Angela Budd was raised in rural Alberta and has always been a country and wildlife lover. One day, she told her husband she was starting a business, so his question was: "What are we doing?". Her answer was: "Bullet and antler jewellery!" She explains how this came about: "We always go foraging in the bush, hiking a lot, we find our antler sheds, we forage for berries and pick saskatoons and raspberries. I do my landscape and wildlife photography in the bush as well. We came across a party spot where everyone was shooting their guns, and we started picking up shells and bullets to clean them up. I always try to find a reuse for everything, so I tried making jewellery out of these shells. So, I started asking my friends if they would be interested, and they were. The next step was that I was going to markets. The more I did that, the more people asked. This is more my style, redneck, western, outdoorsy items. I want stuff people can wear daily, and if it gets wrecked, that's ok." Angela comes from a crafty family, and as soon as she started this

business, she knew it was her thing. She is now shipping her items across Canada. And she has a wide selection of necklaces, rings and bracelets, as can be found on her website. During Covid, she was working off her website, but now she is going to markets again. She also tries new items: "One day, my husband and I were going for a drive. I found these bullets, so I turned them into a necklace. Next, people are asking me about it". She had a guy bringing an elk tooth with the bullet casing that the elk was killed with by his great grandfather. She put them together into a nice piece of jewellery. Angela gets her bullet casings from hunters or a rifle range and only uses recycled shells that she gets from others. It is a family enterprise: her husband cuts the antlers, and her sons help. Angela and her family live north of Waskatenau. As for a reason for the name, Angela explains: "Love and Lead: Everything I Love with a little bit of Lead." 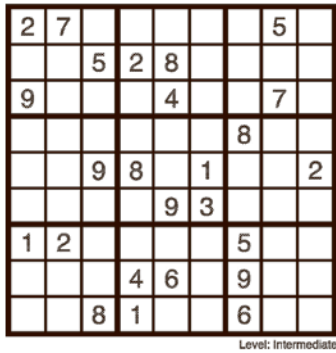

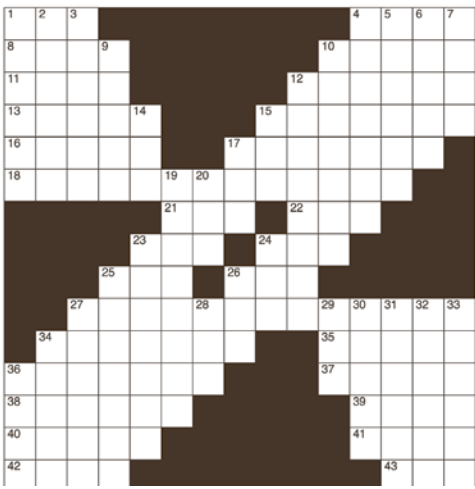

Indoor composting know-how

Starting an indoor compost bin can have many benefits, including an affordable way to make food for your plants and reducing waste in your home and local landfills. A considerable advantage of having your indoor compost bin is that it thrives year-round at a temperature between 40- and 80-degrees Fahrenheit. Indoor compost also works perfectly in small spaces. You can store it in a dark and dry place such as a basement, closet, under-the-sink cabinet, or even on the counter.

Aerobic composting and vermicomposting are the two main types of composting methods.

Aerobic composting uses microbes from garden soil to help convert kitchen waste and other organic wastes into compost, mainly used as homemade plant fertilizer. Vermicomposting is where you use worms and soil microbes to convert organic waste to vermicompost, which contains worm castings or manure and decayed organic matter—making the compost very rich in nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium. Making your vermicompost has an advantage which helps soil retain water and guard against soil pathogens.

The best bins to choose from while you are planning to start your first indoor compost are lidded plastic storage bins and garbage cans which

can be metal or plastic, or wooden crates but be sure to have a wooden lid cut to fit for the top. Make sure your bin fits the space you intend to use; it should fit comfortably and have enough room, so it is not cramped. Typically, you can get away with five-to-ten-gallon bins in smaller households, but in a home of four or more, move up to an 18-gallon bin. With both types of composting in mind, remember it needs oxygen for soil microbes and worms to thrive. To help your compost flourish, drill a grid of 25 to 36-quarter-inch air holes evenly spread apart on the bottom of the bin and the lid. Add horizontal rows of holes along the sides one and a half inches apart. Add a tray under the compost bin so it catches the excess water and makes it easy to drain when needed.

