fish of the day. The Radway Lion's Club provided free hot dogs and refreshments and welcomed over forty anglers on February 19. They remarked that the weather was the best they had ever had on a Family Day ice-fishing event.

Reminiscing about the weather reminded club members of erecting scaffolding to wrap with tarps to create an impromptu shelter, protecting the ice-fishing guests from the howling winds. Alongside the makeshift shack, years ago, to ensure warmth on the coldest ofyears, a massive culvert would be hauled into the parking lot to have a blazing fire going, safeguarding fingers or toes from the blistering cold.

These unsafe solutions to recurring battles with the elements led the club to partner with the County of Thorhild and apply for grants. This led to the planting of a shelter belt, the building of a cookshack, and the development of a picnic area.

Alberta's free fishing weekend in February coaxes many families onto the ice to try their hand at one of Canada's leading winter hobbies. For many families, Radway Fishpond holds their annual memories of winter fishing and Family Day weekend fun. 
#### Here's How It Works:

# Job vacancy rate unchanged in December



#### By Rob Roach, **ATB ECONOMICS**

The job vacancy rate\* in Alberta ended 2023 at 3.9% in December, unchanged from the month before.

This is down from the peak seen in April 2022 (5.3%), but is still above the pre-pandemic level (2.7% in February 2020) and the national average (3.6% in December).

Alberta's job vacancy rate has been higher than the national average since August 2023.

Among the provinces, B.C. (4.2%)

Saskatchewan and (4.2%) had the highest the vacancy rate in December while Newfoundland and Labrador had the lowest at 3.1%

Looking at 2023 as a whole, the average annual vacancy rate in Alberta came in at 4.2% compared to 4.8% in 2022 and 2.6% in 2019.

The number of employees in Alberta receiving pay and benefits from their employer—measured "payroll employas ment" in the Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours-was virtually unchanged in

December, but was 2.5% higher than 12 months earlier.

We will get a picture of how the job vacancy rate varies across sectors at the end of 2023 when quarterly data by industry are released later in March.

As of the third quarter of 2023, the accommodation and food services and construction sectors had the highest job vacancy rates in Alberta.

\*The number of job vacancies as a percentage of all occupied and vacant jobs. Monthly data have been seasonally adjusted.






