





## Small Remembrance Day ceremony in Smoky Lake

The Smoky Lake Legion had it all set up: a Remembrance Day ceremony in the complex, complete with a full-service wreath laying, a minister and children carrying flags. Normally, many children attend the Remembrance Day ceremony, and altogether about 250 people attend the event to honour Canada's veterans. However, a respiratory virus (or more than one) sweeping through Smoky Lake kept many residents at home. 100 children at the H.A. Kostash school were sick. "We could not take that risk for the community," George Brooks, Legion president, says. "If we had brought all these people together, for sure more

sick a few days later, and we did not want that responsibility." Hence, a much smaller event was held at the Legion. On November 11, at 11:00, two minutes of silence were held by approximately fifteen participants, most of them Legion members. This is the designated moment for the ceremony as the Armistice between the Allies and Germany at the end of World War I was signed on November 11, 1918, at 5:15 a.m. in a train wagon in Compiegne, France, to become effective at 11:00 a.m. that same day. Ironically, when France capitulated to the Germans at the beginning of World War II, Hitler demanded that the French capitulation be signed on June

people would have been 22, 1940, in that same train wagon on that same spot in Compiegne. Every year at 11:00 a.m. on November 11, veterans are honoured with a ceremony. Veterans are all those who have served in the Canadian Forces, regardless of whether they have been deployed abroad or not. Following the silence, everyone went outside, and Legion representatives laid a wreath by the cenotaph. The ceremony was concluded with a lunch offered free of charge by the Legion. The Legion is creating another chance to connect with the community: they are planning a Christmas dinner for the community on December 25th. More about this to follow in mid-December.



#### NEW EMERGENCY SERVICES BYLAW

County Council adopted a new Emergency Services Bylaw on October 25, 2022. Emergency Services Bylaw 10-2022 can be accessed online at www.thorhildcounty.com under the Services - Fire & Emergency Services tab.

Bylaw 10-2022 is a guide for the operation of the Emergency Services Department and authorizes the recovery of related fees, expenses, and charges. The new bylaw expands on activities that do not require fire permits, including burning barrels and outdoor fireplaces, and details fees and penalties.

Some significant changes to the bylaw are outlined in Schedule "A" Emergency Services Charges, and Schedule "B" Specified Penalties.

Schedule "A" provides greater clarity on emergency or incident response charges. For example, hourly rates and other charges are outlined in detail.

Schedule "B" expands on the types of offences whereby penalties are applied. For instance, penalties are defined for offences such as a burning barrel fire, smudge fire in a hamlet or subdivision, lighting a fire or allowing a fire to be lit without a Fire Permit, etc.

Thorhild County reminds residents to ensure their current property insurance covers emergency response charges.

- Driveways will be addressed after all County roads are cleared
- Driveway Plowing consists of one pass in and back out
- Each flag is good for one plow only
- Fees and Flags must be purchased before the work is done

\$35.00/Flag Fee:

\$20.00/Flag for seniors 65+ who are physically living on the property and can provide age verification.


