The councillors of Thorhild County have established an informal opportunity for ratepayers to engage with their riding representatives. On September 6, the Thorhild Legion provided a space for welcoming conversation and a casual coffee meeting. The five councillors of Thorhild County invited members of the community to come in, sit down, and talk to them. The atmosphere was comfortable and relaxed, coaxing concerns that may be weighing on minds. Mingling themselves throughout the crowd, smaller groups formed and seemed to induce people to open up without undue attention being placed on an individual. Questions and concerns could be directed one-on-one

to a specific councillor or discussed around a table.

This was the first meeting of Coffee with the Councillors. The goal is for it to be an ongoing occurrence, occurring every second month and rotating amongst different locations between the five divisions. Reeve Joyce Pierce likened the opportunity to a way for the councillors to come to the community members, as opposed to ratepayers having to come to them. The councillors were also happy to have this quiet opportunity as a chance to explain many topics that community members may misunderstand. community programming, waste management concerns, infrastructure in the community, and the care and maintenance of the hamlet. While these topics do not encompass all

conversations, they seem to be a repeated focus of the collective group. The councillors also acknowledged that many of the concerns are topics that have already been on their minds, and they are looking for fresh perspectives and a

means to move forward with possibilities. As the first meeting of its kind, the agreement between the councillors was that it went very well. There were not as many people as they had hoped, but it was a great beginning. It

gained an understanding of how people responded to the setting and what was trying to be accomplished. There was also an understanding that this is a rural community just beginning its harvest season. The hope is that with each recurring coffee date, the event will gain momentum and people will utilize this opportunity to reach out. They are looking to promote the economic development of a small community and to draw people in and encourage them to stay.

expressed her delight at coming back, stating it felt like coming home. With the new school year fresh and bright, her plans include a focus on building relationships and getting to know the

students as they progress through their educational development. Her vision also embraces the principles of virtue (including the Seven Grandfather Teachings), student engagement, and engagement with stakeholders and the community.

Lamouche will strive alongside the students to promote their success and completion of academics, accountability, and attendance. 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Continued from page 1 of Science and Engineering Technology Professionals of Alberta (ASET). A capstone project is a major part of many degrees and is a cumulative assignment designed to allow students to complete independent group studies and create solutions that can be applied to the real world. Bauer explained that during these projects, their teachers are there to guide them “but they do not help with student ingenuity.” The Capstone Project of the Year Award was created in 2017 as a response to the numerous interest stories by teams of engineering technology

students throughout many colleges across Alberta. Megan Bauer and her former team of NAIT biomedical engineering technology students originally got the idea for their Capstone project based on one of the team members summer jobs, researching and analyzing patients of spinal cord damage. They worked together to create a design that combined readings and sensors as a method to track and analyze a patient’s progress through their shoes. Tippy Tap Toes was the result of this project. This incredible young team designed an approach that uses transmitters, sensors, and an

accelerometer to collect data in real-time and display it as a 3D model through a game engine. Bauer expressed that while they faced many challenges, she and her team did not view anything as a failure. There were things that didn’t work the way they originally designed them, so they just went in a different direction. However, even though there were “no failures”, Bauer said they definitely experienced successes. When the first circuit was completed, there was cause for celebration. As the project progressed, she said some of the highlights of accomplishment included the connection

to the graphical user interface and when the readings from the shoes were accurately displayed. Megan Bauer also expressed her satisfaction with her team of students, explaining that while they were allowed to pick their own groups for the project, they picked really well and worked well as a team unit. In a statement released by Calico Communications for ASET, they commented: “Though T3 was originally intended to assist in a rehabilitation environment, it also has the potential to be applied to the area of sports medicine or even used as a controller to incorporate foot motion in virtual reality games,” said Gauthier. “It’s a cost-effective and easy-to-use method of analyzing a patient’s walking pattern with almost any shoe type.” Meagan Bauer humbly

remarked, “This was not something that I expected!” Tippy Tap Toes is one of nine finalists for the 2023 ASET Capstone Project of the Year and Bauer continued to express her enthusiasm. “Here we are! I’m really excited and looking forward to the outcome.” The prize-winning design will be announced at the end of October. ASET CEO, Barry Cavanaugh released

the flowing public statement: “Megan Bauer and her former NAIT teammates really stepped up with their development of a highly portable approach to gait analysis. Kudos to them for putting their best foot forward with this project and, in so doing, putting the public good first.” Bauer is entitled to her excitement; with her small-town beginnings, she is moving on to do great things.
