#### Superintendent resignation

**Board Highlights** 

The Board of Trustees of Aspen View Public Schools officially accepted the resignation of Superintendent Neil O'Shea, who announced his retirement effective at the end of the current school year. O'Shea joined Aspen View Public Schools as Associate/ Deputy Superintendent in 2014, and became Superintendent in 2018.

"To say that I was fortunate to finish my career with Aspen View over the last nine years would be an understatement," O'Shea commented. "These years have been precious as I have grown personally and professionally in my time here. I am leaving with a heart full of gratitude and a head full of wonderful memories.

"I have been honoured throughout my tenure to work with supportive and dedicated trustees, administrators and educators who will continue to ensure a bright future for Aspen View and all its students and families."

"Neil has provided exemplary leadership to Aspen View throughout his time with us," Board of Trustees Chair Candyce Nikipelo said. "His ability to build relationships with students,

parents, staff and communities has brought our division closer. We thank him for all his contributions, and wish him health and happiness in retirement."

#### Provincial budget update

S u p e r i n t e n d e n t O'Shea provided a brief overview of the February 28, 2023 provincial budget announcement. Trustees commented that the budget appears to contain good news for education and for Aspen View, but they are eager to learn details with the release of the funding manual, expected soon.

#### <u>Three-year Capital</u> <u>Plan</u>

The Board of Trustees unanimously approved Aspen View Public Schools' Three-Year Capital Plan for submission to the provincial government.

Aspen View Public Schools' capital priorities are, in order:

- Landing Trail Intermediate School modernization: Estimated total cost of approximately \$23.9 million.
- Smith School modernization: Estimated total cost of approximately \$10.8 million.



Rochester School modernization: Estimated total cost of approximately \$9.5 million.

Trustees expressed concern that the most recent facility audits for each of these projects are all more than 10 years old. Administration will contact the provincial government regarding the process to have these facilities reevaluated.

#### **Other highlights**

- · Superintendent O'Shea provided an update that Aspen View is currently scheduled to take possession of the new H.A. Kostash School in Smoky Lake on April 28, 2023.
- The Board of Trustees voted unanimously to amend the 2022-23 school year for H.A. Kostash School, moving the last day of school to Tuesday, June 27, 2023 in order to facilitate the move to the new school building.
- Superintendent O'Shea presented a draft Board Work Plan for the 2023-24 school year. As currently presented, there are 12 regular board meetings scheduled over the course of the school year.

The Board of Trustees voted unanimously to proceed with an internal board evaluation for 2022-23.

# **Thorhild Library AGM**

"Covid is done and it's great to be getting back to normal." One of the members of the Friends of Thorhild Library Society commented. On March 15, Thorhild Library held its AGM and general meeting. This year marks the 30th anniversary of Friends of Thorhild Library Society, and next year marks the 40th anniversary of the Thorhild Library. Members of both groups are very excited to be able to host a variety of events and programs in the upcoming year. All members in attendance the meeting exat pressed a need for extra hands for these plans and encouraged people looking for a low-commitment volunteer opportunity to stop by the library and inquire about becoming a member.

Kathy Passay, librarian of Thorhild Library, looks forward to a year when so many activities can be resumed. She is working with Thorhild Family Resource Coordinator on educational programming such as the monthly event, Coffee Talk. She also expressed the demand in the community for adult learning. A large portion of her time goes to assisting individuals with technical needs like computer/ tablet/phone use, printing, job applications and resumes. Kathy also created a monthly mobile library that visits the Thorhild Senior's Home. She packs up large print books, many with themes requested by residents, as well as movie and TV series DVDs and takes them

directly to the residents to ensure they have access to library services even when it is not convenient for them to get to the library itself.

Kathy shared a value statement from the Northern Lights Library System that showed that in 2021 the libraries belonging to Thorhild County had a circulation value of 529.6K. "People are using the libraries!" stated one Friends member in attendance. "You can see the growth." Libraries in general are a huge savings to their patrons. In 2021, the average book cost to buyers was about \$16-\$23. If you are an avid reader, the cost savings from using your local library are phenomenal.

