Fire won't wait. Plan your escape

In recognition of Fire Prevention Week, students at Ochre Park had the opportunity to learn from, and ask questions of, firefighters from Sturgeon County on October 12. Students in Grade 4 at the school had questions galore for the three firefighters in attendance. One student asked an important question for those living on rural properties.

"What do we do if we don't have a neighbour?" asked one of the Grade 4 students. As many students in the region live on acreages, it is important for

2022 third quarter Air Quality Monitoring results released

Fort Air Partnership (FAP), the organization that monitors the air local residents breathe, released 2022 third quarter Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) results today. The Government of Alberta calculates the AQHI using data collected at seven of FAP's air monitoring stations.

Results show that the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) ratings were in the low-risk category between 91.91% to 96.19% of the time during the third quarter. There were 99 hours

of high and 3 hours of very high AQHI ratings for the calendar quarter. These results were entirely a result of wildfire smoke entering the Airshed, mainly from western Alberta and B.C. The air monitoring stations at Gibbons (96 hours or 2.24% of the time), Fort Saskatchewan (46 hours or 1.15% of the time), and Elk Island (32 hours or 0.74% of the time) recorded the most hours of high or very high AQHI results due to the wildfire smoke. The Town of Lamont recorded the least (0 hours).

For comparison, in the third quarter of 2021, there were 246 hours of high and 84 hours of very high AQHI ratings. These results were almost entirely a result of wildfire smoke entering the Airshed from surrounding provinces. Only 11 hours (3.3%) of the high or very high AQHI hours in 2021 were

due to causes other than wildfire smoke. In Q3 2021, the air monitoring stations at Elk Island, Fort Saskatchewan, and Redwater recorded the most hours of high or very high AQHI results due to wildfire smoke, while Gibbons recorded the least.

kids to know what to do in the chance of a fire at home. "Stand far away from the house where you are safe, but can be seen by firefighters," answered Lane Hardman, Sturgeon County Firefighter. "Stand near a tree by the road where firefighters can see you."

The firefighters came prepared with questions of their own for the students. Students responded to questions such as:

"How should you get out of the house if there's a fire? Stand tall or crawl?" and "What are you going to do if you are playing a game on your Xbox or Ipad and the smoke detector goes off?"

The students had all of the correct answers, although you could see the disappointment when they considered losing all of their progress on their games.

Each year the National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA) holds a Fire Prevention Week (FPW) during the week that October 9 falls in. This year the NFPA is celebrating the 100th

anniversary of FPW with the theme "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape."

The Sturgeon County firefighters that presented at Ochre Park has teamed up with the NFPA to help spread the message of the importance of having a plan on what to do before a fire occurs.

"We come to see kids and talk about what it means to be fire safe," explained Nathan Douglas, Sturgeon County Firefighter. "So, this year we are talking about planning your escape; we are talking about escape plans in our homes."

"Today's homes

burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes (or even less time) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning," said Lorraine Carli, vice president of Outreach and Advocacy at NFPA.

With all of the questions asked during the presentation, the students came away with a greater knowledge of how to safely escape from a fire, and how to plan for that escape.

Grade 4 student Hutch Thomas,

explained that he "learned that if your bedroom door is open and there is a fire in the house, you shut it and go to the closest window."

All of the students were sent home with an information and activity kit that will help them to plan their escape with their families in their own homes.

Even with the high level of engagement by the students throughout the presentation, the highlight was when grade 4 teacher, Mrs. Shenfield donned the 50lbs of gear. The students voted unanimously for her to suit up.

George Goruk

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of George Goruk on October 9, 2022 at the Red Deer Regional Hospital at the age of 93. He is survived by his wife of 74 years, Katherine; three sons, Dennis, Darrell (Nenita) and Bernie as well as ten grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren.



oilfield rental and supply businesses. He participated in the 1987 Alberta Trade Mission to Russia and also sat on the board of the Service Rig Division of the Canadian Association of Oilwell Drilling Contractors (CAODC)

