
The musical talents of Brandon Hachowski and his ten-year experience on the accordion brought the wonderful old-timey music to a folksy evening. 

Fall cooldown: Inflation moves in the right direction

Last week, we watched as the U.S. reported a lower inflation rate in October. Today, Canada joined in with its own encouraging report.

The annual inflation rate cooled largely as expected to 3.1% last month—down from 3.8% in September. This is the lowest inflation rate

since June and well below its peak of 8.1% in June 2022.

Most of the credit for last month's improvement goes to lower prices at the pumps (-7.8%

year-over-year, y/y). Grocery prices rose 5.4% y/y, the slowest annual pace since November 2021, but still an uncomfortably high reading for households.

the dulcimer. As his passion grew, Chwok learned the art of the tsymbaly quickly and his abilities progressed leading him to perform for many years in a Zabava band. His accomplishments granted him the opportunity to tour Canada on three occasions performing with symphonies with the Shumka Dancers. Chwok jokingly remarked that the rest is history, but his personal story was far more engaging than the statement allowed. While his passion for Ukrainian culture remained central to his life, Steven Chwok became a police officer, never thinking where life would take him.

A phone call in 2003 from then host of the Ukrainian Zabava Hour, R.J. Tompkins would change the course of Steven Chwok's life. In

2007, Chwok became the host of the Zabava Program, Canada's longest running Ukrainian program on 840 CFCW. Fond memories had people reminiscing about the Sunday "Ukrainian Hour" being tuned into while attending barn chores, a grandmother shushing everyone to be quiet, a rap of knuckles on the head from a relative for being disruptive during the show. The evening at Gathering Place Coop was organized to bring people back to their cultural roots, but it also stirred memories of a Canadian staple in so many homes. It was a part of routine, a part of family, a program awaited every Sunday evening.

The event allowed Steven Chwok to engage with a small piece of this audience. While he talked about ratings and listeners tuning in from around the world, he offered a heartfelt thank you to those in attendance for the dinner and evening, citing the many guests in attendances were the reason for the shows success and continued following. He welcomed the opportunity to mingle with the crowd, sharing stories of his own life and family, himself having ties and connections to the area, pointing out that his mother grew up in the Darling (Newbrook) area. Chwok offered an enthusiastic "Diborja!" following a short and humble speech of how he came to be the voice of culture. This exclamation signaled the beginning of dinner and a festive evening to follow. The music of Brandon Hachowski began again, encouraging the heart and soul to stand up

Lions, his passion for Christmas. Specifically, the Christmas Street Lights placed around the community, Holt often emphasizing that Radway "has the nicest Christmas lights around." Lions Club companions fondly discuss his requests for red light bulbs, always red, his favorite color for Christmas lights. Every October and November Holt would attend the monthly Lions meetings and remind the group of the amount of red light bulbs that would be required and the maintenance that was needed to be completed on the Christmas projects.

Allan Holt and a merry crew would set up in the fire hall each fall and attend to the joyful displays intended to delight anyone who passed by. This Christmas team was incredibly creative, but also frugal, using speaker wire, electrical tape, bread loaf twist ties and a variety of other random items to hold these designs together. The Radway Lions watched his dedication with admiration, but as the years passed and the occasional decoration started to

spark, there were gentle reminders that it may be time for new lights. As the upkeep on the old decorations became more difficult, Holt conceded that it may be time for new lights to be purchased.

Allan Holt passed away February 14, 2023. In honor of his passion for the community, his passion for the Radway Continuing Care Centre, and his absolute delight of Christmas lights, the Radway Lions Club dedicated a newly installed display in front of Radway Continuing Care in his name. The display was chosen as a ground level one out of consideration for residents with difficulty looking upwards. Admiring the cheerful arrangement, streetlight Christmas décor can be seen in the distance around the quiet, closeknit community. One decoration may seem out of place for the holiday season. Located across from the home of Allan and Cecilia Holt is one more new addition to the street light decorations, there is an outline of a lightbulb, dozens of red Christmas bulbs illuminating the memory of a remarkable man.

Pull up a chair

Pembina Place is a bustle of activity, specifically, Mondays. The beginning of each new week is traditionally marked with a statement regarding the "I hate Mondays" mentality. However, Pembina Place in partnership with the Town of Redwater is facilitating a change for that attitude. Offered weekly from 10:45-11:45, chair fitness is a way to connect with community members and engage in low impact activity and fitness.

Chair fitness can engage leg, arm, and core muscles all within a seated position. This is a great exercise option and opportunity for all ages and fitness levels who may be at risk of injuries or falls. The benefits of exercise are well known,

but chair fitness provides stretching and improvestrength ment and increased flexibility without placing a heavy strain on the body. This form of physical activity may be especially beneficial to seniors to increase mobility. The increase of movement increases blood flow throughout the body and eases joint pain and reduces health problems that arise from a sedentary lifestyle.

