The indoor arena in Waskatenau reduces the fees

With winter coming, many horse riders are looking at the weather before deciding to go for a ride. A little snow may not be much of an issue, but once the snow turns into ice, or the temperatures drop considerably, going out for a ride is no longer an option. The arena in Waskatenau offers an opportunity to ride indoors. This indoor arena, which is 85 x 185 feet, is heated and insulated, offering a good alternative for an outdoor ride. There is plenty of parking space around the arena. The Victoria Trail Agricultural Society operates the facility. The Society received feedback from the community and decided to offer a "special" this year by

reducing the annual individual membership fee from \$400 to \$290, a substantive reduction. The family membership fee is reduced from \$500 to \$390. This is a new one-year trial membership. In 2023 the price will be evaluated to see if it will be continued. Although it seems a substantial amount in these expensive times, the hourly fee is \$30, so an individual wanting to use the arena regularly would have their membership fee paid back after almost ten times. Over the course of our long winters, one would probably be cheaper off buying a membership than paying per individual hour. A similar calculation applies to families. Though arena

FIREFIGHTERS COMPLETE NFPA 1001 TRAINING

Thorhild County Emergency Services is proud to announce that on October 29, 2022, ten Thorhild County Emergency Services members completed their National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1001 Level 1 provincial testing at the Athabasca County Training Centre. This was the final component of a curriculum spanning over eight months of regimented training.

The NFPA 1001 is an international standard designed to be the minimum requirement for firefighters to ensure they are knowledgeable, competent, and safe during fireground operations. The course covered topics such as communications, building construction, ladder operations, hose, and water stream operations, fire behaviour, forceable entry, search and rescue, tactical ventilation, overhaul, and personal protective equipment. The members gave up multiple nights a week and several weekends over the course of the eight months to complete all the theory and practical skills required.

The next step for these members is to receive training and subsequent certification in NFPA 1072 Hazmat Operations level to become fully certified IFSAC/Proboard firefighters.

Thorhild County Emergency Services wish to thank Captain Krysta Bentley for her unwavering dedication and leadership to the program, members of the Gibbons Fire Department who assisted with evaluation days, Athabasca County Fire Services for the use of their certified training centre, Thorhild County Council for their support of the firefighter training program, and to all citizens of Thorhild County who stand by their Emergency Services team.

The Royal Canadian Navy

The Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) is tasked with protecting Canadian sovereignty at sea, at home and abroad.