George (known as Geedo to his family) was born on the family homestead North of Bellis Alberta on May 21, 1929. He was the third son of a family of eight born to William and Jennie (nee Strayski) Goruk who were among the earliest settlers in the Bellis area northeast of Edmonton. He met his wife Katherine (Shupenia) in Edwand Alberta and the two were married on August 8, 1948 with their wedding reception held in the loft of the newly built barn on the family farm. They farmed for one year near Edwand and then moved to Edmonton where George started his career in the oil industry. They moved to Red Deer Alberta in 1959 and with the support of Katherine in 1962 George started Target Well Servicing. In 1972 they purchased a farm along the Medicine River near Sylvan Lake and ran a cow/calf operation while he continued to run Target which was acquired by Thomson Industries and eventually became part of ATCO. While with Thomson and ATCO, he established service rig operations in Wyoming, Texas and Australia. He also added coiled tubing services, nitrogen/pumping services and

and the Red Deer Westerner. George retired as President of ATCO Oilfield Services in 1994 but continued to raise registered Quarter Horses and cattle and with help from his sons (and Katherine) continued to farm what eventually became a hay and grain operation. One of his proudest achievements was being inducted into the Canadian Petroleum Hall of Fame in 2016 in recognition of his contributions to the industry as a builder and innovator.

For many years George owned a boat and enjoyed fishing and developed a passion for golf and was a long-time member of the Red Deer Golf and Country Club. George and Katherine also enjoyed travelling throughout the US, Caribbean, Australia and Europe having visited the Ukraine on two occasions. For a few years they spent part of the winter months in Hawaii and then started travelling to Mesa Arizona in their motor-home every winter until their mid eighties.

George is also survived by his two remaining brothers Peter (Gert) and Nick (Doreen). In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by brothers John, Metro, Andy, Phillip and sister Mary Larson as well as daughter-in-law Carole and grandson Byron.

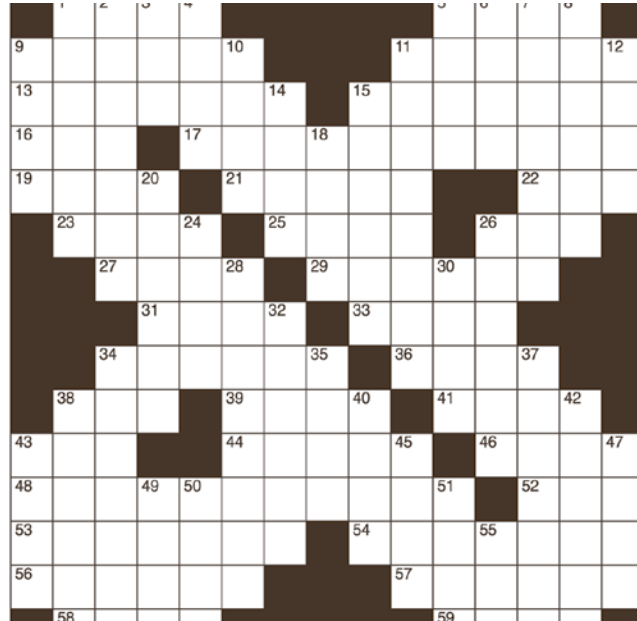
Fun By The Numbers

New policy supports a fiscally sustainable future

The new policy includes measures to effectively manage financial priorities, simplify financial reporting and supports a sustainable, fiscally responsible future for the County.

Sturgeon County, AB: The new Regulated Property Tax Policy was adopted at the October 11, 2022, Sturgeon County Council meeting. This new policy focuses on planning for long-term growth by efficiently monitoring the County's assessment forecast and financial commitments.

"We are continuously reviewing and improving our processes," said Sturgeon County Mayor Alanna Hnatiw. "This new policy supports long-range fiscal planning to provide residents with the best possible value for their tax dollars."

Sturgeon County has a

unique assessment base with a very high concentration of heavy industrial properties. The Province regulates the assessments of heavy industry developments. This means that County finances are impacted by external factors and events from around the world.

The Regulated Property Tax policy allows County Council more flexibility to carefully manage financial pressures the County may experience as the region's assessment base evolves and projected revenues from heavy industry decrease. The new policy improves forecasting and reporting on heavy industry tax revenues, enabling the County to do more long-range planning to support key priorities and provide residents with quality services. It allows the County to be

more agile in responding to new opportunities and navigating increasingly complex economic challenges.

"This policy helps us prepare for our future," said Hnatiw. "It allows Council to have accurate assessment forecasts so we can make informed and transparent decisions to create a fiscally sound future for the County. Council is dedicated to ensuring residents, businesses and industry are represented in a fair and equitable manner as our assessment base evolves."

