On October 30, beef members weighed and tagged their steers and heifers at VJV Auction Mart in Westlock. After they had finished weighing their animals, members judged coffee mugs, to practice their judging.

The Veterinary Science members attended a workshop at the Bar 42 Ranch on November 20. At this workshop, they observed a steer being cosmetically dehorned, saw the teeth of three horses being floated, and on top of that, got to see the ultrasound of a pregnant cow. All members have

been invited to Onoway Veterinary Clinic to job shadow for a day.

The horse members have met a few times and rode together. At these rides, members worked with their animals by participating in drills and fun activities. They had a great time doing a health day with Dr. Lawrence.

Small engines is going well. The older members have brought their own engines to work on, and parents are ordering parts to get these engines running. The younger members have been working on small engines as well.

Explorers have done cake decorating with Kyli Ford, and sewn a fleece toque taught by Carol Fox. They also went to LaRocque's honey farm, where they learned about an apiary and how to make beeswax candles. Thank you to Rene and Jolene LaRocque for a great day!

A public speaking workshop paired with a Christmas party was held on December 18. This was well attended and a lot of fun for the members. The next club meeting will be held on January 10 at 7p.m. at Busby Hall. It is shaping up to be another great 4-H year! Hope everyone had a great holiday season!

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Bethany was always a stay-at-home mom. Louis now works as a journeyman apprentice in his own business with a fully certified journeyman mechanic as an employee. “He is very mechanically inclined, has always repaired our own vehicles, and enjoys what he does. He enjoys tires, is a tire tech, and it’s going very well. We are

thrilled with the support from our community. The community is from Smoky Lake to Thorhild to Lamont,” Bethany explains. Louis does tires, maintenance, and oil changes, and the mechanic does all the repairs. “We do brakes and basic mechanical, and we don’t touch engines, those we send off to a specialty shop. But we’ll do drive shafts and the sorts as well”. Louis is the

mechanic, and Bethany works at the front and does all the invoicing. She will be the first person customers see as they access the business. Louis is passionate about tires. “Living on a country road, we have had our fair share of flats, and not having a local tire repair shop, we felt like we had to fill that void. As far as brands go, we have all the major brands to entry-level

tires,” Bethany adds. They have small farm equipment, vehicle and quad tires. Their daughter, Rebbekkah does detailing. “It has been very busy,” Bethany says, “we haven’t even started advertising; all clients came in by word-of-mouth. I wanted to figure out our invoicing and ordering systems before we got too busy, as there is a specialty software program for mechanical

shops, and that was a big learning curve. We have that under control now.” They can order parts in and have basic maintenance parts available in the shop. They are so busy that they may expand by adding garage doors in the back and another hoist. There is already one hoist installed in the shop. With the projected expansion, they also may hire another mechanic. Bethany

enjoys working in the shop. The couple also has a seed business, and they may set up a display in their shop in the spring. The seeds are all organic and are the standard hardy varieties that are grown in this climate. Some are produced, and some come from locally grown organic farms. They are open 9-5, Monday to Friday and located on 50th street in Waskatenau.

When Rachelle Amyotte started her job as FCSS coordinator in the spring of 2022, one of her goals was to establish a youth council. She connected with the regional schools and shared her ideas. Twelve youths came forward that wanted to participate, ten girls and two boys aged twelve to nineteen. In December, the youth council was doing a sleepover at Nekinan House in Smoky Lake. This event was not only fun but also a teambuilding moment where they shared their passion for the youth council, why they joined, and what they want to accomplish. Evelyn came forward with: "I joined youth council because I wanted a voice and to create activities for people to do because everything is boring," to which Isabella added: "It gives me something to do, and the town needs more activities for youth, and it looks good on a resume." Alexis felt like there was nothing to do for people

her age, "and I can help get stuff in town that my peers and myself would want to do. Then youth would want to be more involved, and it will be beneficial for youth and families. Currently, the most exciting thing I could do is go to the grocery store and buy a piece of bread." Another young lady mentioned that "the first time Rachelle came in and talked about it, I was interested as I love everything that has to do with teams. I love sports and think it was a great opportunity for people to give youth more say". These reasons tie into the values of this youth council: fun, teamwork and community while maintaining the Golden Rules to respect each other, listen to each other, be responsible, work together and have fun. The current youth council members come from different schools in the region, which means it is a regional council aiming to have activities in the area. There are solid plans for events like the winter

and summer Olympics. "I think it's going to happen this summer," one of the girls adds. Other ideas are a skating competition or building a snowman, and then the summer is more for activities such as scavenger hunts or sandcastle making and balloon fights. The plan was to have a Valentine's dance, but that doesn't fit the regional agenda; Rachelle comments: "There is a Ukrainian gala on

