## Smoky Lake Inn owners hold a fundraiser for Ukrainians with the Beatles Revival band



The Beatles Revival Band "All You Need is Love" played the whole evening on August 12 and 13.

When Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24th, many individuals, businesses and agencies offered help to Ukrainians. Fundraisers were set up; items were collected and shipped to Ukraine to

help the needy Ukrainians. Since the start of the war, Ukrainians have come to Canada to find a safe haven here. Five families have found a safe place in Smoky Lake at the Smoky Lake Inn. To further help them, Brian and Leesa Jones, owners of the

Smoky Lake Inn, set up a fundraiser for them on August 12 and 13; the Beatles Revival band All You Need is Love from Calgary performed two nights with a portion of the proceeds going directly to the Ukrainians staying at the Inn. Brian and Leesa contacted

the Ukrainian Canadian Congress at the start of the war to offer the rooms in their hotel for free to Ukrainian refugees for long enough to get everybody a foothold so they could start making it on their own.

## Local Chamber wins award

The Redwater and District Chamber of Commerce has won a prestigious award from the Alberta Chamber of Commerce.

"It was such a shock; I think it will take a while to sink in," says President Nicole Krill. "When we were informed of our award, it was very emotional. With us being a small chamber in rural Alberta and being run by volunteers with no paid staff, I didn't think we would win this award."

Joanne Williams (now councillor) and Ms. Krill took the task back in 2015/2016 while sitting on the Town of Redwater Ec Dev Board. "We saw a need for the Chamber to get back up and running to help the businesses," says Krill. "It took Joanne & I nine months for us to do the research and get things running again. A

big help with this was the Alberta Chambers of Commerce."

"Over the years, things have changed from people sitting on the board to deciding which direction the Chamber needed to go in and what things the Chamber did. Over the last few years, we found our way, and things are going in the right direction." says Krill

Covid came and brought with it changes businesses had to make to survive. "The restrictions were the biggest thing that hit the businesses the most. Covid changed things in a blink of an eye."

When Covid became the most significant concern among the chamber network, the Alberta Chambers of Commerce started

Motorcyclists cruised through the streets of Redwater while waiving and sharing smiles with all community patrons.

The Bully Enns is a volunteer-based and 100 percent non-profit motorcycle club. They travel throughout Alberta, and their group mandate is to support any child being bullied by offering a ride to and from school, activities, or spending time with the child. Thus, showing children that they have support and are an essential part of society. Empowering children to believe in themselves and grow with their newly found confidence. Their focus is on the child rather than confronting the bully. By doing so, the bullied children are then met with smiles and laughter. By focusing on the positive, the rides have changed the lives of children, their siblings, parents, and friends. Collin Klassen, Sgt of

Arms, stated, "Our bike organization's founder is Steve Enns, so Bullying Enns is a fun play on words! We are an anti-bullying group. We receive emails, texts, and messages from either parents, grandparents, or friends that a child is being bullied at school, skate parks, or recreation places, and we ride to meet the child. Either pick them up and escort them to or from school at home. We take the child out to Dairy Queen and then back home. Then everyone can see they become a member of our family!"

Howe reached out through Facebook as her son was devastated. He broke a bracelet that was from the Bully Enns. Quick to their bikes, Colin Klassen and Nadine Plouffe of the Camrose, AB chapter but local to Gibbons, AB, headed over with many other riders straight away. They brought the young man three bracelets, a hat, and other small goodies. The group offered to take the Howe family for ice cream at Dairy Queen in Gibbons and soon came to learn the young man had succumbed to dealing with many bullies in his life. The group shared lots of laughs and stories and

gave a lot of support to the young boy and his family.

Howe said, "This was such a fantastic experience

for my two boys and myself! We have truly come to learn that not all heroes wear capes!"

## Redwater RCMP Report

Hopefully everyone is enjoying their summer this year and having fun. Things get busy around here in the summer and as a result we missed the monthly briefing for June, so this brief will be both for June and July.

During the month of June, the Redwater Detachment received 240 calls for service. These calls consisted of 4 Assaults, 2 Assault with a Weapon, 13 Break and Enters, a Flight from Police, 24 Motor Vehicle Collisions, and 1 arson.

