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Town of Redwater's 2023 budget & tax bylaw approved

The focus of the 2023 budget deliberations was to target the new goals set out in the Strategic Plan update and to ensure that the priority focus areas were at the forefront of every decision made.

The Town of Redwater Administration presented the 2023 Operating and Capital Budget amendments at the council meeting on May 2, 2023. Council approved the amendments along with the 2023 Tax Bylaw.

With the effects of hyperinflation on goods and services, initially a budget increase

of 6.85% was considered by Council, however, Council chose to use the tax mitigation reserve to lower that to 4.53%. This was possible through maintaining the strategic use of other reserve funds to meet our operational and capital needs, thereby reducing the impact on the taxpayer for 2023.

For the average Redwater home (assessed at \$208,500), 2023 taxes will be \$2,073 annually or \$173 monthly. The budget increase equates to \$100 annually or \$8 monthly for the average Redwater home.

This increase not only allows the town to have sufficient operating revenue to pay for existing town services and asset maintenance,

but it also allows Redwater to plan for growth and improvements that will benefit Redwater residents and businesses.

Mayor McRae acknowledges the difficulties experienced developing this year's budget and points out its successes, stating:

"I would like to thank both administration and council for their hard work in bringing forward a budget that balances the need for future planning as well as understanding the significant pressure that residents and businesses are feeling in this era of inflation. Inflation is real for everyone as individuals, and it is also real for us as a town as we work hard to meet the demands of service delivery. We will continue to look for ways to

reduce the strain of tax increases on individuals and businesses while continuing to provide the services expected and required for a healthy, sustainable community."

The 2023 Operating and Capital Budget includes protecting residents, providing safe transportation through road and sidewalk maintenance, and promoting health and wellness through Pembina Place and other recreational amenities. Removing snow, cutting grass, and maintaining green spaces adds to community beauty. Other initiatives will support and grow the community economics. A big step for Smoky Lake tourism development

Smoky Lake County, the Town of Smoky Lake and Métis Crossing took an immense step forward with the development of tourism in the region on May 19. On that day, the Smoky Lake Tourism Company was officially formed by signing an agreement between the three entities. In her welcome speech, Juanita Marois, CEO of Métis Crossing Ventures Ltd., phrased this as follows: "We are gathered here because we can do better together than each of us could have done on their own. It is essential that private and public entities are coming together". Several parties involved in forming the Smoky Lake Tourism Company addressed the guests from their perspective. Tony Sefton is CEO of Vision XS, a UK-based company specializing in attracting visitors to regions of interest. Vision XS uses a "5 Model" encompassing Vision's Predictive Business Model, surrounded by a Space Model, Cost Model, Market Model and Experience Model. They aim to help visitor attraction operators and management teams prepare development strategies for growth or economic sustainability. "This is where the province and regional people are doing the right thing," Tony says, who came from the UK, especially for this agreement signing. "This idea of creating a new entity has never been done like this. You are signing up to see a population that has been in decline for 15 years go on the rise

again. It is the perfect storm. Thank you to the technical team behind this because these agreements are a lot of work. Thank you all. I'm looking forward to how all this develops". Amy Cherniwchan, mayor of the Town of Smoky Lake, said it was an honour to be partners with Métis Crossing and the County of Smoky Lake. Lorne Halisky, Smoky Lake County Reeve added that "we are proud of our culture and our heritage. The Smoky Lake Tourism Company is the next chapter, and exciting times await us. The future is in our hands." Audrey Poitras, Chair of Métis Crossing and President of Métis Nation of Alberta, went into the history preceding today's important event: "Today we celebrate an achievement. The Métis Nation of Alberta first approached Smoky Lake Town and County in 2001; their support has been unwavering.

