Sturgeon County to present plans for Villeneuve **Airport area to EMRB**

Sturgeon County will seek support from the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board's (EMRB) 13 member municipalities on Dec. 8 for its plans for the Villeneuve Airport area.

The Villeneuve Airport is a key regional economic asset that attracts critical investment. By supporting this plan, municipal leaders are supporting new investment, creating more than 1,750 jobs and welcoming more than \$1.8 billion in economic benefits for the region by 2044.

The lands surrounding the Villeneuve Airport are prime for investment in many sectors, including aviation and aerospace, defence, research and testing, advanced manufacturing, renewable energy research, agri-innovation and logistics.

In this workshop, participants made their own cinch, carefully following the instructions from Kara McGonigle, owner of Three Mile Custom Mohair Cinches, and her assistant Kyla. Kara provided all materials, from buckles to mohair and D-rings. Participants chose their lengths and colours, and there were many colours to choose from; no two cinches were the same. To make your own cinch, you must carefully count threads and ensure you pay attention to what you are doing. Though it was tedious work, all participants enjoyed the workshop. "I have taught myself to make these cinches and now host six workshops a year for the last three years. I go all over Alberta, though not too far north; that is too far to travel. I've been invited everywhere, including in other provinces such as B.C., Saskatchewan, and even the U.S., but I stay in Alberta, " Kara explains. Kyla adds:" The

The Villeneuve Airport Area Area Structure Plan (VAA ASP) is a development framework, and its approval means new investors can confidently consider the region. Municipalities must refer new development plans to the EMRB - a requirement under the Municipal Government Act – so plans can be evaluated for consistency with the EM-RB's Regional Growth Plan. After reviewing Sturgeon County's

submission, EMRB administration recommended the Board reject the VAA ASP, citing inconsistency with its Regional Growth Plan. However, Sturgeon County and other stakeholders are confident that the VAA ASP does align with the Regional Growth Plan.

Our application is supported by comprehensive research and is consistent with the Regional Growth Plan and how it has been applied in the region. We are confident member municipalities will help the future take flight by supporting this plan to create jobs and drive regional economic growth and diversification. Mayor Hnatiw

If supported by the EMRB, the proposed bylaws to create the VAA ASP will go to Council for further consideration, amendments







Transfer Station ID required

Be prepared to show your county ID card when you visit the Thorhild Transfer Station during this busy holiday season. Transfer station attendants are required to ask to see the county ID cards of all transfer station users. This system will eliminate unlimited and unauthorized dumping of waste by non-residents, which will reduce costs, and save tax dollars. Thorhild County ID Cards are provided to landowners in January of each year. Dependents who are 16 years old or older, as well as any occupants of the home who are not the landowner, and tenants, are all eligible for additional ID cards.

The following materials can be collected at the transfer station: paint, metal, tires, wood, electronics, used oil, pesticides, batteries, furniture, and appliances.
