PUBLIC HEARING –BYLAWS 1607/22 & 1608/22

Amendments to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

In accordance with section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on proposed Bylaws 1607/22 and 1608/22.

Bylaw 1607/22 proposes to:

- a) Amend the existing Resource Extraction land use district by:
- adding transportation performance standards to the district;
 - adding Groundwater management requirements & management plans to district;
 - adding community consultation and communication requirements to district and
 - removing the allowance to reduce the prescribed setbacks if agreed to in writing by area residents.
- b) Add a new Resource Extraction Direct Control District to the Land Use Bylaw that allows for:
- exact setbacks of this new district to be determined on a case-by-case basis at the redistricting stage;
 - built-in flexibility where the regulations can be adapted to the land (and its characteristics) that the zoning will be applied to;
 - a process that allows for public input at the public hearing stage and confirmation of relevant regulations by Council prior to 3rd reading of the relevant bylaw, and
 - a full range of enhanced performance standards applied on a case-by-case basis as Council deems appropriate.

Bylaw 1608/22 provides for the repeal of the Calahoo-Villeneuve Sand and Gravel Extraction Area Structure Plan Bylaw 922/01.

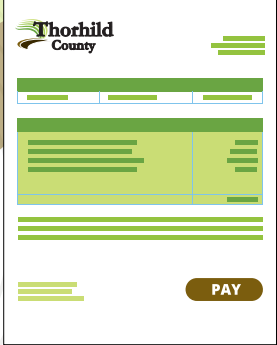

PLEASE REVIEW YOUR UTILITY BILLS



Thorhild County makes every effort to ensure utility bills are accurate before sending them to customers. However, sometimes mistakes happen. For example, problems with meters, meter readings, or rate calculation errors could result in inaccurate utility bills upon processing.

NATURAL GAS CARBON TAX INCREASE

The Alberta Carbon Tax is a federal program applied to any fuel that emits greenhouse gases, including transportation and heating fuels like diesel, gasoline, natural gas, and propane.

The carbon tax came into effect in 2020 and increases annually. In 2021, the Federal government announced an increase to the carbon tax annually at a rate of \$15 per tonne from 2023-2030. This translates to a carbon tax increase applied to natural gas from \$2.63 per gigajoule (GJ) to \$3.42 per gigajoule effective April 2023.

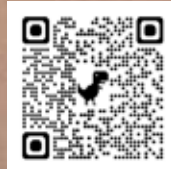

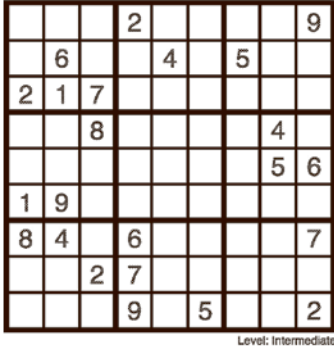
Many ag retailers are already accepting empty containers for recycling, however, before returning them to your local retailer (where you purchased them), please call to see if they have begun taking them.

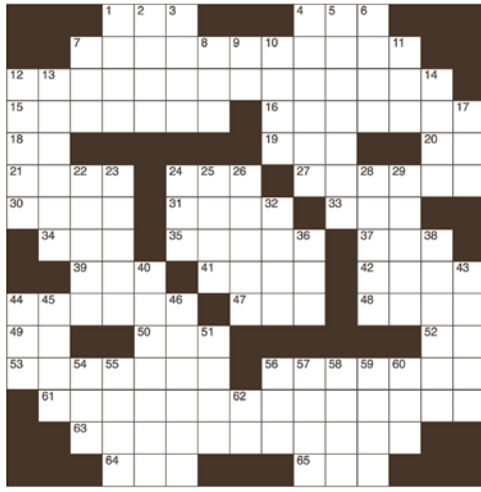

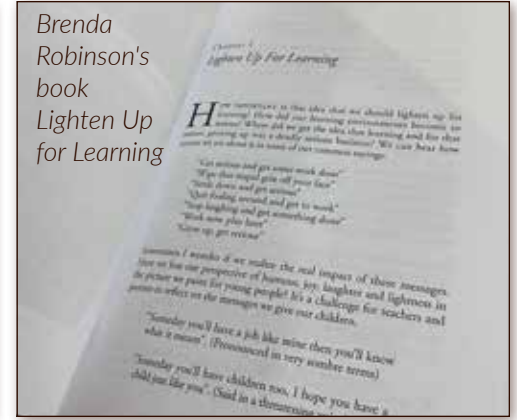

Brenda Robinson was welcomed as a guest speaker and facilitator for the recent "Laughter in Your Family" workshop. On February 23, residents of Thorhild County and surrounding areas braved the cold and showed up at the Thorhild Drop-In Center for an informative evening of, well, positivity and fun. As part of the Robcan group, she has traveled extensively to present at a variety of events.

