

Smoky Lake native wins gold

Smoky Lake native Derek Zaplotinsky celebrated a monumental win after spending nearly ten years on the Para Nordic national team. On March 14, 2024, Zaplotinsky competed at the World Cup Final and succeeded in winning the gold medal in the men's sitting five-kilometer cross country race. His triumph was preceded in January, receiving bronze in the cross country 10 kilometer individual and 10-kilometer mass start during the opening World Cup.

Zaplotinsky's Derek previous achievements include 5 top-ten placements during the 2021-22 World Cup in Canmore, 2 top-5 finishes in the 2019 World Para Nordic Championships in Prince George, BC, and 2 top-10 finishes in his 2018 debut at the Paralympic Winter Games. Zaplotinsky's paralympic career began in 2015 and saw him competing in the World champions, placing twelfth in the cross country fifteen kilometer.

After an accident in 2006, where Zaplotinsky was left paralyzed from

the waist down during a motocross race where another dirt bike landed on him, he returned to the sport four years later first as a Para Cyclist and later becoming a cross country skier. The physical and mental dedication are unsurpassed as an athlete, the emotional commitment presses Zaplotinsky forward as he made his way to the top of the podium.

Completing the race in 12 minutes and 59.7 seconds, Zaplotinsky beat the previous 2022 Paralympic Champion, Mengtao Liu, who came in second at 13 minutes and 4.7 seconds. Critian Ribera placed third at 13 minutes and 7.3 seconds. The victory was an emotional triumphal moment, resulting in a wash of emotion after achieving what he worked so hard to accomplish, so many years of training and conditioning and endurance, finally cumulating in the split second it took to cross the finish line.

"It was very special to get my first win at home in Canada in front of family." commented Zaplotinsky.





As Smoky Lake continues to post notices from Alberta Health Services on the limited medical physicians and reduced times they are available, there is a growing concern over the lack of coverage and access to medical help.

Many Albertans are facing an understanding of the growing need for more family and rural physicians to provide across-life care. Within the international competition to attract

medical professionals, Alberta lacks the desirability and appeal to practice within the province, especially out of the larger urban areas. Alberta's family and rural practitioners have submitted proposals to the government outlining what needs to be done to save small clinics that are on the verge of collapse. These proposals are aimed at making Alberta an attractive place for doctors and all medical professionals to return and remain.


The motion further encourages

Named the Putting Patients First Campaign concerned Albertans are urged to contact your MLA by using the website www. patientsfirst.ca generate a customizable email.

The reality healthcare Alberta is concerning as the ThinkHQ Family Practice Viability study and www.patientsfirst. ca suggests that clinics are at risk of closing which further limits access to Alberta healthcare as well as the concern that one in three doctors are considering stepping away from the medical field in favour of early retirement. The continued concern of increased wait times in both clinical facilities as well

as access to important medical procedures are a growingconcernformany Albertans. Smoky Lake Physicians & Health Care Professionals Committee

is asking their residential public to join the crusade alongside other Albertans to create a better Alberta and fix a broken healthcare system.







The Parent Child Mother Goose Program was established in 1984 in Toronto, ON, and was created by Barry Dickson and Joan Bodger as an early intervention program. This program, supported by decades of research, is entirely oral and builds upon the natural bonds and early childhood development typically provided by the primary caregiver. The experiences, whether negative or positive, of infants and toddlers have a significant impact on the development of their brains. It's important to note that eighty percent of a child's brain development occurs by age three.

The Parent Child Mother Goose Program focuses on the positive impacts that result from using positive tones,

expressions, and gestures. It also encourages touch and builds upon these foundations to provide parents and caregivers with a toolkit of strategies and support mechanisms to assist them in engaging with their little ones. The program uses singing, stories, and rhymes to facilitate interaction, which is a crucial part of infant development. One personal story of an attending parent found a focus and means to connect with her child while contending with her own post-partem depression and anxiety. Knowing her child needed positive interaction, she used to simple poems and silly games to speak to her child when she didn't know what else to say. The Mother Goose Program taught her to make positive connections when her mental strength felt lacking.

Redwater Public Library is incredibly grateful and excited to have the opportunity to provide with Sturgeon Adult Learning to provide the Parent Child Mother Goose Program on a local level. Redwater Library has expressed their passion for this program and the amazing opportunity it provides for caregivers of young children. They expressed the ways the program empowers parents and referred to the Mother Goose Program as a program disguised as a baby program but is really all about the parent & caregivers.

The Parent Child Mother Goose Program will begin in April and will run as a ten-week program, recurring each Friday morning. Registration needs to be made in advance and requires a \$20.00 registration fee per family.