When asked about the future of the upcoming year, Kathy expressed a desire to involve the seniors and children of the community more. She has an image of mixing the generations,

however, that looks is yet to be determined but something she looks forward to. Kathy stated her concern at the thought that most seniors have been either cooped up or isolated after these past long years and hopes to play a part in changing that. There is also talk of keeping old favorite events, like the plant exchange bringing fundraiser, back programs that were once enjoyed but haven't been run in several years and creating new events. Once a summer student is available to her, she is excited to create even more programs that bring back the kids' stuff. Reading programs have been done at home, craft days have been postponed or featured as take-home kits, and there is excitement that Thorhild Library can open its doors wide once again to invite a little bit of chaos and fun between its quiet walls.





# Neon Dance in Smoky Lake

During a youth council event in December, some young people mentioned that "there is nothing to do for us in Smoky Lake." That was their reason to join the youth council, create activities for youth, and maybe even set up a youth centre. On March 10, they held their first event: young people from grades 7-12, guided by the Smoky Lake Youth Council, organized a dance. This dance was initially planned for February with Valentine's Day as the theme, but other events were scheduled in Smoky Lake, so they decided to postpone it. This dance was called the Neon Dance, full of glow sticks, glowing balls, a real disco ball and many other "glowin-the-dark" artifacts, from 8:00 until midnight. The youth set up

the dance with Rachelle Amyotte, FCSS Coordinator, who took the initiative for a youth council. The youth, however, decided what went where and how to set up the seniors' centre for the dance. The seniors' drop-in centre has a wooden dance floor, a stage, a concession and an inviting atmosphere, making it the perfect location for a dance. There was a concession with snacks and non-alcoholic beverages. Most youths from across the region, not just Smoky Lake, came in just after 8:00 and were dropped off at the door. "Parents dropped their kids off outside; they did not want to come in. That tells me parents are comfortable having their kids here", Rachelle comments. One of the security guards adds, " These young people are behaving themselves

so well and are having a great time together; it is fun to see." DJ Elle Rose from St. Paul took care of the music. "I'm taking requests!" she announces. She played a wide array of music, from contemporary to songs from the seventies (the chicken dance is still popular after 40 years!) and anything in between. She also organized games to keep everyone engaged, like "musical chairs," but then with a hula hoop: a hula hoop was passed down, and each participant had to crawl through it. Whoever had it when the music stopped was out, and there was a prize for the winner. The dance was also an opportunity for fundraising, with a draw for Betsybucks. "We plan to do more activities together, like dances and other youth activities," one of the girls says.







# **Fort Air Partnership** 2022 annual air quality monitoring results



#### News Release

Air Partnership Fort (FAP), the organization that monitors the air local residents breathe, released 2022 Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) results today. The Government of Alberta calculates the AQHI using data collected at seven of FAP's air monitoring stations.

#### 2022 air monitoring results

The number of hours of air monitoring in 2022 was 55,611 hours. Of these hours, 94.9% were low-risk AQHI, and 4.8% were moderate-risk AQHI.

Just over 0.2% of the hours monitored were high or very high-risk AQHI. Wildfire smoke most frequently contributed to highrisk and very high-risk Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) ratings measured

at Fort Air Partnership's monitoring stations in 2022. Meteorological conditions and temperature inversions were the second largest contributor to high or very high-risk AQHI.

#### Low-risk AQHI relatively static over the past five years

As illustrated in the chart below, low-risk AQHI ratings in the FAP Airshed remain relatively static since 2019. The uptick in high and very-high-risk AQHI in 2021 was mainly due to wildfire smoke. (chart attached also)



Town of Smoky Lake + Smoky Lake County IDP Map 5.1 - Future Land Use Concept

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

#### **Redwater RCMP officer injured** during call for service in Thorhild

Thorhild, Alta- On Feb. 7, 2023, at 4:01 p.m., Redwater RCMP responded to a call for service at a residence in Thorhild. During the call, an officer was attacked with a knife and received serious, non-life-threatening injuries. Cindy Chelsberg, a 48-yearold female resident of the home, was taken into custody.

