On July 30 and 31st, Smoky Lake set an excellent example of how community groups can work together to make something happen. What a fantastic

weekend it was for the Smoky Lake Stampede. After two years of waiting, the Smoky Lake Riding Club could start planning the Stampede again this spring. Being a small club, partnerships with other clubs

A lot can happen in 55 days.

This means production in all 10 units at the refinery will be at a standstill. Over 2,000 workers in over 30 different skilled trades will work around the clock on the planned preventative maintenance, renovations, inspections and upgrades over the next 55 days.

A turnaround is a necessary part of life at a refinery—it not only ensures safe, reliable operations, it also ensures we continue to meet government regulations. Jeff Trevors, NWR's Turnaround Superintendent explains.

"We're committed to delivering our first full turnaround focused on safety, quality and schedule compliance. We employ a Goal Zero approach and plan to balance the risks of the turnaround by taking care of our team, environment and neighbours. We know these factors are equally important as the products we produce. To that end, we have focused on creating a high-performance safety culture with our internal and external contractors, all of whom strive to conduct their job tasks safely," explains Jeff.

We're creating a safer work environment

with the help of effective leading indicators and key safety metrics. This can help pinpoint trends and patterns, helping our management team make data-driven decisions to protect the workforce and restart the refinery without incident.

What you can expect to see on-site during turnaround

If you're driving by the refinery, you can expect to see more traffic and equipment like cranes around the site. We'll be updating our social media feeds and nwrsturgeonrefinery.com regularly throughout turnaround to keep the community up-to-date on where we're at in our turnaround process.

The NWR Sturgeon Refinery is the world's only refinery designed from the ground up to minimize its environmental footprint through carbon capture and storage while producing the high-value, low-carbon products needed to meet North America's demand for energy. Policy for Municipal Snow Removal Services

Smoky Lake County has amended its **Policy Statement No. 03-35-12: Snow Clearing** which provides guidance for municipal snow removal services in the County. The Policy outlines the guidelines for snow clearing to maintain County roads to be safe and in passable conditions as well as explaining the process for snow removal services on private residential drive-ways.

To obtain snow clearing for the season simply fill out an application and sign "Schedule A" **Hold Harmless Agreement For Use in Connection with Custom Work of Snow Clearing** to purchase a flag with the appropriate annual fee. The application is available at the Public Works County Shop or on our website: www.smokylakecounty.ab.ca.

This will entitle you to receive snow clearing services for the entire winter season.

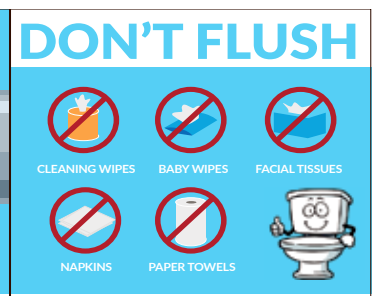
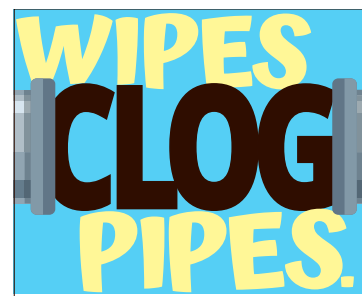

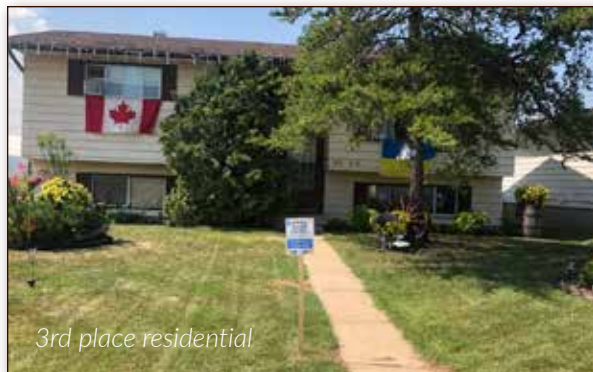

A family camp for Ukrainian refugees in Thorhild



Many Ukrainian refugees enjoyed great food, dancing and storytelling with their loved ones at Koinonia Retreat family camp near Thorhild.

Bonnie Ragan, the owner of Koinonia Retreat (Greek meaning for fellowship), owns a camp with many cabins just a few miles out of Thorhild. Ragan teamed up with the founder and director of Refugee Bridge out of Edmonton, a non-profit Christian organization that sponsors and supports refugee/displaced families worldwide fleeing dire situations. Ragan, from a community mainly Ukrainian, wanted to do her part and help Ukraine Refugees in any way possible. Since Refugee Bridge already had sufficient housing and host families for each Refugee family, Ragan and Refugee Bridge

thought up the idea of a Family Camp where refugees could connect and create fellowship with other displaced families.

