Jacob Fox speaks about mental health at Smoky Lake Chamber AGM

Since the pandemic, concerns about mental health have grown worldwide. With that in mind, the Smoky Lake Chamber of Commerce invited Jacob Fox, a professional counsellor from Innisfail, to speak about mental health at their recent AGM in the Smoky Lake Complex on January 23. Jacob started his presentation with a handout about

the Life Change Index scale. "As I am talking, you can take a look at these. This Life Change Index scale was created in 1967 by Holmes and Rahe. It's a bit outdated, but the value of magnitude and impact these life changes may have on your potential to be stricken with an illness is still valid today. When stress takes hold, the amygdala will kick in,

will take over the riding program as Dawn-Marie moves to the next stage in her life, though Dawn-Marie will never give up riding horses unless she has to. With a love of sewing, she combined the two passions into a small home-based business to keep her busy during the long winter nights. “This was supposed to be just a hobby, but it suddenly took off on me. I love sewing. My old sewing machine broke down two years ago, and I bought a completely computerized one. This one remembers patterns, and now I’m making tail and mane bags”, Dawn-Marie says, “Apparently, people want the set of the same fabric pattern, as Shelby tells me. The tail bag is used as follows: braid the tail, put the braid in it, pull it up, then braid the ties into the tail. Most people use them in the winter-time so the tail doesn’t ice up, or horses don’t step on it if the tail is long, and to keep it nice. Many people also like to use the mane

bags when travelling between shows, so the mane stays cleaner and doesn’t tangle up. I already have a few orders of matching sets”. Predominantly barrel racers and some dressage riders use them. Dawn-Marie’s ferrier is more into penning and ordered several of them. “This is where I have ordered less girly patterns, like cowboy hats and horseshoes. I’m getting swamped.” Shelby does all the online advertising, manages the Facebook page and was the driving force behind Dawn-Marie starting the business. She uses a special 4-way stretch lycra fabric for her products. “The only place I can get my material is from the States because it’s the only company with 100% lycra with a four-way stretch and durability. Many lycra products are 82% nylon and 18% lycra, and two-way stretch. You can get any print you want”. She already has many orders, and besides the tail and mane bags, she was asked to do slinkies. Slinkies are a neck-shaped cover that goes

over the horse’s head and under the blanket to prevent the blanket from rubbing the hair out, which quickly happens at the shoulders. “I’ll need a pattern, but I’ll probably make one based on

Shelby’s horse,” she adds. “I also just bought an embroidery machine for someone who wants their product embroidered. And down the road, I may start making fly masks”. In addition, just this week,

she started making mini-horse tail bags. Not only individuals are ordering the mane and tail bags, but clubs as well, for prizes. “I managed to get quite a few made, and the last few days, I shipped them

out. They are light, easy and cheap to ship. The three that went to Saskatchewan cost me \$3.00 in shipping”. Itch To Stitch has a responsive Facebook page with photos of a variety of their products.

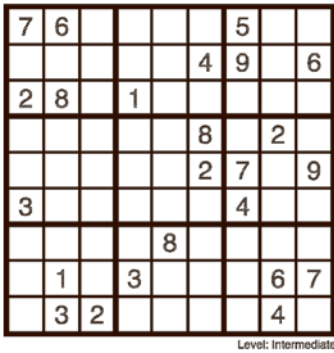

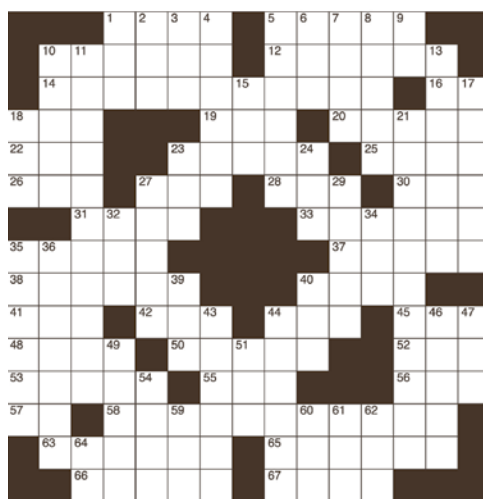

and there will be a fight, flight, freeze, and fawn response. It happens automatically; your body is trying to keep you safe and alive." Jacob then explains the different types of stress and what they do to our bodies. Responding to a comment from the public about the use of electronic devices by elderly people, Jacob says: "They are publicized as 'the only way to connect.' The result is that if we cannot work these devices properly - a response from our brain kicks in that is similar to rejection by a lover or a friend, causing stress. That is why self-care is so important." With the focus on self-care, Jacob goes into dealing with

