Anhorn explained that on Monday morning students practiced a rear evacuation of a school bus.

"I stood on one side, and Mrs. Gingras on the other, and we assisted students in jumping out the back door and getting safely to the ground."

When asked, grade three students from the school were quick to answer with lots of safety tips that they have learned through their time riding the bus, or through safety weeks and presentations.

Evacuation drills are important for students to put what they know about safety procedures into practice, just like the fire drills that are held.

Grade three student Olivia Reed explained what she had learned about evacuating a bus. "You go to the back if there is fire in the front, and you go to the front if the fire is in the back."

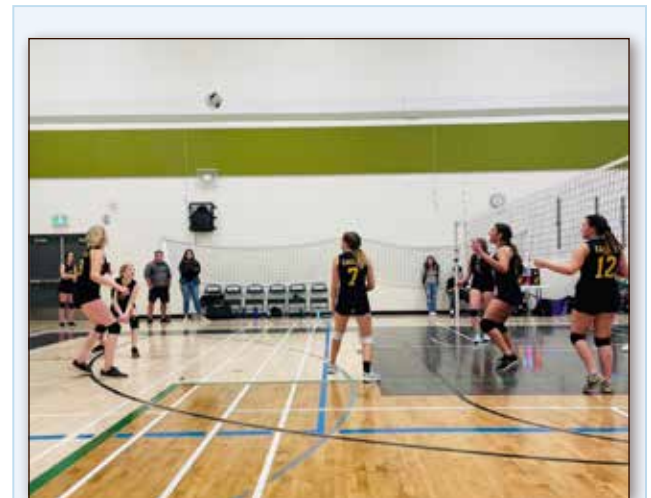
Literacy is in full swing

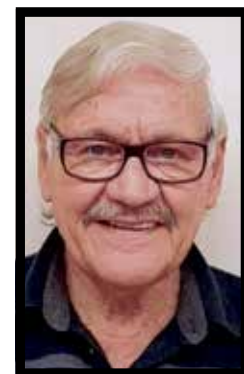

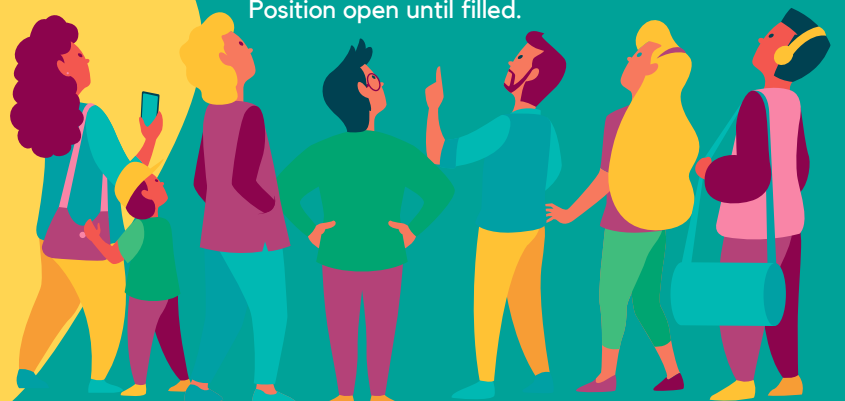

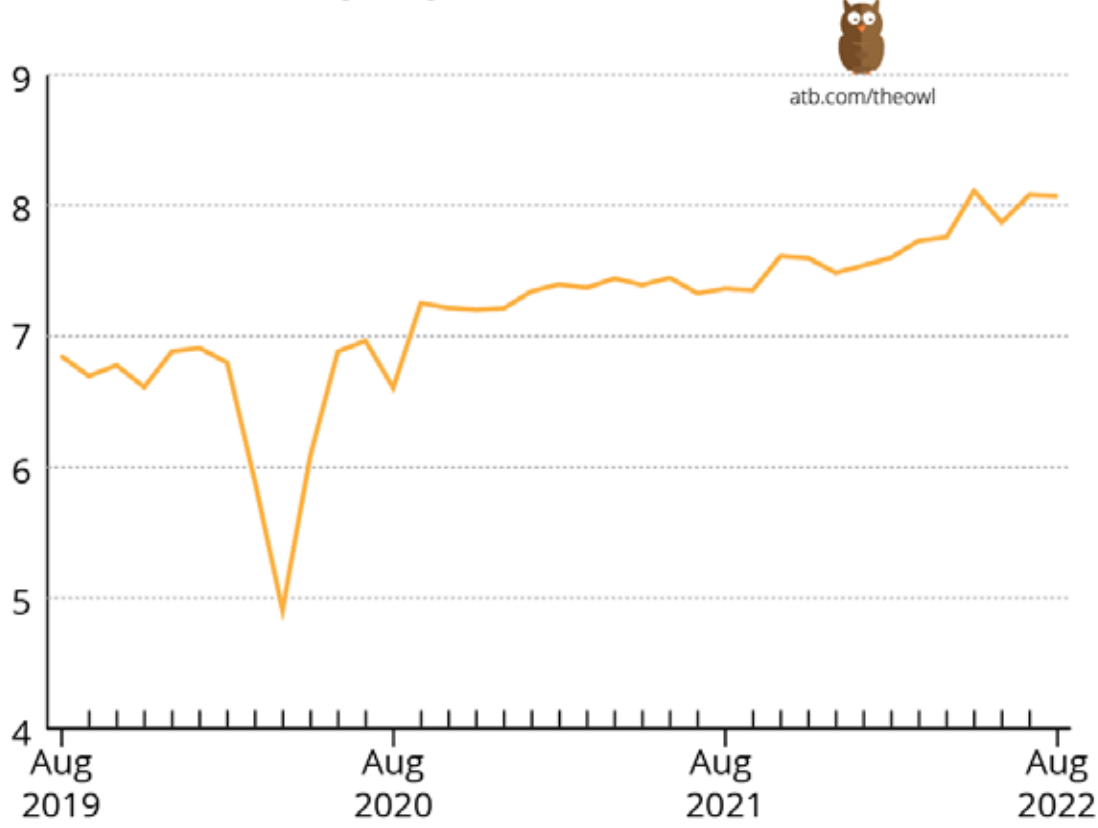

Pressures mounting on retail sales