This idea created the Family Camp, which ran from July 29th to August 3rd. The event brought many Thorhild community members together. Chris Mudryck shared a large donation from the Ukrainian Catholic Church, which provided a lot of food for all at the camp. Thorhild Co-op gave the group a discount and helped with support for a fundraising barbeque. A local farmer donated beef roasts and hamburger, which allowed local cooks Shirley Vice and Taliah Hyde to create delicious meals for

everyone.

Ragan said, "Ukrainian campers shared what they missed most from their native land and what they looked forward to most in their new home, Canada. All the displaced left their homes because of the Russian invasion and war. In talking to the displaced, we learned that they had left their native land for various reasons. Some left because their homes were bombed. Others left because they wanted to provide safety and stability for their children, and others left because the economy was destroyed. They feared a food shortage would happen in Ukraine this winter. Most left Ukraine, hoping their

displacement would be short-term. However, as the war continues, many are questioning whether they will ever return home again. One thing they all had in common was a longing that the fighting would stop and that Ukraine would regain peace."

Guests shed laughs and tears as they shared their experiences, debriefed, and connected with other families. Many activities, games and story times were provided for children and included a multigenerational soccer match. Local Ukrainian dance instructor Jesse Balan had many guests, locals and refugees engaging in the dance activity. Captivating stories were told

by comedian and storyteller Barry Sawanka who delivered intriguing sounds that wove into his stories and kept young and old interested. Thorhild County Waste Management covered all the costs for the campers to enjoy a fun day of swimming. Thorhild Living Gospel provided a Sunday morning service and an evening sing-along time that showcased musical talent from Thorhild's 99-year-old saxophone player, Steve Kolach, and newly arrived 12-year-old Misho Shulko, a skilled accordion player. A former resident from Thorhild, Pat Senych, brought in and presented resources to refugees that would allow them to learn

English quickly. Hope Mission Staff Luis Argandona, an immigrant from Peru, and Sophia Bihun, an immigrant from Ukraine, came out to share their stories and encourage campers with tips on how to best adapt to Canada and resettle successfully. One grandmother said, "I haven't smiled or laughed for months like I have this week." Tetyana, a fellow camper, stated, "I feel gratitude towards all of you who served us, unconditionally, with love and care."

Ragan said, "Koinonia Retreat, Refugee Bridge and Hope Mission would like to thank the many people that made the meaningful camp experience possible!"

RCMP ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE

Alberta RCMP issue over 2,000 tickets during Heritage Day long weekend

Throughout the Heritage Day long weekend, Alberta RCMP conducted enforcement initiatives focussed on promoting traffic safety. Between July 29 and Aug. 1, the RCMP issued a total of 2,087 traffic tickets across the province.

Overall, 983 individuals were ticketed for speeding, 91 impaired drivers were removed from the roads, 44 were

fined for distracted driving, and an additional 40 were found driving without proper safety belt restraints.