February 18, and on the 11th, there is an archery tournament, so we are slowly running out of weekends in February. So maybe we'll do an 80s theme dance, not around Valentine's but in March. If we host a community dance, we could probably do one every two months, but we need to test the interest". This council, with a chair, two vice chairs, a secretary and a treasurer, is fired up to organize that and more.

There are solid plans for fundraising events like a draw at a dance or a dessert auction. As not all members are in the same school, there is plenty of opportunity to connect with other kids and get them interested. And Smoky Lake County would like to get involved as well. The next goal is to establish a youth centre so youth have a go-to place in the region, a place "by youth for youth." This Nekinan

sleepover weekend is all about having fun together and, quite likely, not getting much sleep. A karaoke event is planned for this evening, as well as America's Got Talent, ban-nock and pizza making, and a white elephant gift exchange. Nekinan House is more than happy to host these enthusiastic young people. Smoky Lake Youth Council has a Facebook page and is on Instagram and Tik Tok.

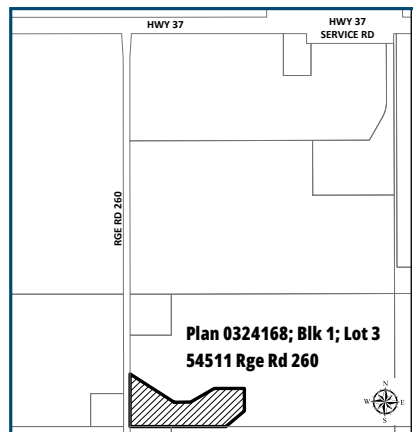

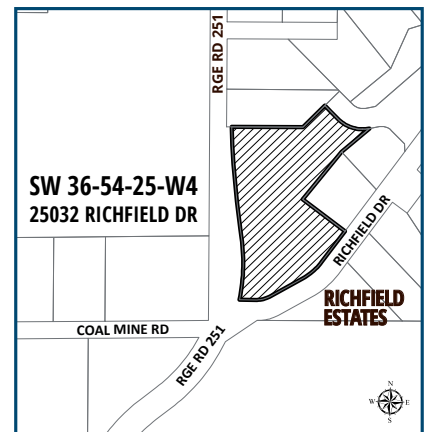

The LUB is one of the most important land use planning documents for a municipality and guides day-to-day planning and development activities.

The last major update of the LUB was in 2009. Town Council and Administration now want to update the LUB to create a clear and concise document that reflects current community needs and provides Council, Administration, developers, builders, and the public with continued confidence in the development process.

An online community survey will be available from January 10-25, 2023, to gather feedback from stakeholders and the public. Feedback from stakeholders and the public, as well as Council and Administration, will be used to draft updates to the LUB.

The male suspects stole firearms and laptops, computer games and multiple cell phones from the house. The involved

