








Here's How It Works:



District National Historic Site of Canada. The commemorative statement is displayed in English, French, Michif, Cree and Ukrainian, showcasing the multicultural nature of this area. Travel past the cemetery and Métis Crossing, a premier interpretive centre for Métis culture and education. Across Highway 855, the trail soon turns into a gravel road with gorgeous views of the North Saskatchewan River and historic buildings. The House in the Middle of the Road can't be missed because it is literally in the middle of the road. The RCMP Memorial Sculpture commemorates the RCMP trek west along Victoria Trail in 1874. This area is known as Lobstick settlement and is characterized by long narrow lots fronting the river.

these long narrow lots allowed all settlers riverside access. Another ferry crossing can be found in this area, the Warspite Ferry Crossing, straight south of Warspite. This ferry was in operation from 1925 to 1963, but a previous ferry crossing from 1920-1925 is just a bit further west. Turn off the trail approximately a mile north to view the Holy Transfiguration Orthodox Church, also known as the Northbank Church. Closer to Waskatenau and still following the river is the MacDonald Stopping House, a log home and general store built in 1908. It served as a post office from 1913-1920. This wasn't the first store in the district, though; that honour goes to Jack Henry, who operated the Henry House from 1905-1919. An interesting point

is Elsey's Hill, which earned its name because vehicles having trouble on the steep icy or muddy slope ended up in Elsey's yard at the bottom of the hill. That hill is still there, and it is still steep! The next ferry crossing is the Waskatenau Ferry Crossing, which operated from 1919-1963. This ferry crossing is east of The Elbow, a resting place for travellers and their horses at the most northerly point of the North Saskatchewan River. The trail ends by Highway 831. For anyone travelling the area, the Victoria trail has many beautiful views and points of interest, whether one travels by bike, vehicle, on horseback or even on foot. The trail and its points of interest are maintained by a group of volunteers, the Victoria Home Guard Historical Society.



Recently, Thorhild Pharmachoice moved to a new building. The pharmacy had been in what is now the old business centre of town for a long time. Over the years, the Thorhild business centre concentrated further south. Andrew James, the new pharmacy owner, decided to bring the business over to that area, along highway 827 that runs from Egremont to Athabasca, to give it more exposure to the

public. The new location also offered the opportunity to expand the inventory, apart from prescription and overthe-counter medicines, to other services for which customers usually would have to go to the city. "We are here to serve the clients, and even if we don't have what a client looks for, we can order it in," said Heidi Crossland, pharmacy manager. "We can offer other services such as counselling, lab test ordering or interpretation. We provide

compression stock fitting, blister packaging, selection advice for over-the-counter medication, and medication synchronization. We do Basic Health Screening and are an Aids to Daily Living (AADL) vendor". The pharmacy provided some of these services in their previous location, but they have expanded their services, and with people walking in to check out the new site, more people have become aware of all the services. The pharmacy

offers chronic disease management for those with chronic diseases and can prescribe drug therapy to manage acute or chronic medical conditions. Prescribing drug therapy and clinical service funding are also available (please contact the pharmacy for details). With all these services, it is essential to connect with the pharmacist and discuss the ailments and the medications taken so far. It is pretty remarkable and necessary for a rural community to offer these services to their clients, so people don't need to go to the city. Seniors with mobility challenges must have these services around the corner. In addition, because clients and pharmacists are both in the same community, it offers the opportunity to build up that personal rapport and get to know the client, which enables the pharmacist to tailor services to this specific client. Heidi and

her staff are pleased to be in the new location, which is not only bigger but also more "in the loop." "We have been open since July 25, but we want a grand opening in September where we hope to see the Chamber of Commerce, councillors and many visitors. We will inform the community of the date".