On June 4, 2022 at around 9:30 a.m. the Redwater Detachment received a complaint of a suspicious male that was observed sleeping on a path north of 47th street in Redwater. The member attended and located the male sound asleep in the grass.

Police woke the male up and requested his name. The male provided a name to the officer who, after conducting checks, determined that the name provided by the male was false. The male eventually provided his actual name to police and it was found that the male currently had a warrant out for his arrest from Edmonton, Alberta and had attempted to lie about his name because he did not want to be arrested on the warrant. Upon searching the male, he was found to be in possession of a

container of bear spray (pepper spray) despite being on numerous Release Order conditions not to possess weapons and pepper spray specifically. Further investigation by police revealed that the male had been driving a truck through a nearby field when it became stuck in the mud. Checks of the truck revealed that the truck had recently been stolen from Edmonton. It turns out that the same male had stolen the truck in Edmonton and drove it out to the Redwater area. The male, Matthew Myles MOYAH (39) of Frog Lake, Alberta was transported to the Redwater Detachment for a bail hearing and charged with:

- 6 counts of Fail to Comply with Release Order Conditions.
- 2 counts of Possession of a Weapon Contrary to an Order.
- Possession of Property Obtained by Crime.

Matthew Myles MOYAH was remanded into custody as a result of the bail hearing and on July 25, 2022 in Fort Saskatchewan Provincial Court convicted of 2 Counts of Failing to Comply with Release Order Condition (sentenced to 30 days in jail) and 1 Count of Possession of Property Obtained by Crime (sentenced to 150 days in jail)

as a result of his actions. All other charges were withdrawn.

On June 5, 2022 the Redwater Detachment responded to a call of a grass fire in the area of Range Road 223 and Township Road 564 in Sturgeon County. Upon arriving at the location police located a male who had started the crop at the location on fire.

Further investigation revealed that the suspect was known to the property representative and had attended the property previously with the representative in the past. Police determined that the male, on today's date, had decided to attend the property and light it on fire in order to deprive the property representative of being able to harvest the crop. In addition, the male was found to have a warrant for arrest from Edmonton for an unrelated matter. The male was arrested for arson and police located two firearms were located in his vehicle and determined that the male was not the holder of a licence that allowed him to possess firearms. As a result, the male was transported to the Redwater Detachment and held for a bail hearing.

The accused, Arnold Lee Pahl (53) from Parkland County, Alberta was charged with:

- Arson-Damage to

- Property.
- 2 Counts of Unauthorized Possession of Firearms
- 3 Counts of Failing to Comply with Release Order Conditions.

As a result of the bail hearing Arnold Lee Pahl was released on a \$3500 promise to pay Release Order. After failing to appear for his court date after being released, Arnold Lee Pahl was arrested on an arrest warrant and Pahl is next due to appear in Fort Saskatchewan Provincial Court on August 4, 2022.

On June 7, 2022, Boyle RCMP received a complaint of a male carrying a firearm. Subsequent investigation revealed that the male suspect fired a shot at a closed gas station and left the area. A description of the suspect and his vehicle was sent to nearby detachments. Shortly after, Redwater RCMP observed a vehicle matching the description and attempted a traffic stop. The vehicle fled and officers followed.

Fortunately, the vehicle ran out of gas within minutes and the suspect was safely arrested without further incident. Further investigation revealed that the pickup that the suspect was driving had been stolen during the evening from Thorhild County. A search of the vehicle revealed 3 loaded firearms and 5 unloaded firearms all stolen from

a residential Break and Enter on June 6, 2022 near Smoky Lake. RCMP have charged Sonny Ray Giant (40), of Lac La Biche, with 50 offences including firearms offences, possession of stolen property, flight from police, failing to comply with release conditions and failing to comply with weapon prohibition orders. This was a great example of two detachments working together to bring a quick and safe end to a dangerous situation.

Between the dates of June 23, 2022 and June 27, 2022 the Redwater RCMP received 4 complaints of a male driving a dark colored Chevrolet Silverado that was entering rural properties in both Sturgeon and Thorhild County. Throughout the course of these investigations surveillance footage showed the male suspect and the suspect vehicle.

