festival chefs stated that they had prepared enough food for eighty people.







Discovery Days bench show by one of the entrants. The town received \$8,183, or 46%, of grant funding from the South Grow Regional Initiative within their Electric Vehicle Charging Program. The town also applied for grant funding through the Municipal Climate Change Action Centre program; however, because of the popularity of their grant, the funds were unavailable.

Level 2 EV chargers charge at a rate of 20-130 km per hour and take 6-14 hours to provide a full charge. This is compared to Level 1 charges, which charge at a rate of 5-8km per hour and take between 40-60 hours to fully charge, and Level 3 chargers, which charge at a rate of 250-1500 km per hour and require only 15-60 minutes to provide a full charge.

Level 3 chargers have high power requirements and are typically not installed in homes.

The town will be recording statistics now that the chargers are fully operational. According to Garnet Davison, General Manager of Community and Protective Services, "[The town is] looking forward to providing a new service to the Town of Redwater and providing options for both residents and travellers heading north to areas such as Bonnyville, Cold Lake and Fort McMurray or travellers on their way south to Edmonton, etc."

Other green initiatives the town has completed in the past few years include a lighting upgrade at the arena in 2021, moving from metal halide to LED lighting. At the same time, they reduced cooling costs with a ceiling

replacement. Town staff are researching green fleet options through

and green options for the Zamboni. Davison stated, "However, the town will not be jumping to replace equipment until it is required or as set out in our 10-year capital plan." Davison explained that several green grant options are available for the fleet, and the town continues to explore these. Davison added, "The Town of Redwater would like to express their appreciation to both the MCCAC and South Grow Electric Vehicle

Charging Program for their ongoing support of green initiatives generous funding, helpful responses, advice, and streamlined application process. Without their programs and assistance, options would be limited for small rural municipalities communities." Mayerthorpe, Alberta TOE1NO

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

There's a new feature along 48th Avenue to catch the eye as people drive into town. The red and black pumpjack was refurbished in 2022 and has replaced community electronic events sign. The sign has been removed the town's

According to Diane Pysmeny, General Manager of Corporate Services, "[The sign] was 10 years old, and technology moves so fast that fixing the sign was cost prohibitive, and Council wanted to move to a new concept in the future at a different location." An announcement of the new concept will be

forthcoming when location for funding becomes available.

"We understand that [it] was a valuable sign for communications; however, until funding is available, a replacement is not scheduled at this time," Pysmeny explained further.

Instead, Council decided the area would be a fitting pumpjack, and it was also more cost-effective. The sandblasting cost \$3,500 from the park's maintenance budget. The pumpjack fits in with the towns history as well, with the discovery of oil in 1948. Prior to that, Redwater was a small farming community.

How farmers can reduce financial risk

(NC) Farming is becoming more and more unpredictable with the constantly changing environment. Managing the impacts of climate change, fluctuating weather, crop and livestock disease, high input costs and low commodity prices, makes farming a risky business. But there are programs out there that can help.

AgriStability is one program that may help if you face declines in farming income due to production loss (from weather or disease), increased costs or market conditions. The program, which is funded by federal, provincial and territorial governments, offers protection for your whole farm at an affordable rate, so you can receive payments in times of financial distress.

It is part of a group of business risk management programs to help farmers manage risks from severe market downturns and disaster situations. It's delivered by the federal

government in Manitoba, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and Labrador, and Yukon, and provincially everywhere else.

To qualify, you must have farmed for at least straight months during the program year, reported your farming income (or loss) to the Canada Revenue Agency for tax purposes, and completed (or attempted to complete) a production cycle during program year. Individuals, co-operatives and corporations are all eligible. To participate, simply enroll by the deadline, pay your fee and submit your program forms after completing your fiscal year.

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
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Early expectations for lower crop yields amid dry weather

conditions in the central-east and south parts of the province are expected to weigh on crop yields in Alberta this year. Two recent reports highlight that yields for most crops are expected to drop from last year's record levels based on early estimates.

IntheGovernment of Alberta's latest crop report (August 22), recent rains in some areas of the province improved

conditions slightly. However, the share of crops rated 'good to excellent' held steady from the previous report at around 43%, below the 5-year average of 57%. The share of crops rated in this category ranged from 25% in the driest areas (well below the 5-year average of 50% for the area) to 62% in the best region (closer to the 5-year average of 64% for this area). The report's latest crop yield estimates

are at 86% of the past five years.

Statistics nada's latest model-based estimates for crops were released Tuesday. According to these estimates, wheat and barley production in Alberta are expected to drop by 16% and 15%, respectively, this year from the bumper production in 2022. Canola production is estimated to be 1.2% lower than 2022 levels, while oats and lentils are projected to be down by over a

third. Despite these declines, Statistics Canada expects production to remain well above 2021's depressed These are preliminary estimates, with Statistics Canada noting final timates will not be available until December 3.

Some crop farmers will face a challenging harvest, which will impact farm cash receipts throughout the balance of this year and until 2024's
