Local Newbrook woman Stacey Clark spends her days caring for neglected animals or dogs in need of assistance on her ten-acre hobby farm. She takes in as many as she can at a time to help house, feed, groom, and train any of the pets that no longer have homes. She has been in the world of animals for 30-plus years, has her own dog grooming business, and has taken care of animals that need help for the past 15 years. Clark's heart is full of love and kindness as she shares her help with those animals that are less fortunate.

Clark said, "I help locals with rehoming dogs. I take the dogs people don't want anymore or have been abused or neglected. I also try to help as many people as possible who have financial issues and have pets; I will give them dog food. I also help individuals or families who need assistance training their animals."

Clark has noticed throughout her grooming career that many people in her area need help with their pets. She takes care of these dogs out of the kindness of her heart and does her best to give them

NATURAL GAS REBATE PROGRAM



Albertans are getting extra help with their natural gas utility bills this winter.

From October 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023, most Albertans with natural gas service will receive a rebate from the Government of Alberta if Alberta's natural gas price is above \$6.50 per Gigajoule (GJ).

The rebate applies to any Alberta residence or Alberta company with a natural gas usage under 2,500 GJ per year – a typical Alberta house uses around 120 GJ of natural gas per year!

Your local natural gas utility will automatically place the rebate on your monthly bill if the rebate is in effect. You will see a line on your bill stating "GoA Utility Commodity Rebate Program."

The natural gas rebate will be triggered if the monthly natural gas rate charged by any of Alberta's regulated default supply providers is above \$6.50/GJ. All eligible customers will receive rebates, regardless of whether their local utility has a lower rate.

The Federation of Alberta Gas Co-ops Ltd, and all 80 of our Member Natural Gas Utilities have worked with the Province to ensure Albertans get natural gas cost relief. The Natural Gas Rebate Program helps Albertans to continue to heat their homes with clean, efficient natural gas.

The town of Smoky Lake installs an electric vehicle charger

In the discussion around energy and the use of fossil fuels, the use of electric vehicles is taking a prominent position. The Town of Smoky Lake installed an electric vehicle charger several weeks ago. The charger is in the centre of town, a strategic location for anyone wanting to visit the town as it is in the heart of the business district. Located in front of the Town office, a person can easily walk to the stores or Pumpkin Park. This will make it easier to pass the time as charging an electric

car can take a fair bit of time, depending on the charging station and the amount of battery life left. Many questions still exist about electric vehicles. They don't use fuel and are less costly to operate because they have fewer moving and wearable parts. Battery life is an essential aspect of electric vehicles, and because the market is so new, not much is known about battery life or the value of batteries. This is undoubtedly something a prospective buyer should look into, especially when buying a used EV. Some other considerations

for a prospective electric vehicle buyer are what range they need to cover (currently, the number of electric vehicle stations is limited though increasing) and whether or not to install a charger at home. In Canadian weather, the battery range can drop by as much as 40-50 percent, something to keep in mind, especially when shopping for a used car. More and more electric vehicle charging stations are being built across the province, with the most northern one in High Prairie. Edmonton and Calgary have charging stations across the city and surrounding areas, as far east as Bonnyville and as far west as Banff. Currently, the most southern station is in Cardston. Whether electric vehicles will become mainstream at some point remains to be seen with the distances in our country and the amount of freight being moved on the road. The installation of more charging stations certainly would be an incentive for people to consider buying an electric vehicle or a hybrid.

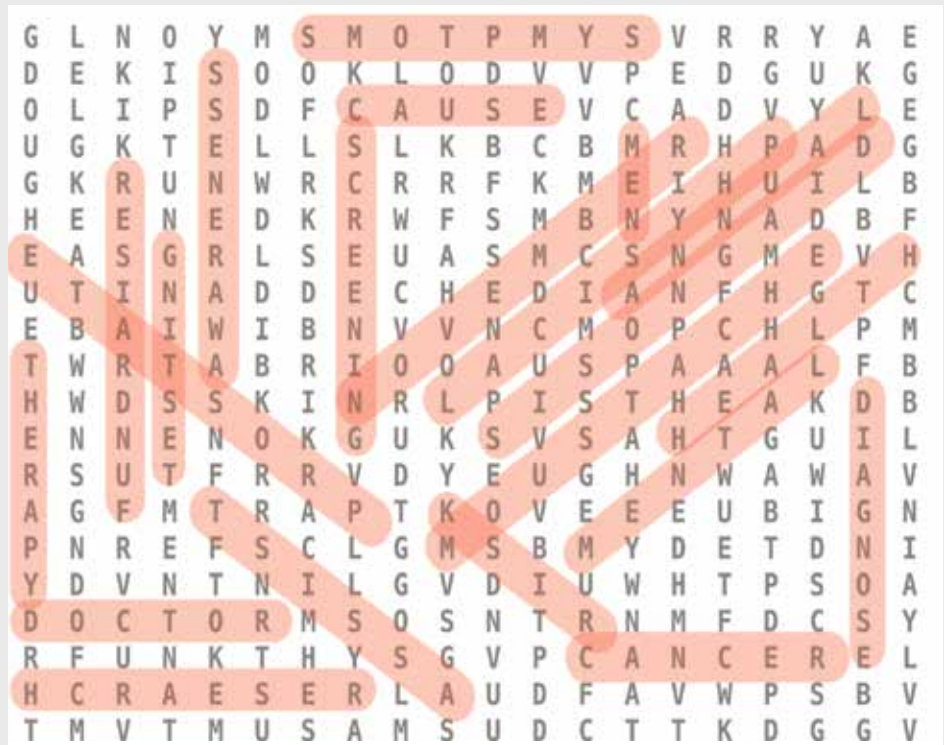

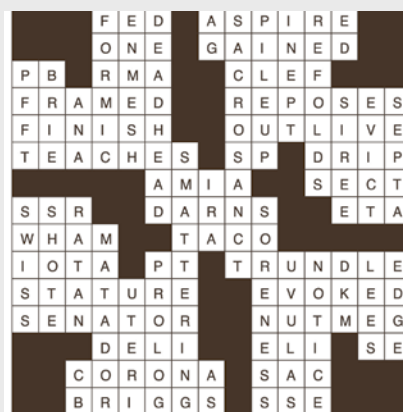

Make sure to soak a campfire, stir it, and soak it again. Repeat these steps until the campfire site is cool to the touch.