This information allowed the Redwater Detachment to complete a fan-out notification to the Thorhild Citizens on Patrol, Sturgeon County Rural Crime Watch, and the Redwater Citizens On Patrol in an attempt to locate the suspect and the suspect vehicle. Within minutes the Redwater Detachment began to receive information as to the location of the suspect and truck. Within 30 minutes Redwater Detachment, with assistance from Eastern

Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit was able to arrest the suspect and recover the truck which was also stolen. As a result of his actions the accused, Mitchell Ryan Hagen (30) of Radway, Alberta was charged with:

- Possession of Break-In Instruments.
- 2 Counts of Possession of Property Obtained by Crime.
- 2 Counts of Break and Enter and Theft
- Forgery.

Mitchell Ryan Hagen was held for a bail hearing which resulted in him being released on a \$2000 Promise to Pay to appear in Fort Saskatchewan Provincial Court on July 28, 2022. On July 28, 2022 Mitchell Ryan Hagen failed to appear in court and a warrant for his arrest has been issued. If you happen know the whereabouts of Mitchell Ryan Hagen please contact the Redwater RCMP at 780-942-3600 or your local police.

This was a great example of community based crime prevention groups working together with the Redwater Detachment and the victims to identify, locate, and apprehend the suspect involved in numerous incidents in the Redwater area. I encourage all residents of the Redwater Detachment area to become involved in these groups and become part of the solution. If you are

In April, the first families began arriving, followed by others in the subsequent weeks. “Initially, we were going to offer one month for free, but some have been there for two or three months, and we are still not charging them rent. They are working at the Inn. Most of them are happy to do the work, even though it is not what they were trained for and is different from the work they used to do in Ukraine”, Leesa explains.

Not long ago, Brian and Leesa had seen the Beatles revival band at a fundraiser in Morinville, and they liked it. That sparked the idea to do a similar fundraiser in Smoky Lake, so they asked. Once it was confirmed, they set up the

ticket purchasing process through Ticketpro, which made it easier to trace the proceeds: Ticketpro split up the proceeds of every ticket into a \$10 fundraiser, then taxes and the cost of the

band, sent the package to Brian and Leesa with all accounting documents. This Beatles revival turned into a tremendous two-night event at the Inn that was very well received by the

public. All night long, the band played Beatles music, dressed like the Beatles (complete with wigs to make them look more like John, Paul, George and Ringo) and sounding like the

Beatles. Many guests took the opportunity to dance. Before the band started playing, there was a silent auction, the proceeds going to the Ukrainians. Some guests did not purchase

anything at the silent auction but donated money for a good cause. The funds will be split five ways; every family gets one-fifth of the proceeds. The guests prepared a Ukrainian meal available for purchase (not part of the fundraiser). The Beatles Revival band members pitched in for the fundraiser as well: Normally, they charge mileage, but they asked that Brian and Leesa add the money they would otherwise be paid for mileage to the fundraiser. There has been some confusion about the newcomers: Some people thought Brian and Leesa were bringing Russians in; this was probably because many Ukrainians speak Ukrainian but also speak Russian because they were under Russian (Soviet) rule until 1991 and because some of them lived not far from the Russian border. Russian and Ukrainian are Slavic languages and may sound similar. Organizing a fundraiser like this is quite a bit of work, but Brian and Leesa managed to do it in a month. A large portion of the work was to build the stage, which they have owned for many years but never used. Now that the stage is there to stay behind the Inn, there is hardly a limit to what they can do when inviting musicians. Their next fundraiser will be on September 4 with Martin Kerr.

During the month of July, Redwater RCMP received 213 calls for service which consisted of 4 Assaults, 5 Assaults with a Weapon, 16 Break and Enters, and 22 Motor Vehicle Collisions.

