

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS JUNE 27, 2023

Below is a brief summary of decisions and discussions at the June 27, 2023, Regular Council meeting:

Proposed Bylaw 10-2023 Water and Wastewater Rates Amendment

Administration presented Bylaw 10-2023 Water and Wastewater Rates for consideration of second and third readings of the bylaw. Council directed Administration to bring back more information on the definition of 'resident user' and explore the positioning and costs of surveillance cameras at the Long Lake lagoon regarding Bylaw 10-2023, Water and Wastewater Rates.

Delegation: North Saskatchewan Heritage River Initiative

Mr. Kyle Schole, representing the County of Smoky Lake, joined the Council meeting to present an update on the North Saskatchewan Heritage River Initiative Project to designate the North Saskatchewan River across Alberta as a Canadian Heritage River. Council accepted the presentation as information and directed Administration to bring back information from the Community Economic Development Advisory Board regarding the North Saskatchewan Heritage River Initiative

Delegation: Egremont Community Club

Ms. Donna Costain joined the Council meeting to discuss obtaining the title and sale of land belonging to the Egremont Community Club. Council passed a motion directing Administration to bring back information on the property owned by Thorhild County in the Hamlet of Egremont.

Delegation: Newbrook Recreational & Agricultural Society

Ms. Veronica Melnyk joined the Council meeting to provide information on the operating expenses of the skating arena and Newbrook Hall. Council moved to provide funding to the Newbrook Recreational & Agricultural Society according to Policy 1405 Community Grants in the amount of \$7,200 on the condition of proof of Society status.

Nurse Practitioner Funding Agreement

Council was presented with a draft agreement with Aspen Primary Care Network to fund the Nurse Practitioner Program for \$125,000 annually from April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2025. Council approved the Nurse Partitioner Funding Agreement between Thorhild County and Aspen Primary Care Network and directed Reeve Joyce Pierce to sign the agreement.

Standard Crossing Warning System Modification

Administration requested Council to approve 50% funding for upgrades on the standard crossing warning system at the existing railway crossing lights on 7th Avenue in the Hamlet of Thorhild. The cost would be shared with CN Railway. Council passed a motion to approve \$23,487.29 for the upgrade. Council also directed Reeve Joyce Pierce to sign the Standard Crossing Warning System Modification Agreement with the Canadian National Railway Company.

Radway Post Office

Council directed Administration to survey post office holders in Radway as to their preferred option between Canada Post installing Community Mailboxes in Radway or Canada Post moving all retail postal services to the Redwater Post Office.
