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# Lions fundraiser dog walk raises \$1,820. for guide dog

The Lions Foundation of Canada organizes fundraiser dog walks to purchase and train guide dogs every year. Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is a national charity created by the Lions of Canada. Its mission is to empower Canadians with disabilities to navigate their world with confidence and independence by providing a Dog Guide at no cost and supporting them in their journey together. In addition to training Dog Guides for blind or visually impaired people, Dog Guides are also trained to meet the needs of Canadians with hearing, medical and physical disabilities, epilepsy, autism, diabetes, and professional agencies assisting people in traumatic situations. Lions Foundation does not receive any government funding and relies on the support of fundraising events like the Pet Valu Walk for Dog Guides. Purchasing and training these dogs is

costly, as each dog costs approximately \$35,000 to raise, train and place, so a fundraiser is a great way to help people with disabilities. The event's title sponsor is Pet Value, Lions Clubs across Canada organize the

dog walks locally, and one of the walks was held in Smoky Lake on May 29. The number of participants was limited, with three dogs and five walkers to take on the 5-kilometre walk, but with some scattered

clouds, sun and a little wind, it was a perfect day for a walk that everyone seemed to enjoy. The walk took participants along the Iron Horse Trail, around the hospital and back through the residential area by

the Bar-V-Nook lodge. Water for the dogs was provided on the trail, and for the human participants, there was water and ice cream at the finish. Pledges were written for walkers with or without dogs, which

resulted in a \$1,820 raised. This entire amount of money goes to Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides. The Smoky Lake Lions Club organizes the Dog walk every year around the end of May.

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

### Redwater RCMP conduct joint forces operation with provincial partners

On May 30, 2022, Redwater RCMP Detachment and Provincial Traffic along with Peace Officers from Sturgeon County and Thorhild County as well as Alberta Sheriffs from Lac La Biche and Ardrossan, conducted a Joint Forces Operation on Highway 63 and Highway 28. The

day long event focused on traffic safety initiatives such as impaired driving. Activities included roving and stationary patrols as well as a check stop.

In total 17 officers participated issuing 63 provincial violation tickets. 280 Mandatory Alcohol Screening test were administered. Police are pleased to report that no impaired drivers were detected during this initiative.

"With ever increasing traffic volumes, Highways 63 and 28 has seen their fair share of serious and fatal collisions," says Sergeant Jeff Sehn Detachment Commander Redwater RCMP, "small changes in driving behavior including compliance with speed, distracted driving, seat belts and impaired driving can have dramatic effects on the safety of our roadways."

## Limitations on the Number of Recreational Vehicles on Property

SECTION 7.25: LAND USE BYLAW 1272-14 OF SMOKY LAKE COUNTY

As camping season is upon us, please be reminded that Smoky Lake County has a bylaw which limits the number of Recreational Vehicles (RV's) on your property.

#### Multi-Lot County Residential (R1), Residential (Cluster) Conservation (R2), Victoria Residential (R3), and Hamlet General (HG) Districts:

- A maximum of two (2) RV's are allowed on a parcel without a development permit year-round.
- Additional RV's are permitted although, only for a maximum of four (4) consecutive days.
- This section does not apply to the placement of recreational vehicles in the Agriculture District (AG), Victoria Agriculture District (A1), Highway Commercial District (C1), Victoria Commercial District (C2), Industrial District (M1), Rural Industrial District (M2), Institutional & Community District (P), Direct Control District (DC), and Direct Control Landfill District (DC1).



**No recreational vehicle shall be permanently connected to any utility or municipal service, such as power, gas, water supply, or sanitary sewage disposal facilities unless the RV is located in an approved RV Park.**

You may verify the zoning of your property by accessing the Public Web-map <http://munisightes.smokylakecounty.ab.ca>, select "Login as guest" to enter the Web-map Site and turn on the "Zoning" and "Zoning Label" Layers under the Planning & Development tab.

## WEED WISE

Invasive Plants listed as **Noxious** under the *Alberta Weed Control Act* must be controlled (hand pulled, mowed, sprayed, etc). Noxious weeds were introduced from other countries and have no natural predators here. They out-compete native species for food, space, alter or destroy ecosystems, and harm local economies by reducing crop yields and livestock forage production. Invasive species cost Alberta and Canada billions of dollars a year. Landowner's and municipalities must work together to keep these weeds from establishing and spreading.

Smoky Lake County's 'Most Wanted' include Common Tansy, Oxeye Daisy, Field Scabious and Common Burdock.



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

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
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