Currently Monday Chair Fitness Pembina Place has a dozen participants registered, drop ins are also always welcome. One of the benefits of this program is the adaptability for all levels of fitness, participants may complete their sessions in the seated position or stand to challenge their fitness level. The instructor is highly knowledgeable

and will collaborate with participants to create individualized workouts to suit their level of ability and encourage continued movement and exercise. In addition to the physical benefits of maintaining physical activity, exercise also improves mental health. Engaging in regular exercise affects chemicals in the brain, such as serotonin, and can improve mood, reduce stress and aid in better sleep.

While this program is a great option for senior's and individuals with mobility issues, everyone is welcome to participate. Chair fitness provides a friendly space to come together and is a fun and energetic way to begin the week. Some participants are also pairing their weekly workout with the indoor walking program

offered Mondays-Fridays, from 9amnoon. The indoor walking program offers a safe and stable walking surface and is available in all

weather conditions. Participants choose to come early on Monday mornings find this as a wonderful way to warm up and benefit their social health before beginning Chair Fitness. "I hate Mondays" can be replaced with, "Good Morning, Monday! Pull up a chair!"







Vandalism and mischief concerns

Town of Redwater Grapples with Escalating Vandalism and Mischief Costs Exceeding \$25,000 Year-to-Date.

The Town Redwater is facing an escalating challenge - this year, the Town of Redwater has witnessed a significant uptick in vandalism and mischief incidents in comparison to previous years. The increasing strains of vandalism and mischief costs that have nowexceeded\$25,000 year-to-date, put a significant burden on our community. This surge in vandalism and mischief incidents is a matter of concern for the town, affecting not only the financial resources but also the overall safety and aesthetics of our neighbourhoods, in addition to consuming valuable staff time. It's important to recognize that vandalism is not



a victimless crime and runs counter to our strategic initiative of making Redwater "Destination of Choice and Affordable Community." Combating this issue is a shared responsibility and we urge all residents to be vigilant and take an active role in preserving the beauty and security of our town by reporting vandalism and mischief to the proper authorities.

Redwater Mayor Dave McRae emphasized, "In response the escalating vandalism and mischief costs, the Town of Redwater firmly believes that those prosecuted for these offences should be held accountable to the full extent of the law, and financial restitution should be an integral part of any sentence granted. We are committed to making Redwater

the 'destination of choice and affordable community,' and this commitment includes ensuring the safety, beauty, and prosperity of our town. We call upon all members of our community to join us in safeguarding our town and ensuring its future prosperity."

This surge includes defacement of public property, damage to parks, overturned portapotties, frequent caboose entry, and graffiti on public and private buildings. The economic impact exceeds budgeted amounts, redirecting taxpayer dollars from essential services and regular regular operations. The \$25,000 cost equates to almost a 1% tax increase, affecting the entire community.

Safety concerns arise from broken streetlights and defaced road signs, posing risks to residents, especially at night. Liability concerns emerge from unauthorized access to areas like building roofs. Additionally, the incidents tarnish the town's aesthetappeal, affecting property values and the community image.

Ken Van Bull, Chief Administrative Officer of the town noted, "I believe in controlling what we can. That means:

1. Working with

local law enforcement to increase patrols and stay vigilant in reporting issues and incidents.

- 2. Tracking our costs internally so we are aware of our problem areas.
- 3. When we see those repeat areas we will make changes to XXX, lighting and security measures to deter unwanted activity.
- 4. We will educate the public on how they can assist us in this fight and inform our public on the effect vandalism has on our taxes."

As the Town of Redwater grapples with vandalism and mischief costs exceeding \$25,000 year-to-date, the Town remains committed to the safety, well-being, and prosperity of its residents.

"we received a lot of help and donations

The staff has also been busy setting up the program and has taken "ownership" of it: they are passionate about providing a high-quality daycare program. "Our job is to make children thrive," Heidie says. At the new school, they are hoping to get a fenced vard so it is safe for the children to play outside. The downtown location has a fenced yard in

the back, which they are still improving, setting it up for the children to make it adventurous and exciting. That the daycare provides a need is evident as it even has children from as far as Andrew, Waskatenau and Thorhild. "Our ambitions for improvement include connecting more to businesses in town. The Drop-In Centre has also expressed interest in being involved, and they are just a few doors down. And we would like to have all spots filled." Heidi says.





Enhanced Lipid Reporting (ELR) is a new, easy-to-use, lab-based approach to calculate CVD and stroke risk that ensures those at risk receive early treatment.

When your doctor does your screening,

tells you how likely you are to have a heart attack or stroke in the next 10 years if you do not make any changes to reduce your risk. Patients will also receive their CVD risk results in their MyHealth Records account.

You and your doctor can use this personal screening score to plan and take steps to lower your risk and help prevent a heart attack or a




