

EMERGENCY SERVICES COSTS SURVEY RESULTS








the hotel. They started the store in Bellis in 1988 and have been in the current location for twelve years. They used to go to auctions to get their items or to wholesale shows.

"Then people would phone saying they don't want to do a garage sale but would like to sell their stuff to us. I discouraged people from bringing stuff to the store because I ended up with items I didn't want. Now I go to different stores such as the restores; I already know what people want and will look for that item." Eva stays active and goes to the city at least once a week to find collectibles and items people have been asking for. She checks stores for antique items but cautions about what is 'antique.' Some stores sell items as antiques that aren't, but Eva never sells anything as antique that she knows a fake. "Nowadays, they are very good at making something look old; it takes experience to develop an eye for what is antique and what isn't. My husband knew his stuff and knew what was old and what wasn't. He would clean

bigger items that had been sitting in a grainery for a long time and make them look nice again. It has been quite difficult without him being there, so I don't have as much furniture; I focus on the smaller stuff". She enjoys doing what she is doing, selling antiques and collectibles and talking with people that visit her store. Anyone entering the store will notice that it smells good and is not dusty at all, as expected from an antique and collectibles store. Eva dusts everything and keeps it neat. "I cannot imagine having nothing to do, I just keep going, and I love running the store," Eva comments. If she has an item that doesn't sell, she donates it to another store, but most of the stuff she has will go one year or another. "My

advertising is 'by chance or by appointment,' and during winter, I am not always open," Eva adds. "I enjoy what I am doing and love people; I like to visit with clients." Her son helps her as much as he can with oversized or heavy items; still, she tries to do as much as she can but appreciates help if people offer it. She gets many people out of the area into her store, mainly during summer. People will tell others which brings in other clients. "If you have a good collection, people will come, no matter where you are," Eva concludes. Heritage Corner Shoppe Antiques and Collectables is open Wednesday thru Saturday and Monday from 10-5 and can be reached at 780-636-3937. The store is located on the main street in Bellis.

Alberta RCMP officer involved in shooting in Smoky Lake

On August 8, 2022, at 7:27 am, St. Paul RCMP were making efforts to apprehend two individuals who were suspects in several ongoing police investigations. The two suspects, a man and a woman, were believed to be in Saddle Lake Cree Nation. St. Paul RCMP located the two suspects in the area of Saddle Lake Cree Nation, and an interaction ultimately occurred, leading to a confrontation between police and the suspects that resulted in officers discharging their service weapons. During this incident, part of highway 28 near Smoky Lake

and local Crime Watch members were summoned to warn the population to stay indoors on lockdown. As a result of the confrontation, one suspect is deceased, and the second suspect has been transported to the hospital in critical condition. No RCMP officers have reported physical injuries as a result of this incident. A substantial number of resources were deployed to a large geographical area to provide support and manage risk to the public throughout this investigation. St. Paul RCMP continue their original investigations, and the Alberta Seri-

Team (ASIRT) has taken over the investigation into the circumstances of the officers involved in the shooting. The Alberta RCMP believes in processes that seek the facts, and it's important that processes taken to assess the actions of all those involved, including the police, are fair, transparent and defendable. This is why, as soon as the RCMP became aware of this incident, the Director of Law Enforcement was immediately notified to initiate an internal review process. 


