Métis Crossing has had many activities throughout 2022, the latest being the Christmas Party on December



Sturgeon County enhances competitiveness with launch of Major Investment Incentives Program

Sturgeon County approved municipal tax exemptions of up to two per cent for large-scale investments to enhance its domestic and global competitiveness.

The Major Investment Incentives Bylaw offers investors tax exemptions on eligible capital costs for new or expanded value-added agriculture and solar power production projects undertaken in the County.

Sturgeon County is committed to attracting large-scale, long-term investment that drives the local economy and creates jobs for our residents. We must position ourselves to attract businesses, and these incentives position the County as a premier investment destination in our target industries.

These incentives have the potential to attract investment in projects that will bring in millions in municipal tax revenue over their lifetimes. The municipal tax revenue from these projects will far exceed the incentive amounts.

To be eligible for tax incentives, value-added agricultural projects in Sturgeon County must have an investment of at least \$20 million. If projects meet eligibility criteria, they could access municipal tax exemptions of either 1.5 or two per cent of eligible capital costs.

Solar power production projects in Sturgeon County's portion of Alberta's Industrial Heartland must have an investment of at least \$200 million. If projects meet eligibility criteria, they could access municipal tax exemptions of one per cent of eligible capital costs.

The Major Investment Incentives Program is complementary to the County's existing energy value chain incentives, and incentives offered by the provincial and federal governments. Reviews are underway to consider additional sectors that may merit inclusion within the incentives

COLT WEATHER

If the outside temperature is <u>-32 degrees Celsius</u> or colder (including the wind chill factor), during extreme cold weather events, Smoky Lake County Landfills and Waste Transfer Sites will not be open. During this time the Public Works Department will not mobilize any Maintenance Equipment (except in emergency situations).

COLD WEATHER SAFETY TIPS



Dress in several layers of loose-fitting, lightweight clothing instead of a single heavy layer. Pack extra warm layers in your vehicle for all passengers.



Check your antifreeze, battery, windshield wipers, wiper fluid, and other vehicle equipment. Ensure your first aid kit and emergency kit are well stocked. Make sure you have plenty of fuel in the tank (at least 1/2 full), good winter tires, clean your lights and turn them on. Clear all snow from your vehicle before driving, drive to the road and weather conditions, buckle up and **please never drive impaired.**

KEEP YOUR ADDRESS SIGN VISIBLE



When precious minutes count, it's important that your sign is clearly visible for Emergency Services. Please ensure that your rural sign is not obstructed by grass, trees, snow piles or debris. etc.




SNOWPLOW REMINDERS

County Public Works asks residents who plow the snow in their driveway entrances to have the snow moved well into the RIGHT hand corner of their entrance ditch. This improves the ability of our grader operators, who are plowing County roads, to minimize the amount of snow left behind at driveway entrances. Please make sure your address sign remains clearly visible from the road and not obstructed by snow.



- When pushing snow across the road from an approach, please assure no ridges are left across the county roadway and the snow is pushed well into the ditch; no snow is to be left on the shoulder of the road.
- It is the County's objective to have its' roads in a condition where traffic is moving within 48 working hours following any winter weather event.
- Flags for Snow Removal Reminder: Tractor snow removal from driveways of residents who have purchased snow flags will occur (after a winter weather event of 6 inches of snow or more) after the snow removal at the villages is complete.
- The final deadline to purchase flags for snow removal is **December 15**th. Residents of the County may contract the County for snow clearing beyond private residential driveways at an hourly rate based on full cost recovery to the County using Alberta Road Builders Rates, subject to the availability of snow clearing equipment.



NATURAL GAS REBATE PROGRAM

Albertans are getting extra nelp with their natural gas utility bills this winter.

From October 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023, most Albertans with natural gas service will receive a rebate from the Government of Alberta if Alberta's natural gas price is above \$6.50 per Gigajoule (/GJ).

The rebate applies to any Alberta residence or Alberta company with a natural gas usage under 2,500 GJ per year – a typical Alberta house uses around 120 GJ of natural gas per year!

Your local natural gas utility will automatically place the rebate on your monthly bill if the rebate is in effect. You will see a line on your bill stating "GoA Utility Commodity Rebate Program."

The natural gas rebate will be triggered if the monthly natural gas rate charged by any of Alberta's regulated default supply providers is above \$6.50/GJ. All eligible customers will receive rebates, regardless of whether their local utility has a lower rate

The Federation of Alberta Gas Co-ops Ltd. and all 80 of our Member Natural Gas Utilities have worked with the Province to ensure Albertans get natural gas cost relief. The Natural Gas Rebate Program helps Albertans to continue to heat their homes with clean, efficient natural gas.

and every opportunity was taken to entertain the public outside as well: horse and wagon rides were offered, and wagons were always full. After the ride, which could be a bit on the chilly side, a person could warm up at the campfire. There was an opportunity for tobogganing, snowshoeing and skating.

The facility is worth a visit, with many Métis cultural artifacts on display, including handmade jackets, the Métis sash, jewellery and other ornaments. The in-house store has these artifacts on offer and is well worth a visit. Anyone looking to ski or snowshoe this winter, Métis Crossing is an excellent place to go, with five different trails, a walking-only plus

loop, on 688 acres of ancestral historic land with horses, buffalo and elk. Métis Crossing also offers gathering packages for holiday gatherings. This is a unique cultural hub that the region may be proud of. Métis Crossing is located on the Victoria Trail, off Highway 855 on the Saskatchewan North River. They also have a Facebook page with more information.

In accordance with the Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act, Metis Crossing Ltd. has applied for an approval to construct, operate and reclaim a waterworks system that serves the water users within the Metis Crossing located on southern half Section 09-058-17-W4M, Smoky Lake County. This waterworks system consists of a groundwater well, a water treatment plant, and a water distribution system. The water treatment processes include pre-disinfection/oxidation, green sand filtration and softening. The wastewater generated from the proposed water treatment process will be discharged to the Metis Crossing site sanitary sewer system. Until Metis Crossing has constructed a permanent site wastewater treatment facility, all sanitary sewer waste collected onsite will be trucked off-site for disposal at a wastewater disposal facility approved by Alberta Environment and Protected Areas or Alberta Energy Regulator.

A directly affected person may provide input into certain regulatory decisions, as allowed by the Environmental Protection and Enhancement Act (section 73). Specifically, any person who is directly affected by this application may submit a written statement of concern within 30 days of the date of this notice to:




The Christmas market in Smoky Lake is a popular event that attracts vendors and buyers from the wider region.