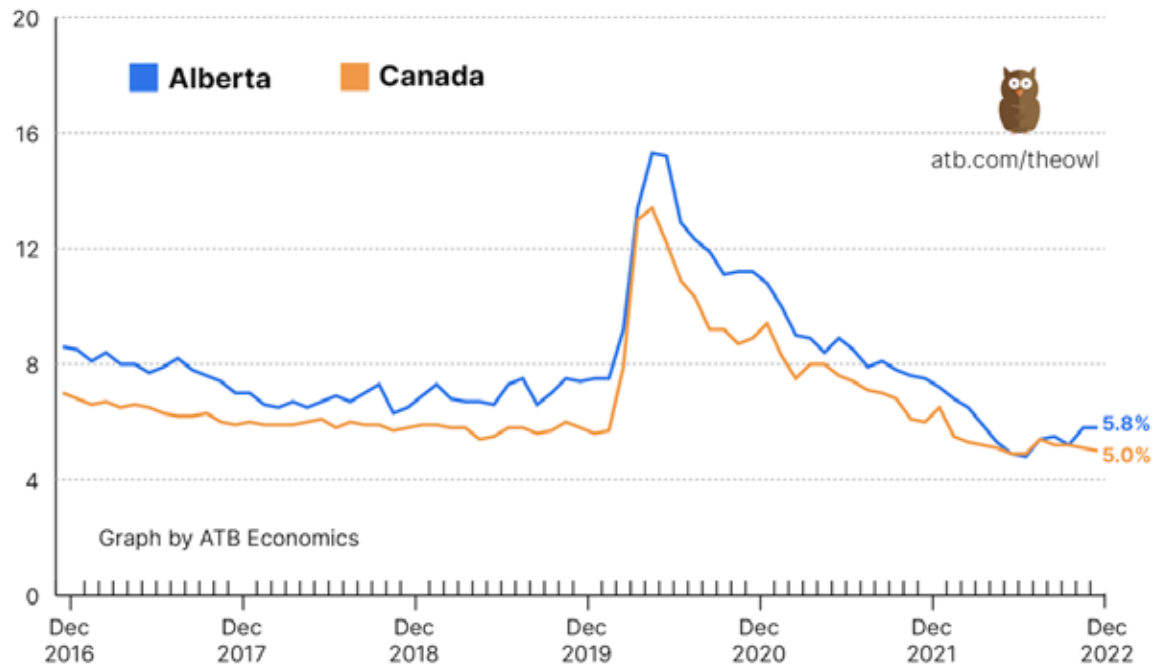
vehicle is a 2000-2002 Subaru Forester, silver in color, which had a loud muffler.

The Alberta economy added almost 25,000 jobs in December (+1.0%) according to the latest report from Statistics Canada.

Gains in full-time

employment(+41,200) offset losses in part-time work (-16,700).

Despite the growth in employment, increased participation in the labour market kept the provincial unemployment rate steady at 5.8%.

Nationally, 104,000 jobs were added (+0.5%) in December with job numbers up at least slightly in every province except New Brunswick.

Somewhat weaker growth in participation enabled the

national unemployment rate to tick down from 5.1% to 5.0%.

The ongoing tightness of the national labour market bolsters the case for the Bank of Canada to continue to raise interest rates.

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Suspicious text, email or call from the CRA? It's probably a scam



(NC) We've all gotten texts, emails and calls claiming to be from the Canada Revenue Agency. Some of us may even feel like we hear from scammers more than our loved ones.

But there's no love here. Fraudsters trick people into providing personal and financial information. Their scams are getting more believable, which means more people are at risk

of losing their money.

It's important to know how to spot a scam so you can protect yourself. Scammers may:

- Demand your personal information claiming they'll send you a refund;
- insist you take action right away with little explanation;
- scare you into paying a fake debt;
- threaten arrest or deportation;

- request unusual forms of payment such as gift cards, pre-paid credit cards or cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin;
- ask for numbers for your credit card, bank account or passport;
- urge you to visit a fake website to verify your identity; or,
- ask you to click on a link to fill in an online form.

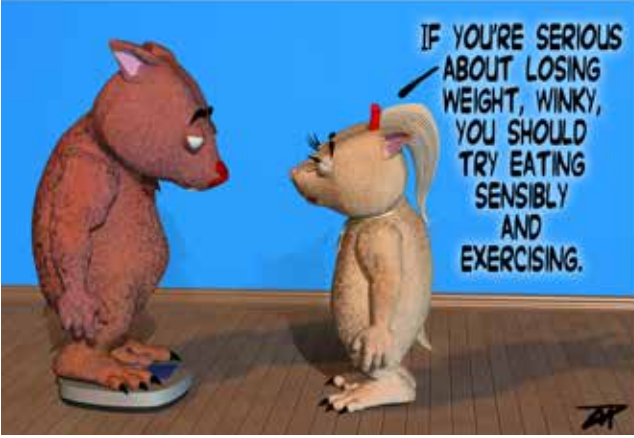