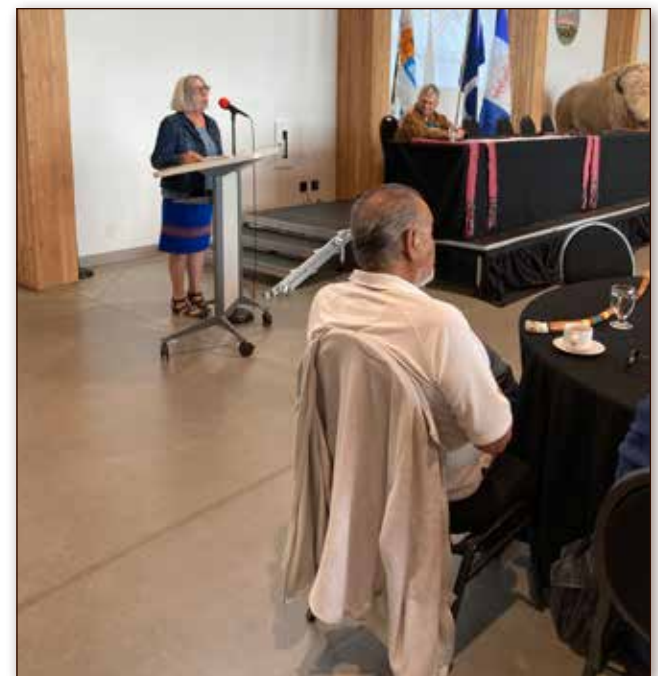
We are proud to invest in the Smoky Lake Tourism Company, which is meant to support the development of regional businesses through investment, tourism and marketing. The Smoky Lake Tourism Company will offer opportunities to entrepreneurs, youth, artisans and others for generations to come." The signing of the agreement marks a historic moment in the region. The Alberta Government offers the possibility to municipalities to set up a corporation. Smoky Lake chose tourism. This corporation is a for-profit entity in which local entities such as the town, county and Métis Crossing work together to promote regional tourism. "It's very exciting, this grassroots initiative, and to see growth happening in the region," Chris Down from Travel Alberta commented during the reception that followed the official signing.

PUBLIC NOTICE TO ELECTORS OF THE TOWN OF REDWATER, PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

SECTION 251 – THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT

TAKE NOTICE, that the Council of the Town of Redwater, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to borrowing Bylaw 915 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the said Town of Redwater to reallocate monies from the Borrowing Bylaw 884, to pay for the cost of the following municipal purpose(s), namely the Sewer Line Replacement in Pembina Place within the limits of the said municipality.

The total cost of the aforesaid project amounts to an estimated \$180,000. The net amount to be reallocated on the credit and security of the municipality at large by the reallocation of debentures is \$180,000. The debentures are to be repayable to the Alberta Capital Finance Authority in fifty (50) equal consecutive semi-annual instalments of combined principal and interest, the semi-annual interest estimated at 2.062%, or the interest rate as fixed from time to time by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority.

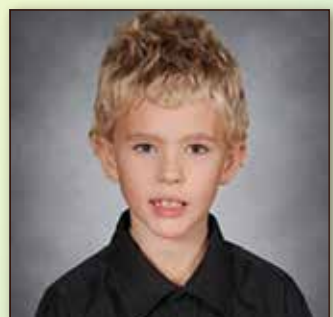


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Proposed Resource Extraction Changes

PUBLIC HEARING –BYLAW 1607/22

Amendments to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

In accordance with section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, Sturgeon County Council is requesting public input on new changes to proposed Bylaw 1607/22, which relates to resource extraction.

Council gave second reading to Bylaw 1607/22 on May 23, 2023. In addition to the regulations presented at the public hearing on March 15, 2023, the bylaw includes the following updates:

- Sand, gravel and clay operations and secondary processing operations would need to be at least 400 metres (quarter mile) from homes whether located in a multi lot subdivision or not.
- Silica sand and secondary processing operations would need to be at least 800 metres (half mile) from homes whether located in a multi lot subdivision or not. Silica sand is made up of at least 95 per cent silicon dioxide and less than 0.6 per cent iron oxide.

The existing and previously proposed bylaw presented on March 15, 2023, had setback distances of 400 metres between operations and single homes and 800 metres between operations and multi-lot subdivisions. The setback distances were the same for all operations, regardless of the material being mined.

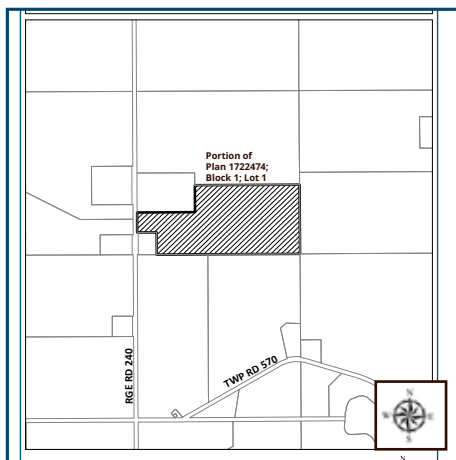
