

The Thorhild & District Agricultural Society has ample reason to celebrate this year beyond the holiday season. After a whirlwind of activities, they proudly included the Grand Re-**Opening Ceremony in** their annual Light Up! event. On the evening of November 30, the Thorhild Waste Management of Canada Agriplex was abuzz with excitement as community members gathered to partake in cherished traditional Thorhild Light Up activities. Attendees enjoyed complimentary hotdogs and steaming cups of hot chocolate, while children delighted in a variety of free craft kits, showcasing their creativity. The venue also hosted a public skating session, and in a heartwarming touch, families had the opportunity to meet Santa Claus himself. The jolly figure distributed a remarkable eighty goodie bags, contributing to what Society Ag board members estimated to be one of their largest turnouts, with around 240 people flowing

through the doors. Adding to the festive atmosphere, Thorhild County Emergency Services made a special appearance with a portable s'more station, providing warmth and delicious treats for all to enjoy. The evening culminated in a dazzling fireworks display, generously sponsored by North Corridor Co-op.

The celebration took on an additional layer of significance with the unveiling improvements of made to the facility. The renovations encompassed a comprehensive upgrade of the lobby, bathrooms, and kitchen, transforming these spaces to better serve the community. Enhancements in the kitchen included a

new stove, cooler, flooring, fresh paint, countertops, ceiling tiles, cabinets, and prep tables, along with energy- efficient LED lighting that illuminated the kitchen, lobby, dressing rooms, and restrooms.

The bathrooms saw new countertops, flooring, paint, and mirrors, and the addition of updated puckboards and penalty box barriers. Entrance mats were installed for added comfort, while a new hot water tank and arena brine pump were also introduced.

A significant contribution came from Glen Van Dijken on behalf of the Alberta Government, who awarded the Thorhild Agricultural Society a substantial grant of \$100,000 through the Agricultural Societies I n f r a s t r u c t u r e Renewal Program.

Additionally, Alberta Fortis generously donated \$7,500 for the LED lighting upgrades, and the FCC Agrispirit pro-Fund vided another \$15,000 towards the installation of new doors set to be completed in the spring. Pembina also contributed \$2,500 toward the upgrade of the