A little know-how on what to put in your compost bin, three-part brown matter, carbon-based materials, such as shredded newspaper, torn cardboard, or dead leaves. One part of green matter is nitrogen-based materials such as food waste or plant clippings. So, to start, fill your bin with nearly three-quarters full of damp brown matter, gently toss, then evenly spread a cup of soil over the top. The next step depends on which type of composting you are trying to accomplish. Aerobic, use a small garden tool

to bury the day's organic waste or compost-safe food scraps in the soil layer. Vermicomposting, use one pound of red worms on top of the layer of soil for every 3.5 pounds of organic waste generated in your home. Once a week, you can bury your organic scraps in the worm layer of soil.

The indoor compost bin should not let out a foul odour but more of an earthy and natural smell. So, if you do smell something gross, check the container and assess. If the moisture level is too high, you can resolve it by adding more brown matter to help dry things out. It could be a possibility that there is too much food in the bin. Just wait until what is in there is fully decomposed, then add less often. Another issue could be a lack of oxygen. You must add more holes to the bin or frequently aerate the compost with a fork.

Here are a few things you can use for your compost and spread over the grass as a lawn conditioner. Mix one part potting soil with two parts compost to create nutrient-rich soil for pots or raised garden beds. Any liquid collected from the compost bin can also be used, one-part compost liquid to ten-part water, then mixed and use as a spray to nourish your plant leaves.

Are you interested in venturing into indoor composting? You can try it with these easy steps and help discontinue waste in your home.

On Friday, September 16, 2022, proceeds from the Thorhild Co-op BBQ will be donated to the Redwater Fellowship of Churches Foodbank.

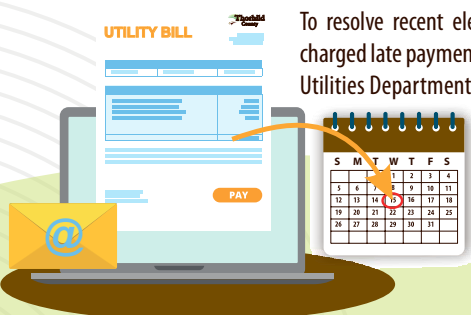

Running uphill: Alberta's economy heading into 2023

Between high inflation, rising interest rates and the invasion of Ukraine, economies around the world are struggling to keep from slipping into recession. Alberta's economy faces the same challenges, but is on track to be one of the top performers in the country this year due to the offsetting boost it is receiving from strong commodity prices. Our latest forecast pegs Alberta's real GDP growth in 2022 at 5.0%

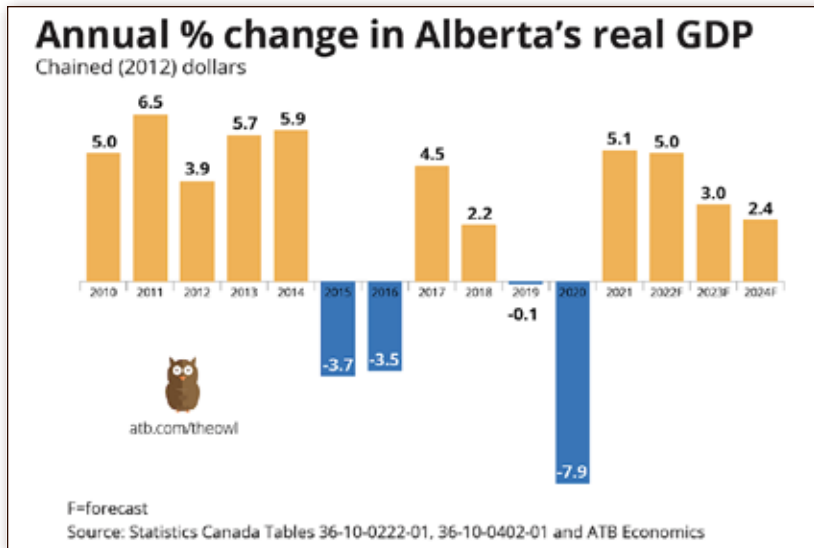
(unchanged from our May forecast) and 3.0% in 2023 (down half a percentage point from May). Growth continues to be led by our oil and gas sector, which is benefiting from strong production and drilling activity in the wake of oil prices averaging above US\$100/bbl over the first eight months of the year. Higher commodity prices and a weaker loonie are also boosting export revenues for most of our non-energy industries.

At the same time, our labour market is adding jobs despite ongoing staffing challenges and a lagging participation rate. Housing activity has started to slow, but house prices will most likely avoid the severe correction expected in some markets. It is, however, important to highlight that GDP is not a measure

of well-being and that Alberta's recent growth does not mean

everything is going well for everyone. Strong GDP growth

is fundamentally better than if things are moving in the other direction, but it does not negate the fact that many families and businesses are struggling with higher prices and rising borrowing costs. On the bright side, the momentum Alberta has going into 2023 will help our economy weather the economic storm created by the "three I's" of invasion, inflation and interest rates.


