Fire complaints in two older buildings in Redwater's downtown have been received and responded to the Redwater Fire Department and their partnering Sturgeon County Fire Department. On July 2, the Redwater Department and their partners

Sturgeon County Fire responded to a complaint of fire in two older buildings in the downtown core. The fire was being fanned by strong winds, resulting in damage to at least three buildings. There have been no reports of injuries caused by the fire, but it is possible that several residents of

nearby homes will need to be relocated, at least overnight. Formal reports from the fire and police departments are awaited, and no comments can be made regarding the cause of the fire at this time.

During this time, Mayor Dave McRae offered the following message: "I would like to thank our first responders for their quick and efficient response and extend a huge thank you to our mutual aid partners who provided resources from as far away as Morinville and Fort Saskatchewan." An arrest has been made in regard to these fires.





Thorhild Stampede an annual **Canada Day Celebration**



25 years of pancake flipping

St. Anne's Roman Catholic Church has been preparing and serving breakfast for July 1 as part of the Thorhild Stampede for 25 years. The event is one of the biggest fundraiser events the church puts on annually, but it is not without its challenges. When St. Anne's was approached 25 years ago, the current council agreed to provide a breakfast with the understanding that they would be allowed to continue to use it as their fundraiser every year. The breakfast begins with planning stages but is also a massive undertaking and huge commitment; shopping, set up and preparations take time to make this pancake breakfast a success.

The pancake breakfast requires a minimum of 25 volunteer individuals, several of whom begin their day at 5:30 am, to greet guests at the door for ticket sales, cook, serve, constantly replenish refreshments and accoutrements, and clean up after hundreds of people come through the Thorhild Drop-In Centre doors. To date the lowest attendance has been approximately 300 people and their best year welcomed over 400 patrons.

After years of practice and making mistakes, the breakfast now runs like a well-oiled machine that keeps that wait time as minimal as possible. Comments could be heard this year about the long line up extending across the street the previous July 1, but that was also a record-breaking turnout. One guest finished his meal this year commenting as he walked out, "That was one of the best organized breakfasts I've ever been to." Breakfast is served hot and fresh and welcomes family and friends to gather at communal tables to begin their celebration of Canada Day every year!

On July 1, Smoky Lake town and county residents celebrate Canada Day together. The Fire Department kicks off this day with a pancake breakfast; other events begin at 10:00 am. The picnic tables at the Ag Society complex quickly fill up with visitors. Inside the Ag Complex, vendors display their goods at the Farmers' Market, which today is smaller than usual as it is set up in the entrance hall instead of the big hall. One of the vendors is Jennifer, who sells Pampered Chef cookware. "I have done this for 15 years, and today also take care of a table full of socks for my friend Kim. Kim and I are "sock junkies": we love wearing socks and do not go barefoot, no matter the outside temperature. We want good quality socks and wear them ourselves. If I get a hole in a sock, I don't buy from that supplier again. We attend all regional

farmers' markets like the Pysanka Days in Vegreville, Pumpkin Fair and Heritage Days in Smoky Lake." Jennifer says. The number of socks on the table is impressive, as are the different patterns, colours and styles. Across from the complex, children are attracted by the splash park, the bouncy castles, the foam and the opportunity to decorate their bicycles for the bicycle parade. They are an easy crowd to please: they run from one event to the next and then start making their circles again. The weather is excellent: not too hot, sunshine, sometimes a few clouds, which contributes to the overall entertainment. Especially the foam is popular: an oversized bucket spits out massive amounts of foam for children walk through, play in or throw others with. Some chase clouds of foam being driven away by the wind. Towards noon the Firefighters start

cooking hot dogs for the crowd. Rachelle Amyotte, the FCSS program coordinator and organizer of this event, officially opens Canada Day with a few introductory words, followed by Gene Sobolewski singing "Oh, Canada." The crowd on the deck joins Gene. Town of Smoky Lake Mayor Amy Cherniwchan addresses the crowd with some history and words of wisdom. "I am especially happy to see families and children celebrate Canada's 156th birthday. People came here for many reasons. Many Ukrainian families came here because 'the walls in their houses in Ukraine had ears.' People came for freedom, and together they built a community. Today we are celebrating all the beautiful things our region offers. We have a diverse culture and offer delicious food. We all have a part in this community. Happy Canada Day!"

Back to reality: Alberta's exports remain elevated, but down from last year's post-invasion highs

Asamajorsellerofcrudeoil and natural gas to the United States, the value of Alberta's international exports are affected by swings in the prices of these commodities.

Last spring and summer, energy prices spiked in the wake of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and so did the value of Alberta's international exports.

Alberta's international merchandise exports were 85% higher in May 2022 than in May 2021, going from \$10.1 billion to \$18.7 billion.

The value of Alberta's energy exports went up by 116% (\$7.9 billion) over the same period.

Fast forward to May 2023, we see that Alberta's monthly exports were down by 21% (\$4.0 billion) compared to the previous May largely due