On July 15, 2022 the Redwater RCMP received a 911 complaint of a dangerous driver traveling southbound on Highway 63 near Abee. The witness reported that the driver of the BMW SUV was "speeding up and then slowing down, weaving all over the road, crossing the center line and then onto the shoulder". Now some of you maybe saying "this is normal for Highway 63" but I am here to tell you "this is not normal for any Highway". Member from both the Redwater Detachment and the Redwater Traffic Unit were able to catch up to the vehicle and stop it. After assessing the driver's sobriety and speaking to the driver it was determined that the driver was sober and appeared to have been fatigued. The driver was issued a violation ticket. 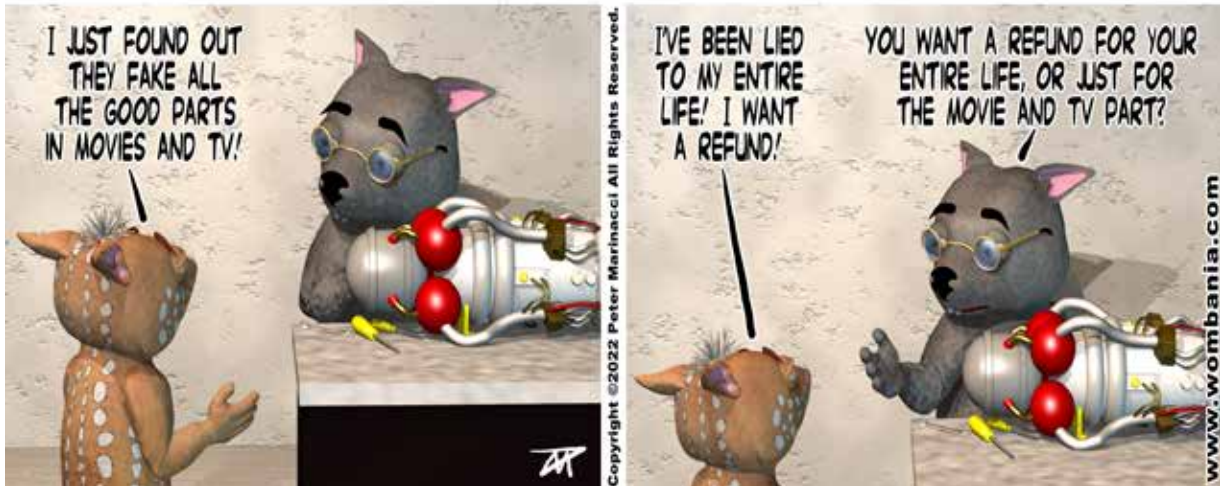

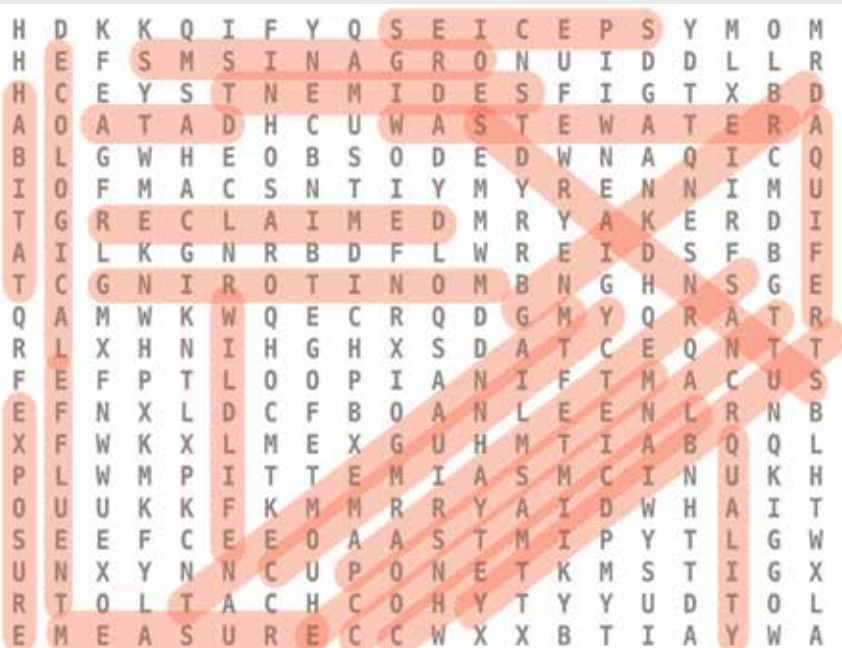