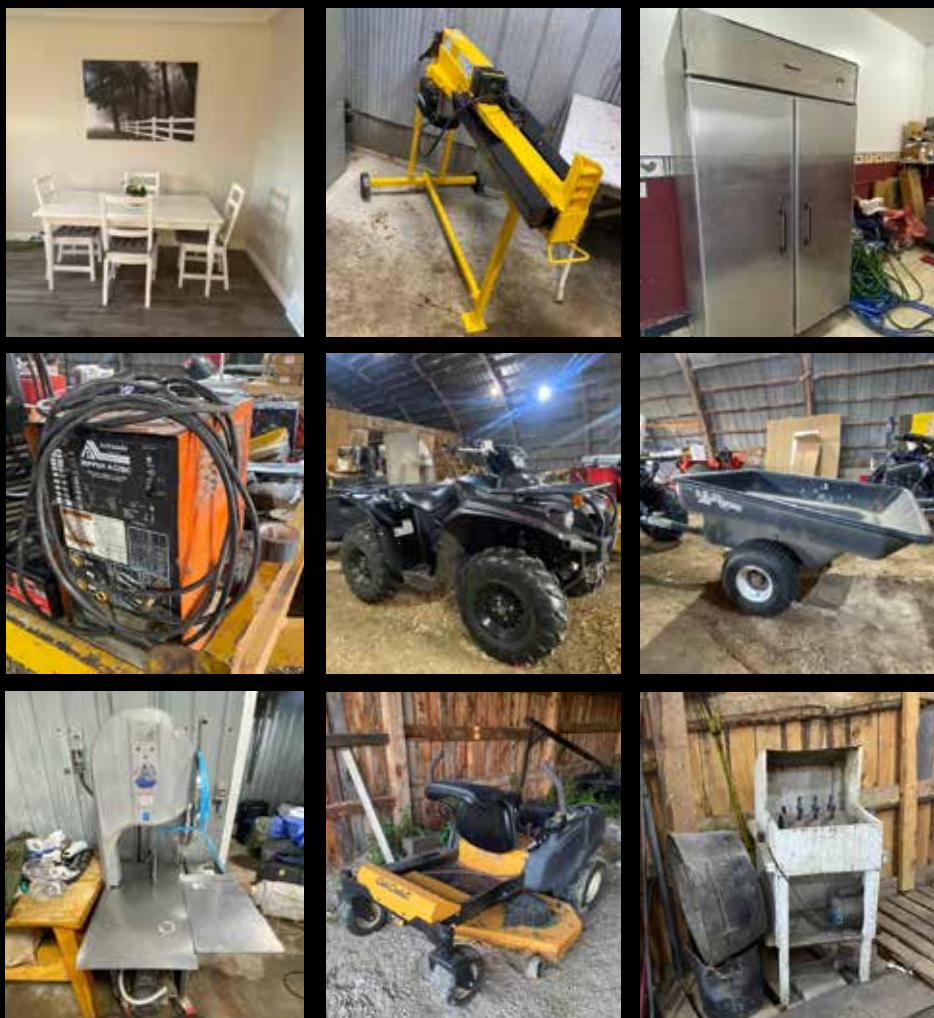

2022 Second Quarter Air Quality Monitoring Results Released

Fort Air Partnership (FAP), the organization that monitors the air local residents breathe, released 2022 second quarter Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) results today. The

Government of Alberta calculates the AQHI using data collected at seven of FAP's air monitoring stations.

Results show that AQHI in the Airshed was of low risk to health at

least 98% of the time for April, May, and June. There were zero hours of high or very high AQHI rating for the calendar quarter. Risk to health increases as the index level rises.

The forecasted and daily Alberta Health Quality Index for the Fort Air Partnership

Airshed can be found at fortair.org. The website also has a live data feed for a variety of

substances that FAP measures, as well as weekly, quarterly and annual AQHI results.

Bylaw 1597/22 Diversified Agriculture & Events

Council to Consider Potential Second Reading of Bylaw 1597/22 (Diversified Agriculture and Events) in September 2022

On June 14, 2022, Sturgeon County Council held a Public Hearing regarding Bylaw 1597/22. This bylaw encompassed the Agribusiness and Agritourism Review Task Force recommendations and proposed the following amendments to the County's Land Use Bylaw:

- Include Diversified Agriculture within the AG-Agriculture District as a permitted use, and also create a new AG2 – Agriculture 2 District that supports more intensive permitted uses. Diversified Agriculture includes value added ag processing, retail sales of ag products, and allows for commercial experiences and events related to farming or farm life. If approved, operators could seek permits for these uses without the need for neighbour advisement and potential appeal.
- The proposed bylaw also allows for event venues to be located within AG parcels, as a discretionary use. This means that operators could apply to have an event venue, and the permit/conditions would be subject to potential appeal by affected parties.

You can access Bylaw 1597/22 at sturgeoncounty.ca/AgriReview.

The County received significant feedback during the Public Hearing, and we want to ensure Council has sufficient time to review and consider that input fully. Therefore, **Council will next be considering the bylaw at the September 13, 2022, Council Meeting.**

Given the extent and nature of the feedback received, there is the potential for further amendments to the proposed bylaw when Council considers second reading. Should there be substantive amendments to the bylaw, Sturgeon County would hold an additional public hearing to allow the public to comment on any proposed changes prior to further consideration.

The agenda for the September 13, 2022, Council Meeting will be published closer to the meeting date, and all materials will be publicly available at sturgeoncounty.ca/CouncilMeetings.

