The town was brimming with festive cheer on Saturday, December 3, with the Festival of Lights.

Town of Redwater Council has approved the 2023 budget that addresses long term and current challenges while providing valuable services for residents

The Town of Redwater transportation through Administration presented the 2023 Operating and Capital Budget at the special council meetings on November 21,22 and December 1 2022. Details are available at www. redwater.ca.

At the December 1 meeting, Council approved a budget increase of 4.53%, reduced down from the original draft budget increase of 7.06% brought by Administration.

The presented budgets built the priorities identified in the new Redwater 2022 Strategic Plan and was planned in the context of rising inflation, economic challenges, while allowing the town to have sufficient operating revenue to maintain and improve service levels and asset maintenance.

The 2023 Operating and Capital Budget includes protecting residents, providing safe

good road and sidewalk maintenance, and promoting health and wellness through Pembina Place and other recreational amenities. Removing snow, cutting grass, and maintaining green spaces adds to community beauty. Other initiatives will support and grow the community economics.

One of the major challenges the town faces currently is the effect of hyperinflation which affects the town's ability to plan for sustainability and still meet citizen expectations of keeping taxes low and service levels high.

For the average Redwater home (assessed at \$197,500 in 2022), 2023 taxes will be approximately

\$2,052 annually or \$171 monthly. This budget increase equates to





a \$7 monthly increase over 2022 for the average home.

Mayor McRae acknowledges the difficulties experienced developing this year's budget and points out its successes, stating:

"Budgets are difficult, at the best of times. Given the hyperinflation municipalities are facing, the reduced grants available from other levels of government, the increased expenses passed to us for policing and making sure we have the right service levels, this year was that much more difficult. Council worked hard to make sure Administration had clear direction and Council was able to approve the best possible budget for our community."

Rates—Fixed Utility charges will be increasing in 2023 by \$1 for water, sewer and gas to fund reserves for supporting future capital projects. With provincial and federal grants reducing the town must be proactive to set aside funding to maintain aging core infrastructure. The garbage fixed rate will also be increasing by \$1 to ensure garbage is self-sustainable without affecting taxation, the main reason for this is

the additional tipping fees incurred from Roseridge for the transfer station.

The water rate charged by the Capital Region Northeast Water Services Commission is reducing from \$1.7375 to \$1.6125 per cubic meter. The average residential user that uses 18 cubic meters of water monthly should see a decrease of approximately \$1.75/month.

Fortis Franchise Fee

Fortis Franchise Fee will be increasing from 8% to 10%, which is still one of the lowest rates in the region. This increase will continue to contribute towards the Pembina Place borrowing for the arena upgrades and for policing costs that the town is charged from the Province. Additionally, 1% of the increase is also to be set aside for future sewer infrastructure capital projects. Utilizing a revenue source from a franchise fee enables the town to diversify its revenue streams, and enabling collection from provincial facilities such as hospitals and schools who do not pay property taxes.

This has an estimated impact of approximately \$3.78/month on power bills. The increase will be effective April 1, 2023.

Meet the new CAO of the Town of Smoky Lake

After several months of working with an interim CAO while looking for a new candidate, the Town of Smoky Lake hired Dawn Phillips to fill this position. "I worked in municipal government my entire career and moved into management in my early twenties in Grande Cache, where I'm from. I started my management degree through Athabasca university. From there, I went to the city of Camrose. I was there for 14 years, community services has been my history. I started my governance courses over the next several years and moved on to the town of Taber. It's kind of neat to see how every community does things a little bit differently. From there, I wanted to diversify my portfolio, so I thought it would be interesting to work in a more rural community, in Athabasca. I had thought that down the road, maybe in five years, I'd be interested in the CAO role, but after six weeks there, the CAO left, and I was appointed interim CAO, and that position lasted for eleven months. I realized very quickly that

I loved the governance side of things, so when I moved back into my role of community services, I started looking around for a CAO role, and when this one opened up, I felt it would be a perfect match, also because my husband and I love small communities. I am very passionate about community services, recreation, events, culture and heritage in the community." Dawn's primary target is to settle in and learn everything about the community first. "One thing I learned in previous roles is how valuable the regional approach is. Working regionally with the county and communities like Vilna and Waskatenau is very valuable, and I'd like to promote that. The town developed a new strategic plan shortly before I came here, which I definitely want to prioritize. We are planning a follow-up session now that I'm in this role, so we'll be working with the organization that helped set it up. Working with council and staff, hoping to work closely with them and move in a positive direction. It's a great group of staff here at the town." Dawn and her husband have

already bought a house in town. Their children don't live far, in Fort Saskatchewan and Camrose, and so Smoky Lake is, in that respect, the perfect place to be. "Being part of the community is vital because then you know the residents' needs." When Dawn and her husband first drove to the community, they got a positive impression and said to each other: "This is a place where we could live. It's a sort of a regional hub; we have many assets here in this community." Dawn feels very welcome, and people have been very friendly and helpful.