Officers from RCMP's Eastern Alberta District and Northern General Investigative Sections have taken over the investigation.

- Chelsberg has been charged with:
- Attempted murder
- · Aggravated Assault of a Peace Officer
- Aggravated Assault
- Obstruction
- Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose

Chelsberg has been taken before a Justice of the Peace and remanded in custody. Her next court appearance set for March 16, 2023, at Fort Saskatchewan Provincial Court.

As this matter is now before the court, no updates will be provided.

On February 5, 2023 at 12:07 a.m., Redwater RCMP received a call from a concerned neighbour who was witnessing a suspect attempting to steal her neighbour's vehicle in Thorhild. Officers arrived at the location a short time later to find the suspect behind the driver's seat of the vehicle. The suspect was ordered out of the vehicle and placed under arrest. A search incidental to arrest of the suspect found that he was in possession of a retractable baton, several key rings with automobile keys, a bag of break-in tools, a wallet and a garage door opener. Further investigation revealed that the wallet and garage door opener had been stolen previously from another location and that the suspect was currently released on conditions to not possess weapons and to keep the peace and be of good behavior. The suspect was transported to the Redwater detachment for a judicial interim release hearing (a bail hearing) where he was released on a no-cash release order.

As a result of his actions, Bradley Ingebrigtsen (23), a resident of Lac La Biche County, Alberta, has been charged with the following:

- Possession of Break-in Instruments
- Breaking and Entering with Intent
- Possession of Property Obtained
- by Crime Under \$5000
- Unauthorized Possession of a Prohibited Weapon
- Fail to Comply with Release Order Condition (x2)
- Mischief Under \$5000

Bradley Ingebrigtsen is due next in Fort Saskatchewan Provincial Court on March 16, 2023 at 9:30 a.m.

# February 28 Sturgeon County Council Meeting highlights

Here are the highlights from the Feb 28, 2023, Sturgeon County Council Meeting.

#### **Public Hearings**

Council held public hearings on two separate land use matters:

- Bylaw 1610/23 Sturgeon Valley Core Infill Policy proposes to update the Sturgeon Valley Core Area Structure Plan (ASP) to clarify subdivision and infill densities. This ensures existing servicing infrastructure can support future development in the Sturgeon Valley Core and that development aligns with the original vision for the community. Council will consider public input and will make a decision at a future Council meeting.
- Bylaw 1613/23 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw proposes to update the subdivision requirements for the Country Estate Residential district. This limits the subdivision of existing

lots in the Valley Core · Council gave first so future subdivision aligns with planned infill densities and can be supported with existing servicing infrastructure. This change would impact other parcels districted as County Estate Residential, including in the Casa Vista and Northern Lights areas. Council will consider public input and will make a decision at a future Council meeting.

#### Proposed Land Use **Bylaw Amendments**

 Council gave a second and third reading of Bylaw 1605/22. This bylaw is in response to an applicant's request to redistrict a 5.13 acre parcel between Richfield Estates and Green Acres from Agriculture to Country Residential; this parcel is not viable for agricultural production. The bylaw received first reading in December and was subject to a public hearing in January.

reading of Bylaw 1616-23 - Civic Addressing Bylaw, which would replace the existing addressing bylaw approved in 1997. It proposes a new urban-style addressing system in the Sturgeon Valley South area, while maintaining the rural addressing system in other areas, including in the Sturgeon Valley Core. This bylaw also proposes guidelines for displaying addresses, which helps emergency services navigate to emergency calls. Council will consider further readings of the bylaw at the Council meeting on March 14. In addition to giving first reading to Bylaw 1616-23 - Civic Addressing Bylaw, Council also directed Administration to draft a naming policy/strategy to guide the naming of neighbourhoods, roads, municipal assets and other infrastructure.


