two separate sessions, fall and winter. The principles of the skating programs build upon the foundation of learning to skate and increasing skills and confidence while on the ice. Also offered is Power Skating Levels 1 & 2, increasing and improving hockey skills, agility, and speed as well as Power Skating Level 3 which challenges experienced skaters to continually improve and enhance their skills. The club plans to broaden its program offerings in the near future to include figure skating.



SAFE WINTER BURNING TIPS

When conducting winter burning, please ensure that fires are completely extinguished because they can smoulder underground and reignite as a wildfire in the spring when conditions tend to be driest.

Here are a few tips to consider if you're burning in the winter:

- Check weather forecasts before starting a large burn event.
- Burn debris in stages, and be prepared to adjust the burning process according to the changing weather conditions.
- Make sure there is good snow cover (more than 15 cm or 6 inches) in the burn area.
- As per Emergency Services Bylaw 12-2023, a maximum of 5 windrows or brush piles can be burned at once.
- Windrows and brush piles must be at least 25 metres (82 feet) from any uncleared land, structures, roads, or vegetation.

After the burning is completed, be sure to:

- Ensure that you spread the remaining material evenly within the pile. Also, make sure to soak it with water as and when required.
- Ensure the pile is completely cooled and does not produce heat or smoke before leaving it.
- It's crucial to keep a close eye on your burn site several times over the next few weeks to make sure it doesn't reignite. Don't underestimate the importance of this step in preventing wildfires from starting when dry and windy conditions return in the spring.

Note: Fire permits are required for all fires, **except** for cooking, fire pits, outdoor fireplaces, and burn barrels. For details, visit www.thorhildcounty.com/Services/Fire-Emergency-Services/Fire-Permits.

NATURAL GAS INSTALLATION

Property owners requiring a new natural gas service or a secondary line to a home, business, or farm are asked to call 780-398-3741 ext. 2811 or utilities@thorhildcounty.com to request a new natural gas infill.

When contacting Thorhild County, please state the address or legal description, and the type of installation required.

The cost for new rural natural gas infill is \$8,250 plus GST. The cost for new urban natural gas infill is \$3,500 plus GST.

The application deadline is August 31 of each year.

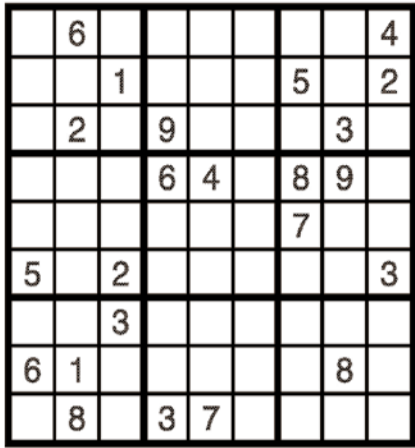

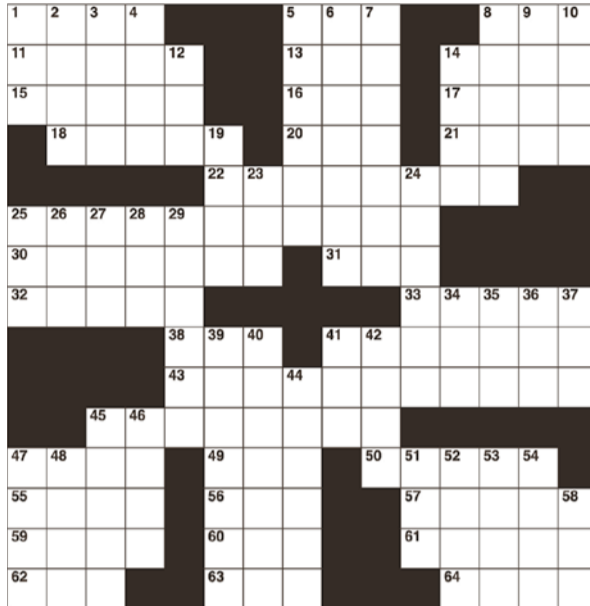

Gaining ground: A better year for new vehicles sales in Alberta

It has been a rough ride for new vehicle sales since the pandemic first started disrupting supply chains and consumer behaviour back in 2020.