Her message was simple. Fun begins with a positive attitude, which is meant to be shared with other people. When we stimulate laughter, it has a ripple effect on our lives and those around us. Robinson spoke of life becoming fast-paced, too busy, and overly serious. She also talked about the negative effects that Covid had on us as individuals and communities. The heaviness of this life can be overwhelming and "deadly serious." She then went on to compare the brain to a chain-link fence. When we are down and finding little joy in our lives, our brain closes up and the spaces between those links get tighter and smaller, restricting us and our thoughts. With happiness, that fence spreads wide open. Robinson continued that even our memories are enhanced by enjoyment, so by bringing more happiness into our lives, we should have

more meaningful memories to recount.

When considering her authority on fun and joy, it should be noted that she not only received her Bachelor of Arts at Brandon University, but also received her Masters of Education at Simon Fraser University. During that time, she wrote her thesis on laughter in classrooms. Robinson spoke highly about laughter being first in schools, as laughter helps to grasp and retain knowledge. She later turned her thesis into a book titled Lighten Up For Learning, "because no one wants to read a thesis." Robinson stated. As a natural storyteller, that is how she passes on her messages and information. She uses scientific research paired with lived experiences. The messages of fun and laughter are easy to accept because she radiates the certainty of what she is explaining.

As she considered her childhood, she admitted that what she teaches now has always been a built-in philosophy. Robinson remembers her father farming and his own words expressing that he didn't understand why his fellow farming neighbours were always complaining. He said if they don't like what they are doing, they should be doing something else. She said it has always been like that for her. "I don't think laughter and humour are about jokes and comedy,"

she spoke seriously, "they are about people and how they come together to get better results." She continued to explain that when we come together with joy, happiness, and fun, we will find we want to do it more. We don't join clubs and groups just because it's something to do; we search out ones that make us happy and fill our lives with something more. A quilting club isn't just a quilting club. It is a circle of friends that laugh and joke and share stories over coffee.

Brenda Robinson approaches life with this exact attitude. She wants people to leave her presentations and workshops feeling lighter- like things can be fun again and they can contribute to the world with this philosophy in mind. Whether you are engaging in work, family, school, or volunteering, you need to find what makes it all worth doing. Sometimes things may not be going the way we want them to, but "don't be afraid to go out and find it." We don't always know what we need until we come across it. One couldn't help but smile when Robinson looked up and said, "It's not complicated at all." For more information on the Robcan Group, visit www.robcan.ca. 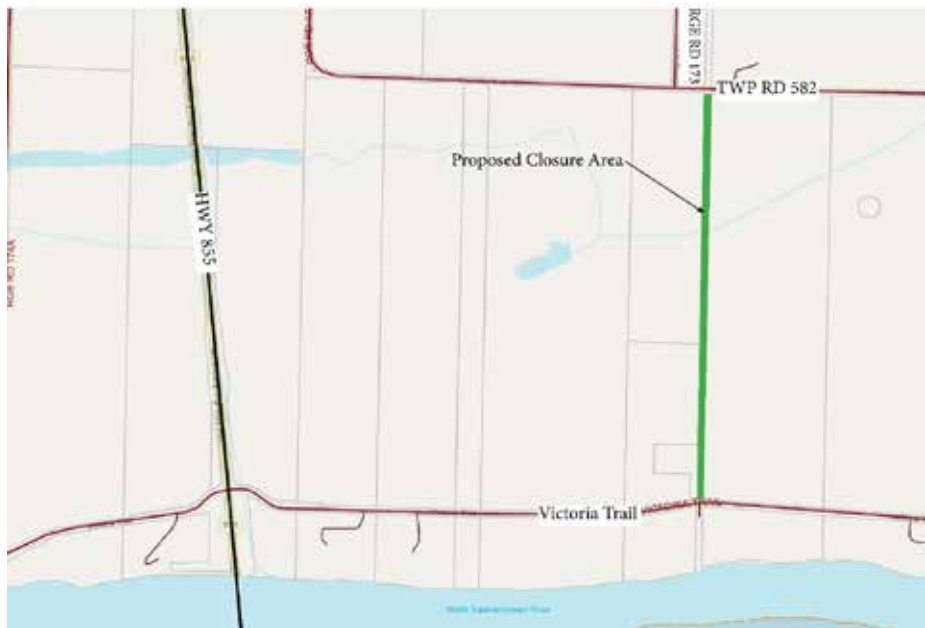

