Mindfulness journals are highly regarded by many as an essential tool for those committed to enhancing their overall mental well-being. Consistently journaling one's experiences and articulating thoughts, emotions, and significant events can profoundly impact mental health and self-discovery. Mindfulness activities, such as journaling, assist individuals in becoming more attuned to themselves and their surroundings. Devoting a tiny portion of each day to the practice of expressing one's thoughts can cultivate

On May 15, 2024, North Corridor Co-op convened its Annual General Meeting to review its financial performance. The meeting revealed significant achievements, with total sales increasing by 4% to reach \$78,974,957. Additionally, petroleum liters saw а substantial upsurge of 6.3%, totaling 40,434,564 liters. Notably, the cooperative's net savings also experienced a remarkable 16% increase, amounting to \$3,645,049. These results demonstrate the cooperative's strong performance and fi-

nancial stability. In 2023, the North Corridor underwent significant changes in its management across multiple areas. Both the general manager and the petroleum manager transitioned to other positions within the Co-op, leaving key roles to be filled.

Despite these changes, the team upheld operational efficiency throughout the year. This was especially remarkable, considering it was a record year. North Corridor Co-op expresses its gratitude to the Senior Leaders for their exceptional dedication and hard work in ensuring that the members needs were met. Despite the challenging and turbulent circumstances, the team demonstrated unwavering commitment and resilience.

Currently, North Corridor has around 100 team members working and supporting the communities they serve. invest-Substantial ments have been made back into the facilities, including the Boyle Home Centre roof, sewer repair at Boyle Home Centre, a new fuel truck, LED lighting in food store cases, and a new chem shed in Thorhild.

Plans are underway

to replace the lines at the gas bar, which will open in the upcoming week. There will also be the addition of a 24-hour pay-at-thepump capability to the gas pumps. Electronic shelf labels will be installed in both food stores in the fall.

Additionally, a new F-550 Agro delivery unit and a rotisserie chicken cooker at the Boyle Food Store are part of the fixed asset purchases for the coming year. North Corridor will also begin a detailed look at 5-10-year capital and repairs and maintenance planning. Projects that will be researched include a major renovation of the Boyle Home Centre, diesel exhaust fluid tanks at Cardlocks, credit card capability at Cardlocks, another new fuel truck, dedicated agro office space, and more. All these projects will need ample research and return on investments completed to see if they are feasible and will add value to our members. If they do not add value to the membership and profit of the Co-op, then there must be a willing decision not to proceed. If they do, the proposed projects will go ahead.

Reinvesting in assets is crucial for North Corridor to maintain and grow as a business.

These projects will reduce costly repairs and maintenance, enhance image and experience, improve efficiency at our retail, and, of course, increase the profitability of the Co-op. North Corridor Co-op strives to continually provide and enhance its guest experiences and services for its members and non-member customers alike.

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

May 15, 2024

Below is a brief summary of decisions at the May 15, 2024, Regular Council meeting:

Recreational Use and Facilities Bylaw 03-2024

Council gave second and third readings to draft Recreational Use and Facilities Bylaw 03-2024.

Draft Bylaw 07-2024 Special Levy for the Maintenance of the Long Lake Community Block Wells

Council gave second and third readings to draft Bylaw 07-2024 Special Levy for the Maintenance of the Long Lake Community Block Wells.

Draft Bylaw 08-2024 the 2024 Mill Rates Bylaw

Council gave second and third readings to Bylaw 08-2024 Mill Rates, as amended.

Long Lake Ski Hill and Area Feasibility Study

Council directed administration to proceed with a request for proposal for a Long Lake Ski Hill feasibility study to include capital and improvements of the ski hill and year-round recreation activities and future economic developments of the area.

Delegation - Alberta Environment and Protected Areas

Representatives from Alberta Environment and Protected Areas joined the Council meeting to present information including wetlands, the Water Act and activities that may require licenses from the department. Council accepted the presentation from Alberta Environment and Protected Areas for information.

Delegation - Shell

Representatives from Shell attended the Council meeting to provide an update on Quest Carbon and Storage project. Upon the conclusion of the presentation, Council accepted the presentation from Shell for information.

Tennis Court Area

Council approved additional funds in the sum of \$10,000 for the Tennis Court Area project with funds from the Recreational Reserves.

Newbrook Recreational and Agricultural Society Sponsorship Request

Council approved to sponsor the Newbrook Recreational and Agricultural Society in the amount of \$500.

Trailer Replacement Purchase

Council approved the purchase of a new 16' hauling trailer for \$7,673 with funds to come from insurance proceeds of \$2,880 and \$4,793 from the Fleet Equipment Reserves.

Correspondence for Action - Allam Farms Partnership

Council directed administration to contact Allam Farms regarding his concerns.

Correspondence for Information - Rural Municipalities of Alberta (RMA)

Council directed administration to write a letter to Premier Smith, Minister McIver, and MLA Van Dijken for the Reeve's signature regarding postponing the second and third reading of Bill 20 until municipalities can be consulted and include the key messages provided by the RMA.

Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program

Council directed administration to advertise that proposals are being accepted for the Thorhild County Family Medical Clinic. Council also directed administration to write a letter of concern regarding the new Nurse Practitioner Primary Care Program and to request a meeting with the Minister of Health.


Public Hearing - Bylaw 1648/23

Redistricting Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1648/23. The property owner wants to develop a multi-lot subdivision on their lands at NE-13-54-25-W4M in Sturgeon Valley. This land is currently districted as AG - Agriculture District, which does not allow this type of subdivision and development.


The land must be redistricted before a subdivision application can be submitted. The proposed bylaw would redistrict a portion of NE-13-54-25-W4M from AG - Agriculture District to R7 - Transitional Valley Residential District and PU - Public Utility District.

Each time land is redistricted, a bylaw is needed to amend the Land Use Bylaw, and a public hearing must be held.



Non-Statutory Public Hearing - Estates of Tuscany Outline Plan

Sturgeon County Council also requests public input through a non-statutory public hearing for the proposed Estates of Tuscany Outline Plan. This document would guide the future phases of planning and development of the same lands the property owner is seeking to redistrict (NE-13-54-25-W4M).



Note: collector roadway dedication is conceptual and subject to change at the detailed design stage once Range Road 250 has an approved concept plan.
