The calendar is filling up with classes and tutorials in addition to the regular open Wednesday afternoons. The Wednesday afternoons are dedicated to all artists and art connoisseurs to enjoy the peace of the gallery or work on current art projects. The purpose of the Wednesday afternoon fellowship is not only to take pleasure in sharing the ideation process with fellow artists, but also to engage and share

tips, techniques, and gentle critiques in order to further develop oneself. January 20 marked the beginning of the 2024 calendar of tutorials. Painters wielded their brushes as expert as swordsman, slicing across the canvas and brandishing a spectacular array of blues, yellows, and greens to create a brilliant display of graceful arrogance befitting the spectacular presence of a peacock. Shelterbelts and agricultural benefits



Established shelter belts provide protection against wind erosion and acts to trap snow to maintain moisture.

As communities, municipalities and counties begin rolling out their purchase orders to encourage their residents in participating in shelter belt programs the prevailing mind set makes one think of wind breaks and privacy. Underlying this prominent use of a shelterbelt is steeped with agricultural practices designed to manage and protect farmsteads. In addition to their agricultural

impact, shelter belts have a positive effect on climate change, including micro-ecosystems tucked within their branches and roots.

With the advancement of agricultural equipment and the desire to increase production and maximize speed and proficiency, many farmsteads have experienced the loss of shelterbelts as bigger agriculturalists remove trees for the efficiency of their

Redwater RCMP execute warrant and locate wanted male

On Jan. 23, 2024, at approximately 12:00 p.m., Redwater RCMP, with the assistance of Westlock RCMP and Athabasca RCMP, as well as RCMP Eastern Alberta District Crime Reduction Unit, Police Dog Services, Integrated Offender management Unit and Eastern Alberta General Investigation Services, executed a warrant at a rural residence in Thorhild County, Alta. The

warrant was issued following an investigation into an aggravated assault that occurred on July 30, 2023. Upon police arrival, the accused was sitting in a stolen vehicle. After initial contact with police, the accused fled the scene, narrowly avoiding striking a police officer. RCMP followed the suspect and were eventually able to dis-

arrest the suspect. No injuries were reported in relation to this occurrence. As a result of the investigation, Justin Alexander McKinney (31), a resident of Fawcett, Alta., was arrested on multiple warrants, including the warrant for aggravated assault. Furthermore, McKinney was charged with:

- Failing to stop for peace officer;
- Possession of property obtained by crime; and
- Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle.

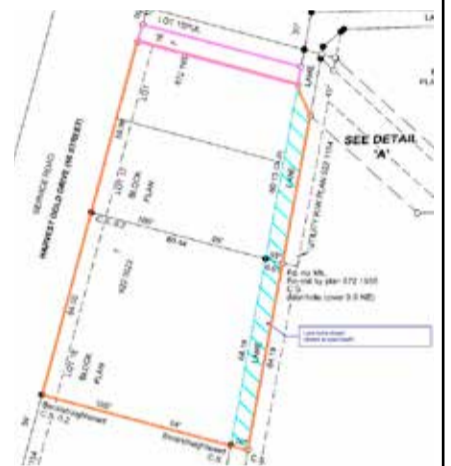
McKinney was brought before a justice of the peace and remanded into custody. He is to appear before the Alberta Court of Justice in Fort Saskatchewan on Jan. 25, 2024.

equipment and agricultural practices. This loss affects more than a visual impact. Shelterbelts have been used for years as a means to reduce erosion and control dust. These lines also work as a natural snow fence that captures the build up of snow, thus maintaining moisture that may otherwise be lost to the farmland during spring thaw. In other terms of moisture, shelterbelts may also hold and conserve moisture as well as purify the ground water surrounding it.

These magnificent rows of trees, bushes and shrubs also provide shelter for livestock and other animals, offering them defences against the elements in addition to protection from extreme temperatures year-round. These areas also become habitats for wildlife. Many shelterbelt programs are now offering the sale of pollinator bundles to be incorporated into the design. This further encourages wildlife into the area as well as birds and insects, beneficial to the overall impact and success of plant growth and development within the shelterbelt and the surrounding land.

In addition to the phenomenal way trees improve air quality and provide a variety of fruits and nuts suitable for both man and beast, the shelter belt enhances and beautifies the world around it. Look into your local municipality to find out if they offer low rates on seedlings for the development of windbreaks and hedgerows. Many areas also offer workshops and courses that discuss the science and ecological impact, the success and proper planning for establishing shelterbelts as well as the maintenance and care required to ensure their survival. They may also teach disease identification, treatment and troubleshooting. Plant a tree. Plant a row of trees. Leave a legacy that leaves the world a little better place.

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Fort Air Partnership Records Zero High or Very-High Risk AQHI Hours in the Fourth Quarter of 2023

From October through December 2023, Fort Air Partnership (FAP) recorded zero hours of high or very-high-risk Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) hours at our seven continuous air monitoring stations that provide the data used for calculating the AQHI.

For the fourth quarter, FAP reported a total of 14,752 hours (99.3%) of low-risk AQHI and

99 hours (0.67%) of moderate-risk AQHI.

There were also no exceedances of the Alberta Ambient Air Quality Objectives (AAAQO) in the fourth quarter of 2023.

All exceedances of AAAQOs are reported to the Alberta Government, and the likely cause of the exceedance is investigated.
