The wide variety of competitors makes for an exciting show: the Pee Wees kick off the races on their little ponies or bigger horses, sometimes accompanied by mum running through the arena to show the barrel pattern. Without exception, these young barrel racers show they are having fun with big smiles. No doubt, here are some of our future barrel champions. The open category offers a large variety of speeds: some riders use this opportunity to get their

Why parents must keep kids cyber safe

Connecting over social networks, in-game chats or text messaging can be valuable ways for people to communicate. But sharing information like birthdates, addresses or other personal details online, especially publicly, can leave you vulnerable to scams like phishing. And kids especially may have a hard time recognizing some of these concerns - even if they are usually the family tech whiz.

Phishing is when someone tries to lure you into providing personal information so they can steal or sell your identity, your money or other private data. Many scammers make use of details you've shared online such as likes and dislikes, anniversaries or vacation destinations - to make their messages more personalized and therefore more enticing.

There are several red flags for phishing attacks that you and your kids can watch out for, including urgent or threatening requests, appeals for sensitive information or anything too good to be true or unexpected.



PUBLIC HEARING - BYLAW 1597/22

Amendment to the Land Use Bylaw 1385/17 - Diversified Agriculture

In accordance with Section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on proposed Bylaw 1597/22. This Bylaw proposes to amend the Land Use Bylaw by enacting recommendations of the Agribusiness and Agritourism Review Task Force Recommendations Report including, but not limited to:

- Creation of Event Venue use and related regulations.
- Creation of Diversified Agriculture use and related regulations.
- Amending the AG Agriculture District to allow Diversified Agriculture as a permitted use.
- Creation of an AG2 Agriculture 2 District to allow more intensive agricultural uses as permitted uses.
- Allow the gathering of development information to be used to trial an Impact Matrix.
- Other related changes.

Proposed amendments to the Bylaw since the June 14, 2022 Public Hearing include:

- Removing Event Venue use from the AG Agriculture District.
 - Clarification of Diversified Agriculture definition.
 - Other related changes.

sources as it will freeze and take days before it thaws. Many farmers use tank heaters or deicers, which take wellkept maintenance to stay running each year. Some farmers don't use heaters but will insulate all the pipes and faucets.

Some livestock is accustomed to foraging through the warmer months. Therefore, farmers must consider that animals must eat more in the winter to provide extra calories for heat energy. Eating more food also gives to keep warm. Farmers always make a backup plan just in case they must follow through with emergency feeding procedures.

Shelter for livestock will need to be prepared through the fall

months, and when the cooler winds begin to pick up, the shelters are called windbreaks. Windbreaks are set up for the outdoor animals to shelter from the brutal winter winds. Farmers also winterize barns and other shelter buildings. The buildings' roofs are constantly inspected and repaired to withstand the heavy weight of snow through the winter. They also set up heaters and ensure they are properly working and that the sheltered areas have good ventilation.

Farmers check on livestock daily, ensuring their livestock's needs are met and are prepared for any unexpected emergencies they may face through the cold winter months. A farmer's job is never done.