Has the ride gotten any smoother?

With data for all of 2023 now in hand, we can say that 2023 ended on a strong note, and was a better year overall, than 2022.

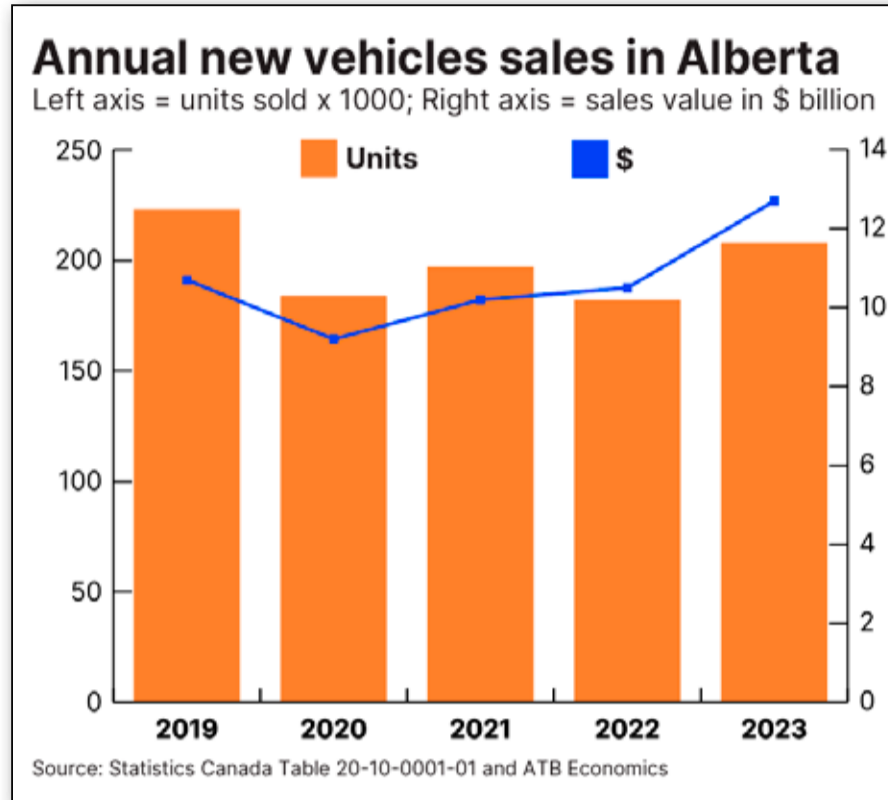
Here in Alberta, the value of sales was 21% higher than in 2022 and 18% higher than in 2019 before the pandemic began. Fourth quarter sales were, moreover, 32% higher than the same quarter in 2022. It remains to be seen if the cumulative impact of higher interest rates will slow this momentum.

It is a similar, but more muted, story nationally with annual sales 12% higher and fourth quarter sales up by 21%.

However, when we look at the number of new vehicles rolling off of lots, the impact of the pandemic and supply chain challenges is still evident.

Compared to 2022, the number of units sold in Alberta was a solid 14% higher last year, but was still 7% below the 2019 total. The average price of new vehicles sold in Alberta was 27% higher than in 2019.

Again, it is a similar story nationally, with 2023 unit sales 13% higher than in 2022, but 12% lower than before the pandemic while the average price of new vehicles sold in Canada went up by 28% between 2019 and 2023.

How to get the government money available to you

(NC) Let's face it: no one loves doing their taxes. Find forgotten cheques

Who doesn't love reaching into an old

coat pocket and finding a \$20 bill you forgot about the last time you wore it? Many of us unknowingly have uncashed government cheques waiting to be deposited, some worth hundreds or even thousands of dollars.

