On farmers who could make a living on a quarter section Then bigger operations was an Aggies's sole obsession


The farms grew larger by each year some spread from town to town

Aurora will be fulfilling a childhood dream of living in Victoria while earning a Bachelor of Arts the University of Victoria Climate Science Program.



Bylaw PD-01-2024 is a proposed amendment to the Town of Redwater's Land Use Bylaw PD-01-2023. The proposed amendments come following 6 months of working with the new bylaw to ensure it better meets the communities needs and addresses emerging issues

Bylaw PD-01-2024 will amend Bylaw PD-01-2023. The amending bylaw will provide greater flexibility and adaptability to the Town's land use regulations. These amendments will:

- Expand Permitted and Discrecionary Uses: Introduce new uses in specific districts such as deck, vehicle repair, vehicle servicing areas and intermodal storage units, allowing for more diverse and practical development options.
- Update Parking Requirements: Modify parking regulations to better accommodate mixed-use developments and residential uses in nonresidential districts, promoting efficient land use and reducing unnecessary parking spaces
- Enhance Regulations for Specific Uses: Provide alternative safety measures for private swimming pools and hot tubs, in line with provincial safety regulations, and prohibit the selling of eggs from urban hens, ensuring safety and addressing community concerns
- Clarify Definitions and Refences: add appropriate definitions and update as required for ease of document navigation

How can I get more information?

Any member of the public may review the proposed bylaw and ask questions. A copy of the proposed bylaw is available at redwater.ca or you can visit the Town Office during office hours where staff can explain what is proposed, how it might impact you, and how the Public Hearing process works.

Can I provide comments?

Members of the public wishing to address Council can attend the public hearing in person without registering to speak in advance. **However, those who wish to appear virtually must** register in advance by emailing redwater@redwater.ca or calling 780.942.3519 ext. 250 before 10:00 am on September 27, 2024. Interested parties can also submit written comments about the proposed bylaw by email before the public hearing. Each presenter will be allotted 10 minutes to speak. The names of persons providing comments will become part of the public record.



(and safer) trails.

Keep cool and in control

 Turn off cruise control when road conditions are wet, icy or snowy. You won't feel your wheels lose traction with your foot off the gas pedal.

- Always adjust your speed to road conditions.
- · It takes longer to stop on snow and ice. Maintain space between other vehicles on the road.
- Slow and steady the

Accelerate smoothly, maintain steady pressure on the gas pedal, and brake gently and early to avoid skids.

There's no substitute for good judgement

• Be choosy where you drive. Major roads are plowed and salted more frequently,

which can help you stav safe driving in snowy or icy conditions. And, because passersby are more likely, you'll be able to signal for help safely in the event of an accident.

· Be even choosier when you drive. Avoid driving in freezing

rain or snow squalls. Wait for calmer weather and clear, salted roads whenever possible. Give yourself

more time than usual when travelling, in case weather conditions worsen.





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Police Officers pack a bagged lunch to school

H. A. Kostash has initiated a remarkable program called "Lunch with a Cop" as part of its elementary school activities.

The program was launched in the fall of 2023 with the aim of engaging with the youth in the school.

The concept was inspired by Coffee with a Cop, adapted to suit the younger audience.

Every month, officers bring their lunch and sit down with the kids to eat and chat.

This program

aspires to show the line with community children that the police are there to help and support them.

Building strong, trusting relationships between law enforcement and the community is crucial for public safety and effective policing.

Police rely on community members provide information about crime and collaborate on finding solutions to crime-related issues.

In the same way, the community's trust in the police is based on whether they believe that the police act in values and incorporate principles of fairness and legitimacy.

The visibility of police in the community and their familiarity with residents are essential. Many people's interactions with the police are limited to callouts and law enforcement issues, leading to negative or uncertain perceptions of law enforcement and its officers. Encouraging non-enforcement interactions between police and community members helps reduce biases and


stereotypes.

It also allows ofunderficers to stand who local residents are, breaking down barriers and creating positive relationships.

Engaging in these activities, such as stopping to say hello as someone walks to work, leading a local youth bike parade or having lunch with the elementary students at their school, is a great way for officers to connect with the community and build

This approach helps dispel suspicions and

encourages a sense of law enforcement and partnership between residents.