 announcer, and stock contractors were very cordial with Covid clauses if something should happen. We took precautions and followed protocol when it came to Covid. The Stampede is an amateur rodeo co-sanctioned by the Wildrose Association; riders must be members of the association. Only the riders participating in the local barrel racing are not association members. The Stampede is part of the greater heritage days weekend; it is an excellent weekend for the community. Everyone works together really, really well. "And that showed: on Saturday morning, the Smoky Lake Lions Club, with the assistance of the Smoky Lake Fire Department, kicked off with a pancake breakfast from 8:00-11:00. A steady stream of "breakfasters" came in around 8:00, and

the stream intensified towards 10:00 as many wanted to have breakfast and proceed to watch the parade, which started at 11:00. The parade started at the Agricultural Society Complex to make its way through town and end at the Curling Club. The support in the community for Ukraine was evident from the colours of the floats and participants. At 1:00 pm, the rodeo action kicked off at the Stampede grounds, to begin with bareback riding, followed by tie-down roping, saddle bronc riding and steer wrestling. In the blazing sun, with now and then a cool breeze, the events entertained the public that came out in large numbers: the lawn facing the arena was packed, as were the bleachers, and the crowd was treated to a great show. During the lunch break, the public was entertained with old cowboy games;

Hide races, rescue races and entertainment for the children filled the crowd with laughter. The children thoroughly enjoyed the mutton busting, stick horse races and the frisbees. They tried their skills in wild pony riding and were persistent in getting on, even though the ponies were not always cooperative. In the afternoon, the barrel racers showed their skills and some pretty sharp times were set, followed by team roping. A different perspective on animal-related sports was shown in saddle bronc and bull riding, where the contest is who lasts longest: the horse or bull bucking and turning to get the rider off, or the rider going with the motions to stay on for at least eight seconds. All cowboys and cowgirls, horses, ponies, steers, calves and bulls did their best to give away an excellent show to the public. The day was

concluded with the dinner (a fundraiser for the grads) and dance at the Ag Complex. The Sunday kicked off with another breakfast, rodeo slack and then the official rodeo action. Still, despite some longer showers, the public overall remained for the show that was put on with some good genuine Alberta rodeo action, thanks to participants, organizers and not to forget the many volunteers

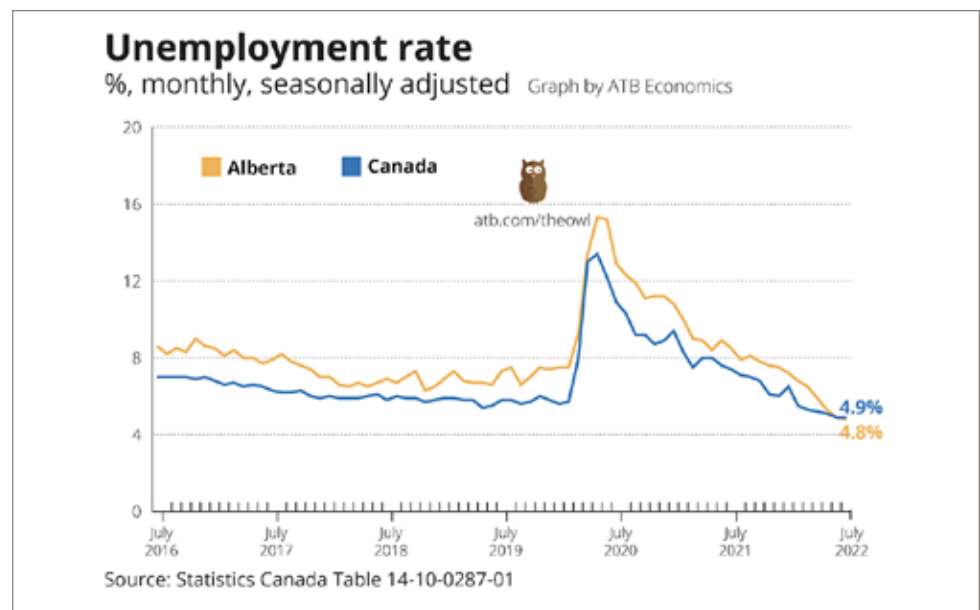
Employment growth stalled in July

Alberta's labour market in July* looked a lot like it did in June. Employment in the province was virtually the same, growing by just 300. An uptick in full-time positions (+15,000) was offset by a drop in part-time employment (-14,700). The provincial unemployment rate improved slightly, going from an already low 4.9% in June

to 4.8% in July. The situation was much the same in Canada as a whole with employment pulling back by 0.2% (-30,600) and the unemployment rate holding steady at 4.9%. Things are, however, significantly better than they were a year ago. Since July 2021, employment in Alberta has increased by 133,500 (+6.0%) and the unemployment rate has shed 3.7 percentage points.

Nationally, year-over-year employment grew by 3.6% and the unemployment rate fell by 2.5 percentage points. Looking ahead, higher interest rates are expected to cool the economy and, in turn, put downward pressure on job growth over the second half of the year. *May Labour Force Survey data reflect labour market conditions during the week of July 10 to 16, 2022.


