But the sap wasn't just a sweet treat; it was also valued for its medicinal properties, believed to promote healing and wellness. With a deep respect for nature, the Indigenous peoples considered the maple tree sacred, woven intrinsically social practices.

As time passed, the Indigenous ing and processing

maple syrup has remained firmly rooted in Canadian history.

Markedly, historical figures such as Jacques Cartier have even been linked to this connection of syrupy treats; historians mention Cartier recounting how he drank the sap from a felled walnut tree and likened it to fine wine.





TheTownofSmoky Lake and its surrounding communities are an integral part of a health initiative known as the North Zone Health Neighbourhood. This endeavour is designed to encommunity well-being by cultivating stronger connections beresidents and the health and community professionals dedicated to supporting overall health. This approach focuses on several key areas: spotlighting local support systems, promoting small individuals can take to enhance their own health, emphasizing various medical professional services available in the community.

Within this framework, Smoky Lake is a key player in the Four Directions Health Neighbourhood. This collective consists of community members and health professionals

committed to making health care an easier and more accessible part of daily life. Their mission is to promote a healthcare model that is centered on commuengagement and awareness. By examining the various factors that influence health, they look to create healthier communities through improved connections and increased understanding resources within reach of individuals. Alongside these goals, the Four Directions Health Neighbourhood offers a range of community services tailored to local needs.

Health Neighbourhoods serve as a combined platform that unites individuals from diverse backgrounds to enhance primary health care services for residents in Northern Alberta. The partinvolved in these Health Neighbourhoods are actively building bridges between

healthcare and social support sectors to elevate the primary health care experience for all Alberta Northern residents. By employing a collaborative, cross-sectoral strategy, they strive to promote inclusivity and ensure that communication remains accessible and easily understood by all community members. Importantly, Health Neighbourhoods are distinctly regionally based; the partners involved not only work in these areas but also live and participate actively in the communities they represent.

The North Zone Health Neighbourhoods embody a model of shared leadership where each member takes ownership of the collective work. The framework is continuously evolving; the partners aim develop navigation supports to guide community members through available resourcalongside organizing workshops, sharing impactful stories and enhancingnetworks. Communication improvements are also a key focus, building on existing community projects and initiatives.

There are currently four active Health Neighbourhoods in Northern that meet and maintain focused subgroups called "Mini Working Groups." These groups concentrate on specific aspects of community health to proactionable change and enhance the health care experience. The goal is to expand the Health Neighbourhood model to include more areas in the North Zone, improving the health and well-being of communities.

As indicated on their webpage, it is important to note, "The North Zone Health Neighbourhoods are grassroots in nature, and not owned Primary Care Networks or Alberta Health Services."

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
