music is the foundation for Southern Cross, we want to have something for all our audiences. The band will be working on incorporating original songs into the mix in the months ahead. It's not easy to bring a new band into the business, and it takes focus and commitment to move forward to make it happen continuously." "But the best promotion is always word-of-mouth," Perry points out. Making connections and following up is critical to the band becoming known. All band members share a love for music and a passion for playing it for people. "People appreciate our

commitment to having a good sound, our selection of songs, our vocal harmonies and especially that we have a good time playing music," Perry adds. The crowd at the Smoky Lake Inn certainly appreciated Southern Cross's music. The Inn filled up entirely, and the band managed to play at a volume that allowed people to visit while enjoying the great music. Band members watch for body language that lets them know how people feel. This again speaks to the band members' love for what they do. "Playing good music and connecting with people provides a positive experience for the band and the audience - we got our energy from them," adds Phillips. "I was being a grumpy kid one day and decided to sign up for this, and I regretted it later," she laughed. "But you know what, I'll do it anyway and get to know more people."

Morgan had a message for other youth thinking about participating in Lemonade Day. "Go sign up now, try it. Because if you don't try something, you'll miss out on the fun."

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
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
