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winter caps, gathered with a shared enthusiasm. Whether they were new to the world of pruning or seasoned veterans, all were eager to learn or refresh themselves about the maintenance of trees and shrubs in their own backyards.

Marsh began with a quick lesson on timing, ensuring spring is the perfect time of year to clean up trees. Buds are beginning, and dead growth is easier to spot. The lack of foliage and coverage make for a perfect opportunity to check for disease and damage in trees. The workshop expanded into discussing various pruning

and limbing tools and their applications.

The Pruning for Success workshop, expertly led by Marsh, took participants on a journey around the park and arboretum. Marsh's in-depth discussions on the reasons for pruning trees for health and space, and his guidance in crowning and shaping fruit trees, instilled a sense of confidence in his students. He also highlighted the various problem areas in trees, equipping his students with the knowledge to assess potential issues. Marsh also maintained an ongoing dialogue of examining shoots and branches, "Where is it going?" and "Is it useful or not

useful?"

Keith Marsh is responsible for laying the foundation for the Green Thumb Workshop series as a pilot project in 2023. In its second year, his wisdom in all things green and the living world around him provides the perfect opportunity to become students in the natural world. The next Green Thumb Series is scheduled for May 17, 1:00 - 3:00 pm and will teach registrants about cold frame gardening and splitting and sharing perennials. Thorhild County native receives national award

On Thursday 4 April 2024, Mr. Jacques Perron, Chairman of the Canadian Mineral Industry Education Foundation (CMIEF), presented the Edward Futterer Scholarship to Simon Erdman during a special presentation ceremony held in the College of Engineering at the University of Alberta. This marks the fifth time, since the inception of the scholarship in 1979, that a student from the University of Alberta has received this award. There are approximately 25,000 Mining Engineering

students across Canada. Erdman, 22, is in his senior year of Mine Engineering at the university of Alberta. He is from a ranch near Radway and attended Radway Public School, graduated from Redwater School and was an active member of the Radway 4H Multi Club. Previous awards include the Rutherford Scholarship, the Redwater Agricultural Society Scholarship and a Golden Key Scholarship. "I was really surprised to receive this award."

The Canadian Mineral Industry Education Foundation has been offering scholarships since 1964 to undergraduate students with a strong interest in a career in the mining industry. 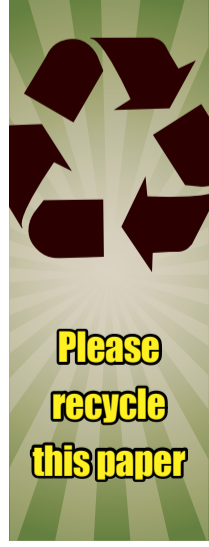

Redwater focuses on explaining new initiatives

The Town of Redwater is excited to launch a new initiative to shed light on issues, projects, decisions, and initiatives shaping the town. Monday Municipality Matters began on Monday, April 22, 2024, and will feature highlights on infrastructure, policy changes, community events, or citizen concerns. Monday Municipality Matters kicked off this endeavor with a question-and-answer segment discussing the Town of Redwater's linear infrastructure requirements and the funding strategy necessary to make them happen.

In the first post, Monday Municipality

Matters delves into the Town Council's development of a crucial 10-year Linear Infrastructure Capital Plan. This plan is a vital step in the Town of Redwater's progress, aiming to replace and rehabilitate critical infrastructure such as water distribution and sanitary sewer lines. These systems are reaching the end of their lifecycle, and recent assessments have underscored the urgent need for their replacement. The plan is focused on funding options and is committed to keeping the community informed and engaged throughout the process.

The strategy aligns with the town's long-term goals,

particularly the priorities of "Service Excellence" and "Destination of Choice and Affordability." The strategy aims to address the town's aging infrastructure challenges by renewing it without the need for tax increases or reducing existing service levels. The only additional revenue will come from a small surcharge on water bills. The surcharge (UIRR for Utility Infrastructure Reinvestment Rider) revenue will be going to a reserve for reinvestment in utility infrastructure. The intent is to make the utility more self-sustainable and share the cost of maintenance/rehabilitation/replacement equitably across the

users over time.

The infrastructure must be maintained for the benefit of current and future generations, as it has a finite lifespan.

In broad terms, the borrowing strategy explained was developed with the ability to pay without increasing taxes as the most critical factor. Utility billing is considered a fairer way of sharing expenses, and transitioning to more funding from utility bills puts a fairer share of the infrastructure funding on utility users. Borrowing helps to spread out the cost of infrastructure over time, making it more equitable for all users to pay an equitable portion of costs. Staff and consulting engineers

have developed an affordable plan and will use the latest proven methods to ensure the projects meet industry standards and the town receives value for the resources being spent. The short-term impact on property taxes related to conducting these projects should be minimal. The strategy's long-term viability should be maintained as inflation rates return to normal.