Retail activity in Alberta held fairly steady at the end of the summer.

Alberta's seasonally-adjusted retail revenues fell \$2 million (-0.02%) in August, after increasing by \$203 million (+2.6%) in July.

A sharp contraction in gasoline prices pushed revenues at gasoline stations down by 7.8% in the month, but this was largely offset by an increase

in sales at motor vehicles and parts dealers (+8.6%).

Over the first eight months of the year, sales were up by \$3.7 billion (+6.4%). While this appears favourable, it pales when you consider inflation. The inflation rate for consumer goods in the province averaged 9.2% through August, the highest average over the first eight months of the year since the early 1980s.

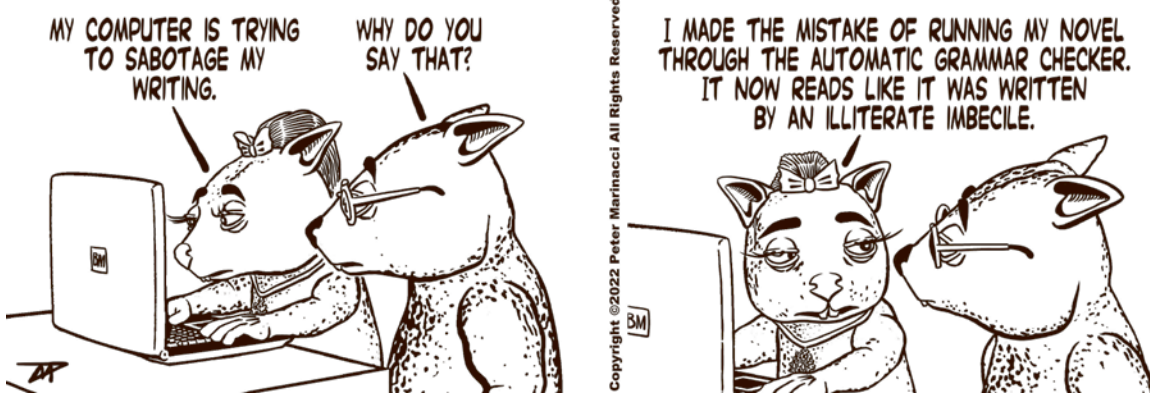
The trend was roughly the same elsewhere in the country

as Canadian retail sales were up by \$40.2 billion (+9.1%) relative to where things stood through August last year. While sales in every province were up during this period, Ontario alone drove over half of the aggregate national increase.