Town of Redwater, received the news in late January that Redwater was successful in securing funding.

Out of 867 applications, the CPRA awarded 351 organizations with funding support, with Redwater being approved for \$20,000 in funding.

“The application was a collaboration between three organizations,” shared Edworthy, “but other sports groups in Redwater are encouraged to join with this initiative and benefit from the grant money.”

In a letter of support that accompanied the Town’s application for the program, Derek Dachyshyn, Vice President of the Redwater Curling Club, stated, “the Town of Redwater multiplex is the hub of the community and has the capability to unite the community sports groups under this common purpose and connect them to residents in the community.”

The CPRA funding competition was made possible through the Government of Canada’s Community Sport for All Initiative.

“This funding will empower the 351 funded organizations from across Canada to support grassroots programming that will remove barriers and increase participation rates in recreational sport for underrepresented groups,” said Martin Sampson, CPRA CEO.

Community sports groups are encouraged to reach out to Edworthy to benefit from the funding provided.

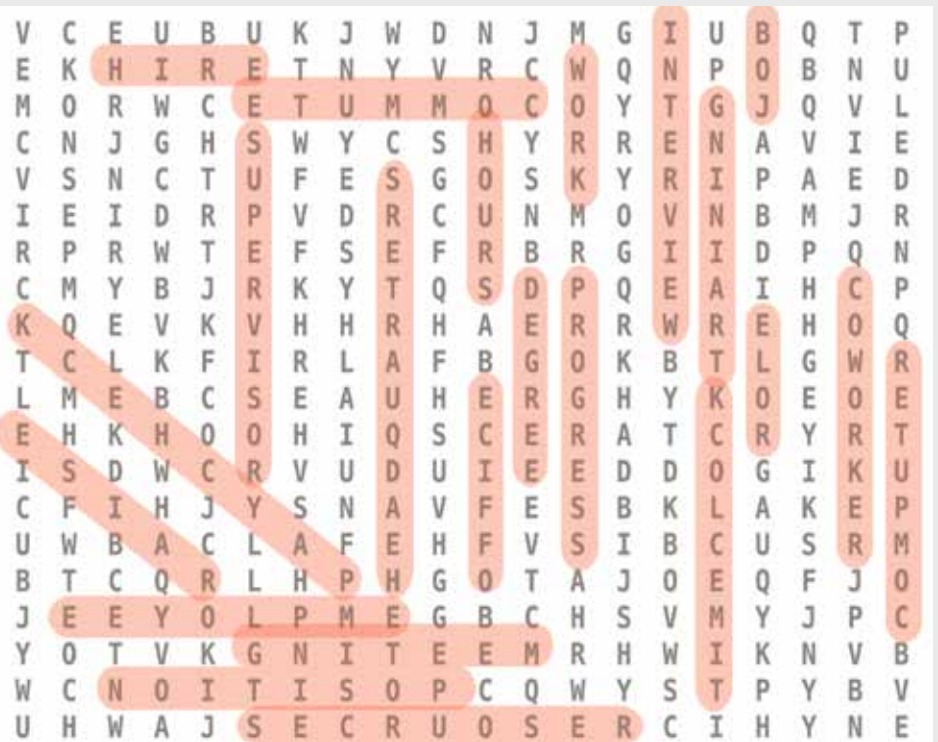

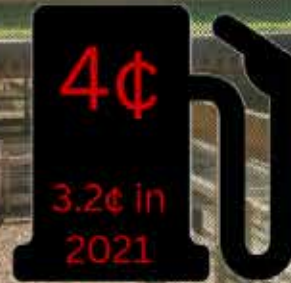