Find out if you have any uncashed cheques by registering for or

logging in to your Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) My Account portal. If it shows you have an uncashed cheque but you can't find it, you can ask for a new one to be issued. Government cheques do not expire so if you do find one that got tucked away somewhere, take it to your

financial institution to deposit the money into your account today.

Register for direct deposit

The fastest way to get any refunds or benefits you're owed from the government is to register for direct deposit. Sometimes things like extreme weather events can delay mail delivery. With direct deposit, you can avoid any postal delays and can get your payment in as little as eight business days. You can sign up through your financial institution or on your My Account. Plus, with direct deposit you'll never misplace a government cheque.

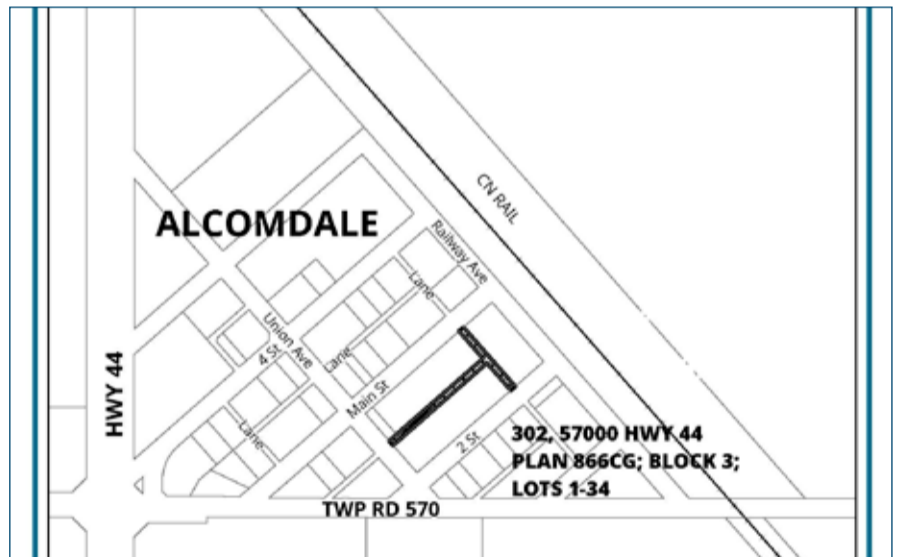

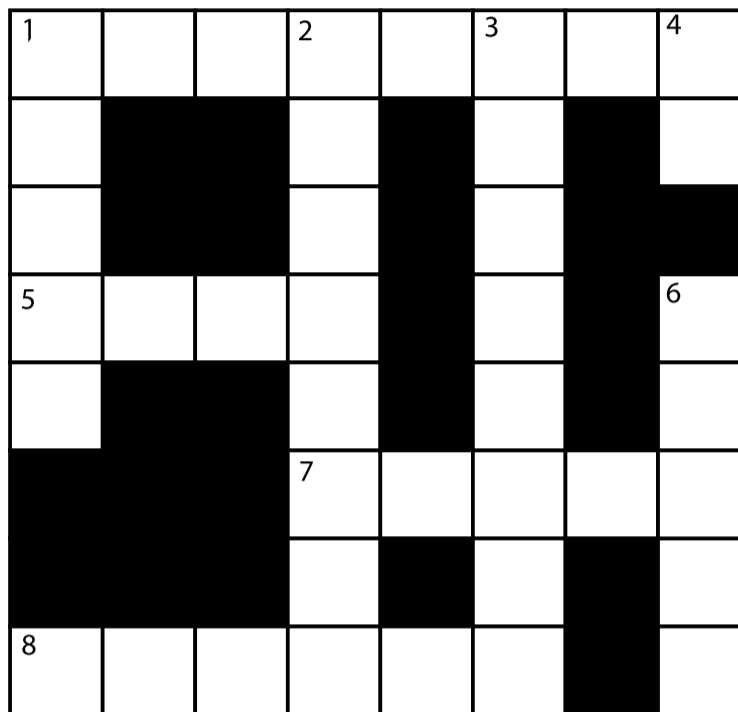