Given that inflation remained sticky in September, we expect the key elements of the story to remain mostly unchanged in next month's retail report.

the pandemic," said Sheena Fitzpatrick, Community Engagement Officer for Life in the Heartland. "The event was really well attended online, but we are excited to be back in person."

The information evening was presented in two parts. There were booths by approximately a dozen companies offering information and swag to those in attendance. Residents were encouraged to approach the industry representatives with any questions.

Alyssa Carson, Head of Sustainability with Sherritt said that there were a number of common questions they were being asked by community members.

"How is business and are you busy are two questions we've received a few times," she explained. "We've also had a number of questions about employment opportunities available."

Before the presentations began, residents were free to visit booths, asking questions of many of the industry representatives that were not presenting.

Community member Al Montpellier voiced a question that he believed many residents were curious about to Brenda Gheran, the Executive Director of Northeast Region Community Awareness Emergency Response (NRCAER).

With the large number of community members in attendance, questions were held until after all the presentations were complete. Door prizes were graciously donated by a number of the companies in attendance.

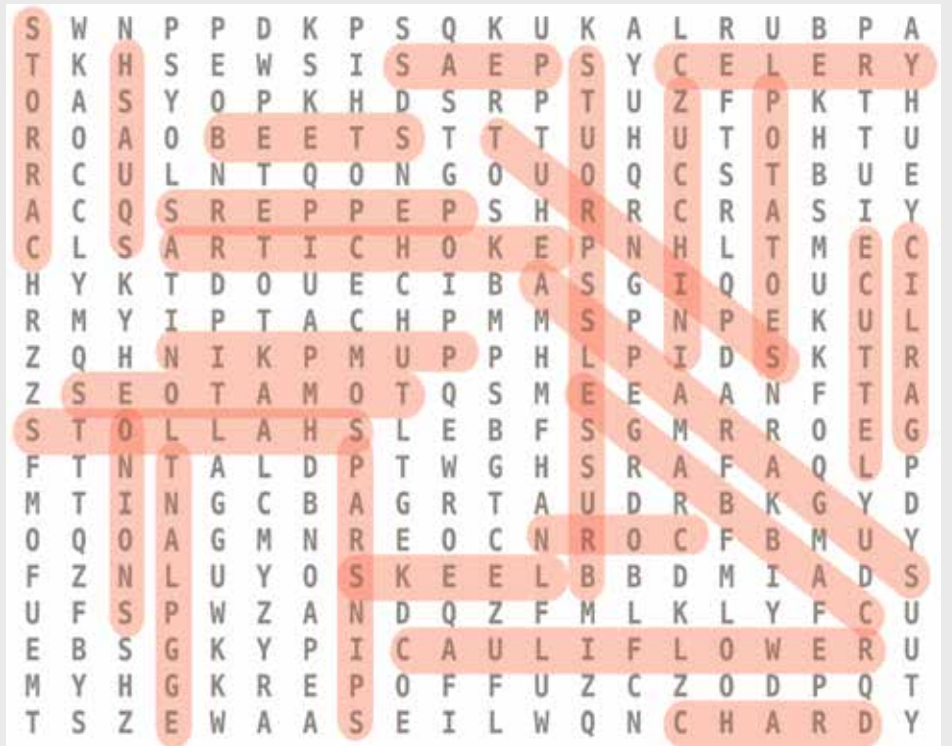

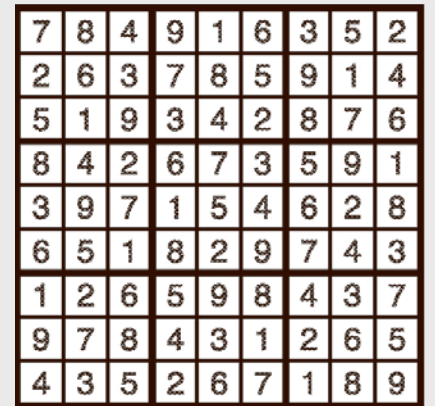


