Food banks, a great asset for communities

Today many communities struggle with supplying food for their tables through tough times of covid or job loss. Food Banks across the country are in the works to help the masses avoid this problem. Food Banks are non-profit organizations that collect nutritious, safe, and appropriate food and help by redistributing it to individuals or families in need. Some may ask, why are food banks needed? Well, access to food is a human right, but if struggle and poverty exist, food insecurity will too.

Food banks get provisions from many different places. Some may purchase food from donated funds; others may get food donations from local community members or organizations. Food banks may have booths or boxes set up at local businesses-like grocery stores, for anyone to donate.

Suppose you are interested in donating and wanting to help people in need. In that case, they always look for non-perishable foods like canned vegetables, dried fruits, beans, rice, and pasta, among other high-protein foods like canned salmon, tuna, and peanut butter. Vegetables like potatoes, onions, carrots, and tomatoes are always a must. Baby supplies like pureed vegetables, powdered formula, and baby cereal are also great items to donate.

Food banks are not only for supplying food to locals in need, but they are often neighbourhood hubs that work to foster social connection and education. Many food



Garlic sales to fundraise for Ukraine

Another fundraiser for Ukraine is happening this fall: Mandy Melnik of Meadowcreek farms in Waskatenau is donating a portion of their organic heritage garlic sales this fall directly to the people of Milijeve, Ukraine. Mandy has a close connection to Milijeve: she has Ukrainian heritage, and her cousin Zena Nendze, who lives in Newbrook, was born and raised in Ukraine. Milijeve (Milievo) is located in western Ukraine and has about 1200 residents. Since

the start of the war, this whole area has been inundated with refugees from eastern Ukraine and ordinary families are helping to feed the refugees. "While the war may be fading from frontpage coverage in the news, the people from Ukraine face the effects of war daily. In solidarity with them, I am asking people to support the refugees from eastern Ukraine during their time in the village of Milijeve," Melnik says. "Our farmland was settled by my family, who came from Ukraine. They brought

with them strong backs, hands and hope. I am grateful for the trees they planted, the soil they built and maintained and the hope and knowledge they inspired. We have a beautiful garlic harvest this year and want to support Miijeve". For each \$30 bag of garlic sold, \$5 will go directly to the people of Milijeve. RCMP updates in the region

On August 27, RCMP had a heavy police presence in the area of Lily Lake Resort, west of Redwater. On that day at 2:30 am, Morinville RCMP received a 911 call of a firearms complaint with an individual who had been shot in Sturgeon County. Lily Lake Resort residents were asked to shelter as police investigated. Later, the shelter-in-place was lifted. Police are looking for two persons of interest, and both are described as males in their mids 20's, one with blonde hair and the other wearing a ski mask. The 30-year-old victim of the shooting was taken to Edmonton by air ambulance with serious life-threatening injuries, but this victim's condition is currently unknown.

More information has become available about the shooting incident in Smoky Lake on August 8: A domestic violence complaint was received, and a vehicle was identified regarding this complaint. When RCMP officers tried to stop this vehicle, the driver fled. Officers pursued and eventually successfully used a tire deflation device. The driver continued at a slower speed, and during this stage of pursuit, an occupant of the vehicle discharged a firearm in the direction of the pursuing officers. The driver went

into the Centex gas station in Smoky Lake. The occupants, one man and one woman, exited the vehicle. The male was carrying the firearm, and together they stole a truck parked at the gas station. Officers arrived at the gas station, and one officer discharged their firearm at the fleeing vehicle at 7:58 am. Officers continued to pursue the vehicle as it left Smoky Lake. After briefly losing sight of it, officers located the now-abandoned vehicle in dense trees near Range Road 172. RCMP emergency response team and police dog service officers began to track the occupants from this location. At 10:11 am, officers observed the male occupant in a field. An interaction occurred between the officers and the male occupant, and officers discharged their firearms. approached Officers and later located both occupants, who were wounded. A firearm was located near the man. Emergency medical services provided care at the scene. The male was sent to an Edmonton-area hospital by air ambulance. The female was declared deceased by EMS. Alberta Serious Incident Response Team (ASIRT) will examine the circumstances surrounding the use of force. ASIRT is continuing efforts to identify people who may have witnessed aspects

of the confrontation between the man and police and is asking anyone who may have been in the area and may have witnessed these events and/or may have a video to contact investigators at 780-644-1483. On August 20, a 21-yearold man, a resident of Enoch Cree Nation, was charged with: flight from police, dangerous driving, possession of a weapon contrary to order (x3), unauthorized possession of a firearm, robbery with a firearm, theft over \$5,000, pointing a firearm (x2). Following a judicial hearing, the 21-yearold male was remanded into custody to speak to bail and is scheduled to attend St. Paul Provincial Court on Sep 1, 2022.

On Aug 28, just after 5:30 am, the Morinville Home Hardware was broken into. Two Caucasian males wearing dark clothing broke into the store and stole tools. The males fled the area in a white GMC truck. Morinville RCMP requests assistance from the public in identifying the suspects and/or vehicles. Policy for Municipal Snow Removal Services

Smoky Lake County has amended its <u>Policy State-</u> <u>ment No. 03-35-12: Snow Clearing</u> which provides guidance for municipal snow removal services in the County. The Policy outlines the guidelines for snow clearing to maintain County roads to be safe and in passable conditions as well as explaining the process for snow removal services on private residential driveways.

To obtain snow clearing for the season simply fill out an application and sign "Schedule A" *Hold Harmless Agreement For Use in Connection with Custom Work of Snow Clearing* to purchase a flag with the appropriate annual fee. The application is available at the Public Works County Shop or on our website: www.smokylakecounty.ab.ca.

This will entitle you to receive snow clearing services for the entire winter season.






