

Smoky Lake County is downgrading the existing Fire Restriction to a Fire Advisory effective 9:00 a.m. June 8, 2022. New fire permits will be issued on inspection only during the Fire Advisory.

Off-Highway Vehicles can start wildfires – check frequently to ensure hot spots are free of debris, and make sure mufflers and spark arrestors are working properly. Never leave a campfire unattended. Soak it, stir it and soak it again until cool to the touch to ensure it is extinguished.

The Fire Advisory allows burning barrels with safe burning practices in place and screens covering all barrels in use as per county policy.

LIMITATIONS ON THE NUMBER OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES ON PROPERTY SECTION 7.25: LAND USE BYLAW 1272-14 OF SMOKY LAKE COUNTY

As camping season has arrived, please be reminded that Smoky Lake County has a bylaw which limits the number of Recreational Vehicles (RV's) on your property.

Multi-Lot County Residential (R1), Residential (Cluster) Conservation (R2), Victoria Residential (R3), and Hamlet General (HG) Districts:

- A maximum of two (2) RV's are allowed on a parcel without a development permit year-round.
- Additional RV's are permitted although, only for a maximum of four (4) consecutive days.
- This section does not apply to the placement of recreational vehicles in the Agriculture District (AG), Victoria Agriculture District (A1), Highway Commercial District (C1), Victoria Commercial District (C2), Industrial District (M1), Rural Industrial District (M2), Institutional & Community District (P), Direct Control District (DC), and Direct Control Landfill District (DC1).



No recreational vehicle shall be permanently connected to any utility or municipal service, such as power, gas, water supply, or sanitary sewage disposal facilities unless the RV is located in an approved RV Park.

You may verify the zoning of your property by accessing the Public Web-map *http://munisightes.smokylakecounty.ab.ca*, select "Login as guest" to enter the Web-map Site and turn on the "Zoning" and "Zoning Label" Layers under the Planning & Development tab.





Here's How It Works:



Alpin Sun introduces the proposed Sol Aurora Solar project. The Sol Aurora project is a 200 MW solar development which includes a 100 MW Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) located on approximately 1200 acres of land in Sturgeon County, within Alberta's Industrial Heartland. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2023 and be operational in 2024.

About Sol Aurora

- Construction will employ 275 workers at its peak.
- The facility will generate approximately 386,000 megawatt hours annually
- Annual generation will result in 205,000 tonnes of annual
- Consists of approximately 480,000 bi-facial solar panels
- Produces enough electricity to power approximately 54,000 homes.
- Promotes dual farming such as sheep grazing beneath the solar panels





The embroidery business in Smoky Lake busy soon after the start

Businesses like to present themselves with a logo. They no longer need to go to the city to have their logo embroidered on clothing or hats. Naturally Northbank is a new embroidery business right in Smoky Lake. Emilee Feniak, owner and founder of Naturally Northbank, started the business 6-7 yrs ago out of her home, selling natural deodorants and soaps (hence the name). "People started associating the name with me so that I couldn't get rid of it. I always wanted an embroidery machine, and people told me I should embroider stuff. After the third child, I needed a break; once I finally got my first embroidery machine, I knew it was too big for my living room. I got a space at Pappy's (in the back), then it grew more, and I got my second machine and even started screen printing. Screen printing is where you put ink on clothing permanently. It takes a long time to set the screens up, but it is easy and quick once that's done. That is why with pricing, the more you buy, the cheaper you are. It takes about an hour to set up a logo on the embroidery machine and tell the machine where to put the stitches," Emilee says about her business. She self-taught and learned how to do embroidery through YouTube. "I bought my first embroidery machine used. The lady that

sold it to me was very helpful in training me on how to use it. There is also always an answer on YouTube," she explains. The company in Calgary where she bought her second machine is also very supportive. "I love doing this, my heart is in it, and people's feedback is also very encouraging. I welcome the feedback from people". Lots of local places come to her; wordof-mouth is enormous. Facebook helps find clients. "I haven't had to do big advertising yet; wordof-mouth is sufficient so far," Emilee smiles. She partners with Katelynn and Alyson (MadebyK&A); she sends clients to them if she thinks it is more up their alley and vice versa. Asked how she sees the future of all this, she doesn't know. If someone had asked her this four months ago, she got the odd order and would not have dreamed of being as busy as she is. Now she gets huge orders, primarily because she price matches, and mostly, her prices are lower because she wants items to be affordable for people. She wants to accommodate smaller businesses that do not order many items. Naturally Northbank is open Mondays from 12-4 and Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 9-4. Edworthy credited


the Canadian Park and Recreation Association and the Government of Canada for providing access to grant funding. "That provided our summer student, Everett, a job as Recreation Facilitator, and