The goal is to run a well-maintained infrastructure that meets the needs of residents and businesses. This will be implemented in addition to utilizing provincial and federal grants, restricted reserve funding, and capital borrowing.

Monday Municipality Matters first post also discusses the linear infrastructure plan of Redwater, which includes projects related to roads, bridges, buildings, and facilities.

Investing in the maintenance and replacement of aging infrastructure is necessary for the town's long-term benefit. Deferring infrastructure maintenance can result in critical risks and failures. It is crucial to start investing in the long-term plan as soon as possible.

Portable Air Monitoring Station now operating in Thorhild

Fort Air Partnership (FAP) has moved its Keith Purves Portable Air Monitoring Station to the community of Thorhild. It began reporting data in early April.

Portable monitoring sites are chosen through a site selection process that assesses several candidate locations in the Airshed. Thorhild was chosen because it is currently the largest community in the Airshed where no continuous air monitoring (portable or otherwise) has been located. The nearest continuous air monitoring station is in Redwater 22 kilometres away.

"FAPs portable station allows us to be responsive to air monitoring needs in the Airshed," said Nadine Blaney, FAP's Executive Director. "We're now able to capture data that characterizes the air quality Thorhild residents experience, and compare

it with the other communities we serve. It will also help us determine possible effects of larger air quality events like wildfires, inversions and summertime smog."

The community of Thorhild is in the northern third of the FAP Airshed and lies directly north of Alberta's Industrial Heartland area. The portable station is sited at Thorhild's water transfer station just west of 7th Avenue and 7th Street.

The portable station will collect and report data on the substances used to calculate the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI). These are: sulphur dioxide, hydrogen sulphide, nitric oxide, nitrogen dioxide, oxides of nitrogen, ozone, non-methane hydrocarbons, methane and particulate matter. The station will also provide weather information.

The portable station will operate in Thorhild for one year. Tours of the station are available to community groups on request. For tour inquiries email us at info@fortairmail.org or phone 1-800-718-0471.

The portable monitoring station was previously located for one year near the Hamlet of Newbrook. A summary report of those data findings will be available in June.

FAP has 10 continuous air monitoring stations in and around Alberta's Industrial Heartland. Continuous data is collected 24 hours a day, seven days a week and generated through a live data feed accessible to anyone who visits www.fortair.org. FAP Airshed monitoring and reporting is guided by a scientific advisory group and driven by national and provincial standards.



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Alberta addresses wildfire concerns

The Alberta Forestry and Parks Minister, Todd Loewen, hosted a rural media roundtable on April 30 to address concerns and response plans for this year's wildfire season.

Loewen announced that hundreds of Alberta Wildfire response team members are trained and ready to respond, assuring Albertans that the government has been diligently preparing for months to enhance the response time and management of the wildfires in Alberta.

As much of Alberta received snow or rain precipitation over the past week, Alberta's Wildfire team breathes a sigh of relief at the reduced risk in the upcoming weeks.

However, as Minister Loewen discussed, so much is dependant on the weather and the

government is only a partial piece of the wildfire season. With the current wildfires this year, it has been found that 77% of them so far have been caused by people.

Minister Todd Loewen stressed the importance and preventative actions of individuals and communities and the need to be aware of and follow bans and restrictions.

Minister Loewen also acknowledged the ongoing communications between municipalities and the Alberta Wildfire Department, the expectations, and clarifications of who is in charge and who is responsible for responding. With the unprecedented wildfires of 2023, the Alberta government is preparing and is focused on getting the message out to Albertans to remain calm but be prepared. Communities may

consider the community fireguard program, fire services training, and FireSmart educational programs. Individuals are asked to share the responsibility of reducing the threat of wildfire by participating in preventative measures.

