The business took on some structural renovations and officially bloomed into a thriving enterprise on April 1, 1983.

The grand re-opening offered guests a free beef supper, and the owners requested that farmers bring in their cattle brands to brand the cedar pillars before the rugs were installed and done again in 2016 for new farmers in the area. They were joining many community members together and creating a bit of history. 

**PUBLIC HEARING - BYLAW 1597/22**  
**Amendment to the Land Use Bylaw 1385/17 - Diversified Agriculture**

In accordance with Section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on proposed Bylaw 1597/22. This Bylaw proposes to amend the Land Use Bylaw by enacting recommendations of the Agribusiness and Agritourism Review Task Force Recommendations Report including, but not limited to:

- Creation of Event Venue use and related regulations.
- Creation of Diversified Agriculture use and related regulations.
- Amending the AG - Agriculture District to allow Diversified Agriculture as a permitted use.
- Creation of an AG2 -Agriculture 2 District to allow more intensive agricultural uses as permitted uses.
- Allow the gathering of development information to be used to trial an Impact Matrix.
- Other related changes.

Proposed amendments to the Bylaw since the June 14, 2022 Public Hearing include:

- Removing Event Venue use from the AG - Agriculture District.
- Clarification of Diversified Agriculture definition.
- Other related changes.

The Alberta Association of Agricultural Societies designates a day each year known as Agricultural Societies Day on September 21. The day's primary focus is to celebrate, promote and recognize the outstanding contributions that the agricultural societies make and how they enhance the quality of life in every community in the province.

Agricultural societies are volunteer-based, not-for-profit organizations that serve your community. Each society produces a higher quality of life by improving and developing programs and services while providing facilities that meet their community's needs.

Currently, in Alberta, there are more than 700 facilities. Some include ice arenas, riding arenas, community halls, and curling rinks, and some that also have

campgrounds owned and operated by AG societies. In 2022, 20 AG societies reached over 100 years old, along with 34 that celebrated their 50th anniversary. Many date back to 1879 and 1880 in Alberta, when the first agricultural societies were formed.

Many of your local community members volunteer many hours of their time throughout the year for the enjoyment and growth of the community. Their programs promote community activities, build connections, and create pride in each community.

Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Economic Development Nate Horner stated, "I'm proud to recognize the dedicated volunteers that make agricultural societies work. Your determination keeps Albertans connected to agriculture and promotes the true
