





contribute their expertise and perspectives to meaningfuldiscussions and decision-making processes. Surveys and Polls are a way to provide input and share opinions conveniently and anonymously. Finally, Public Hearings allow the public to voice opinions on specific matters directly to the council and contribute to the decision- making process.

Public hearings are important because they ensure fairness by giving everyone a chance

to speak directly to decision-makers. They promote community involvement and allow people to share their ideas, leading to better choices for everyone. Additionally, holding public hearings when required by law demonstrates adherence to rules and making decisions the right way. This commitment to fairness and transparency in the decision-making process fosters trust and confidence in the community. Overall, public hearings ensure that everyone has a say in the town's affairs,

contributing to a better community for all.

There are also additional ways for community members to provide input to the council beyond public hearings and open houses. These include Public Input Sessions, where community members can speak directly to the council about community issues or projects, and Delegations, where individuals can appear before the council with specific problems or concerns. However, there are limitations on the topics that can be addressed through

these avenues, such as legal matters, privacy issues, and matters already discussed in public hearings but have yet to be decided. These sessions offer valuable opportunities for community members to contribute to the decision-making process and help shape the future of the community.

Public participation is crucial for various reasons. Engaging the community in decision-making processes ensures that the needs and interests of the people are considered. Gathering

input from the public through methods such as input sessions, surveys, public forums, and council meetings is invaluable for making well-informed decisions that directly benefit the community as a whole. This inclusive approach fosters transparency, accountability, and legitimacy in the decision-making process, making each community member a vital part of the town's well-being.

What is a Green Sleeve?

Smoky Lake FCSS and Family Resource Network are creating awareness for community members and all Albertans to be informed and aware of the personal choices of healthintervention/ care services/support they want if there is an emergency.

They have recently proposed the question, "Do you know what a green sleeve is?" They cite that very few people seem to be aware of a green sleeve, even though it is available to anyone over the age of eighteen.

The Green Sleeve is a specialized plastic pocket that securely holds essential advance care planning

forms. It has been healthcare specifically created to house a blank personal directive form and a blank Goals of Care Designation (GCD) order form. If individuals have completed already their personal directive or GCD order, they can simply substitute their completed forms into the Green Sleeve, replacing the blank forms that initially come with the package. This ensures that all critical advance care planning documents are kept safe and organized in one convenient location.

The Advance Care Planning/Goals of Care Designation Tracking Record is a crucial component of the Green Sleeve. It is a tool used by

providers to meticulously detailed document conversations about a person's personal advance care plan and Goals of Care Designation (GCD). This comprehensive record is to be kept

in the Green Sleeve, serving as a reliable reference for all healthcare providers involved in the individual's care. It is a vital part of the Green Sleeve's functionality.



Green Sleeves can be obtained by asking your healthcare provider or ordering it online. When at home, Green Sleeves should be kept in a place easily accessible to emergency responders, such as on or near the fridge, emergency responders have been trained to look in that area for them. It is also important to take Green Sleeves to the hospital or to personal appointments and then return it to its designated spot once returning home.

Albertans are encouraged to further inform themselves by watching a green sleeves video on YouTube or by visiting MyHealth Alberta to learn more.

NOTICE – PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed Amendment of Land Use Bylaw 1194-2015

On proposed Bylaw 09-2024 which would amend Land Use Bylaw 1194-2015, by adding and deleting the wording of definitions below to the General Administrative Procedures – Section 1.7 Definitions and adding Recreational Vehicle (Park Model only) as a discretionary land use within the Long Lake Residential District as follows:

Section 1.7 Definitions -

Definition of Park model:

• **"Park model**" means a type of recreational vehicle; however, for the purposes of this Bylaw, park models are not allowed in any District within this Land Use Bylaw unless either recreational vehicles or recreational vehicle parks are listed as a permitted or a discretionary use within the District, and, further, that a park model has been specifically identified and approved by the Development Authority within an approved development permit. The approval of a Park Model by the Development Authority shall be a discretionary use, regardless of whether recreational vehicles or recreational vehicle parks are listed as a permitted or a discretionary use within the District. As well, park models shall not be used as dwellings within the municipality.

• Definition of Recreational vehicle:

"Recreational vehicle" means a vehicular type of unit primarily designed as temporary living quarters for recreational camping or travel use, which either has its own motor or is mounted or drawn by another vehicle. Recreational vehicles include travel trailers, camping trailers, truck campers, 5th wheels, or motor homes, but not manufactured homes, a park model, a garage package, or a cabin on any sort of transportation device such as skids or wheels up to a maximum interior space of 75 m2 (807.3 sq. ft.). Any vehicle larger than 75 m2 (807.3 sq. ft.) in interior space shall be considered to be a manufactured home for the purpose of this Bylaw.

8.8 RL - Long Lake Residential District, (3) Discretionary Uses

Existing Long Lake Residential District:

That Recreational vehicle (Park Models only) be added as a discretionary use under the discretionary column to the Long Lake Residential District.




2023 YEAR IN REVIEW