grief and loss. He visualizes for the public how grief and loss can impact our system and how it is not helpful if we don't deal with it and try to eliminate the adverse effects. Over time, we need to embrace them as a part of us which will result in a 'new me.' If we use resources that are meaningful to us, we help ourselves. Then we become resilient. A support system and social connections are also key in self-care and improving mental health. "Mental illness is only as potent as its ability to disconnect the sufferer from other people," Jacob illustrates. "If you can look beyond today at the future, you will take time to get there and learn and build different strengths."

Following the presentation, attendants share experiences with stress. In this respect, especially the experiences that Ukrainian refugees in the community have dealt with are highlighted as stressful. Besides this presentation, the regular AGM agenda items were discussed, including the election of officers. All officers were reelected, which means another year for chairman Noel Simpson and his crew. The calendar for 2023 shows six community events that the Chamber looks forward to organizing. Coming up short: Wage growth outpaced by inflation in November

By ATB Financial Team

New survey results from Statistics Canada show that seasonally-adjusted average weekly earnings (including overtime) across all sectors in Alberta were 3.8% higher in November 2022 than the same month in 2021.

Consumer prices, however, rose by 6.6% in Alberta over this period (unadjusted).

Nationally, wages increased by 4.2% on a year-over-year basis while inflation was running at 6.8%.

Average earnings were up in every province in November compared to 12 months earlier. Newfoundland and Labrador posted the largest increase at +6.5% while Saskatchewan

posted the smallest at +3.7%.

Alberta continues to have the highest average weekly earnings of any province.

When the numbers are broken down by industry, average

earnings in Alberta were up the most on a year-over-year basis in the real estate and rental and leasing sector at +13.8% followed by the oil and gas sector at +11.8%.

The arts,

entertainment and recreation sector was at the other end of the spectrum at -8.9% followed by the administrative and support, waste management and remediation services sector at -2.8%.

Redwater RCMP Report

During the month of November, Redwater RCMP received a total of 260 calls for service, which included:

- Break and enters (x16)

On November 6, 2022, at approximately 2:30 p.m., Redwater RCMP received a complaint of a theft of wallet from a vehicle. The officer attended and spoke with the victim who indicated that they had parked their vehicle and entered a local business. Upon leaving the business, the victim noticed that an unknown person had entered their vehicle and stole their wallet. The officer was able to review the business's surveillance video where they observed a blonde female (approx. 40 years old), in a red puffy jacket and glasses, approach the vehicle and remove the wallet from the vehicle, before departing and entering a room at the Red Rest Motel. The female suspect was known to the officer who then attended the suspect's room at the motel, however, she was no longer there. A short time later the officer was able to locate and arrest

the female in relation to the theft. The female attempted to provide the officer with the name of her son, but eventually provided her actual name and admitted that she had thrown the wallet away shortly after the theft. The female was released on an Undertaking to appear in Fort Saskatchewan court on January 26 2023, at 9:30 a.m.

On November 14, 2022, at approximately 2:00 p.m., Redwater RCMP received a complaint of a break and enter to a commercial work site. The company representative provided surveillance video that showed a male suspect had entered the worksite during the night and stole 2 generators, 2 batteries, and a jerry can of fuel, before departing in a truck. Using the images from the surveillance video, the officer was able to identify the suspect from the break and enter and a warrant for his arrest was applied for and granted. On January 5, 2023, the male suspect, Patrick Evan Wesley Hurley (43), a resident of Chipman, was arrested by the Elk Point RCMP for break, enter and commit theft and is set to next appear in Fort Saskatchewan Court on January 19 2023, at 9:30 a.m.