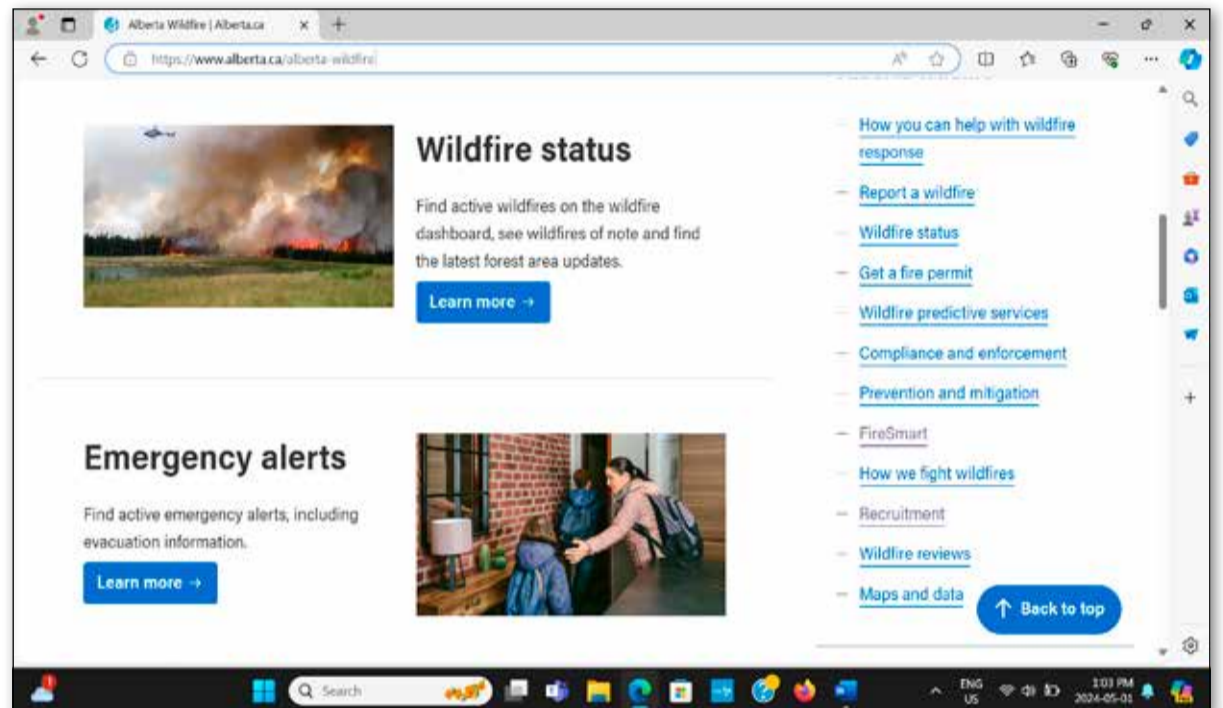
As the wildfire season begins, Minister Loewen explained

new strategies and learning methods from the extensive experience of First Nations fire fighting teams to develop strategies such as nighttime fire fighting. Due to the usually reduced temperatures and increased humidity at night, teams can use drones for thermal imaging and helicopters

equipped with night vision capabilities to fight 24 hours a day to target and suppress wildfires. The Alberta government is also using AI technology to assist in planning and predicting potential fire activity and fuel loads.

Alberta RCMP provide tips for the upcoming Emergency Preparedness Week

May 5 - 11 marks Emergency Preparedness Week across Canada. This year's theme is "Be Prepared. Know Your Risks" with the intent to encourage Canadians to understand the risks in their area and learn what actions that they can take to protect themselves, their families, and properties.

Due to the geographic diversity of the province, there are a number of different emergency situations that can affect Albertans. We can experience infrastructure failures like power outages, train derailments, and oil spills, or natural disasters like floods, wildfires, blizzards, tornadoes, and heat waves. It is important to be prepared to respond to these emergencies as they arise, whether that means sheltering in place or evacuating to a safe location.

"The Alberta RCMP is committed to ensuring the safety of Albertans and their communities during any emergency situation, but it's important that you do your part as well," says S/Sgt. Rodney Koscielny Officer in Charge of the Alberta RCMP Operational Readiness and Response Unit. "It's essential that everyone is taking steps to keep themselves, their property, and each other safe."

This Emergency Preparedness Week, your Alberta RCMP offers the following tips on how you can minimize risks during an emergency:

- Prepare an emergency kit that is readily accessible in case of evacuation. The kit should include water, food that won't spoil, manual can opener, wind up or batter powered flashlight and radio, first aid kit, extra keys to cars and homes, cash, important family

documents such as ID, insurance and bank records, and your emergency plan including contact information. It should also include any prescription medication, pet supplies, and baby food as needed.

- Create a household preparedness plan including emergency exits, evacuations routes, safe meeting spots, and important contact information. Make sure that all family members know your emergency plans, fully understand their responsibilities, and knows how to reach one another in case an emergency is declared and you are not together.
- Always make sure that your home and property are secured, so you don't have to worry about the safety of your belongings.
- If you have a pet, ensure you have identified animal-friendly accommodations in case of evacuation, or pet boarding and care facilities.
- For farms, create a list of equipment, supplies, and tools needed to evacuate or transport livestock. Keep records of equipment, livestock, and supplies on your premises. As well, have a plan to identify livestock in case of evacuations, i.e. tattoos, tags, etc.
- Ensure that you are following the instructions of emergency services. Ignoring emergency alerts and evacuations orders can put your life and the lives of your family in danger, and hinder the efforts of emergency services response efforts.