This policy replaces the current Significant Tax Revenue Growth policy, which required complex financial monitoring that provided limited benefits.

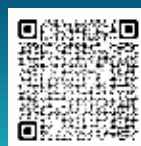

Redwater RCMP Report

During the month of September, the Redwater Detachment received 260 calls for service. These calls consisted of 8 Assaults, 2 Assault with a Weapon, 5 Break and Enters, 12 Thefts, 25 Motor Vehicle Collisions.

Well the month of September started out with a truck and trailer that ended up hitting a train. On September 7, 2022, at approximately 10:45 a.m. the Redwater RCMP detachment was dispatched to a collision where an eastbound train was crossing Highway 63 when it was struck by a southbound pick up truck towing a BBQ trailer.

Police officers from Smoky Lake, Boyle, Redwater, and Redwater Traffic Unit attended to find the driver of the truck trapped while the passenger of the truck escaped with no injuries. The Fire Department were able to remove the male driver from the truck where STARS Air Ambulance then took the male to an Edmonton Hospital with serious but non-life-threatening injuries. There were no injuries to the anyone on the train. The collision remains under

investigation.

On September 28, 2022, the Redwater Detachment received a report from a rural property owner that unknown individuals had been damaging the gate to their cattle pasture. The property owner had recently checked the property and advised that there was now a camper set up on the property. An officer from the Redwater detachment attended the property to investigate and when they arrived a male and female ran to a nearby SUV and attempted to flee, but backed into a tree and became stuck. The officer was able to take both the male and female into custody without incident. Further investigation revealed that the travel trailer had recently been stolen from a storage lot near Vermillion. A search of the vehicle revealed break-in tools, 35 grams of methamphetamine, stolen power tools, pepper spray, and wallets belonging to an unrelated male and female. As the member continued to dig they were able to determine that both wallets were stolen within hours from a truck that had mechanical

issues and had been parked on the side of the road a short distance away.

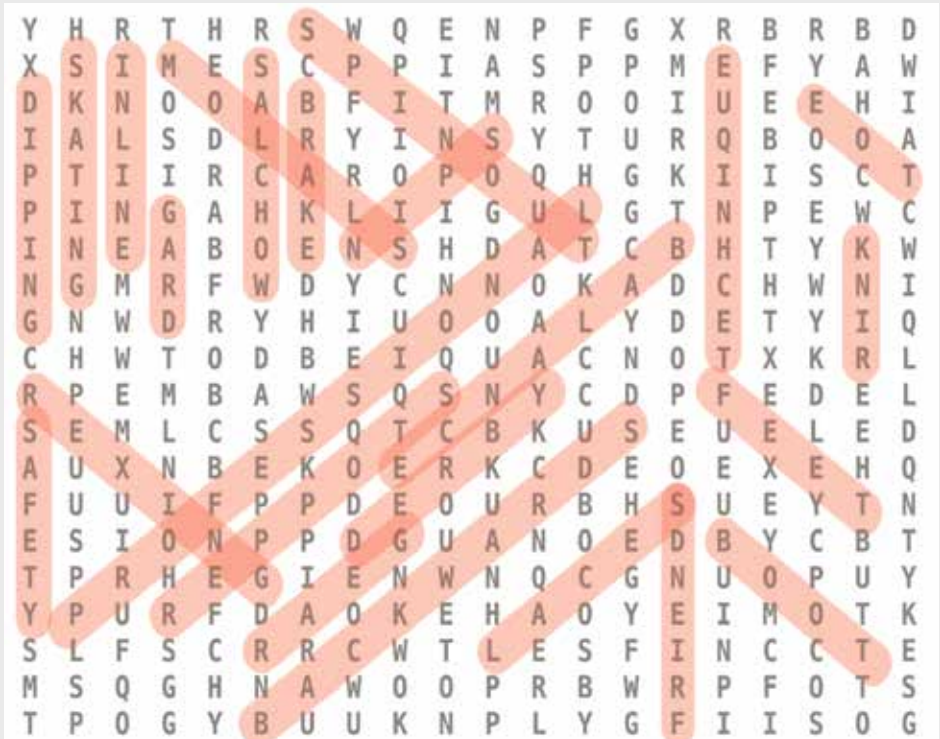


