MP Michael Cooper visits Diamond Spring Lodge to share Conservative platform with seniors

Residents of Diamond Spring Lodge in Redwater had the opportunity to hear directly from Michael Cooper, Member of Parliament for St. Albert-Sturgeon River, during a recent visit to the lodge. Cooper spoke with seniors about the Conservative Party's platform, highlighting several proposals aimed at easing the financial burden on older Canadians

and restoring affordability for all

One of the key promises discussed was a cut to the lowest income tax bracket, reducing it from 15 to 12.75 per cent. According to Cooper, this would result in savings of approximately \$900 per year for someone earning \$57,000.

The Conservatives are also proposing changes to the Tax-Free Savings



Account (TFSA) pro-Under the plan. Canadians would be allowed to contribute an additional \$5,000 annually to their TFSA, so long as the funds are invested in Canadian companies. In a further effort to encourage domestic investment, the party is promising to allow Canadians to defer capital gains taxes if those earnings are reinvested within Canada.

For seniors, several specific changes were outlined. The Conservative platform would allow seniors to earn up to \$34,000 per

tax-free—an year increase of \$10,000 from the current threshold. The plan also includes extending the period during which RRSPs can continue to grow by two more years. Importantly, age of eligibility for Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS), Old Age Security (OAS), and Canada Pension Plan (CPP) would remain at 65.

should not have to work. But they should not be punished when they choose to," said Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre. "We should reward rather than punish work. Those that choose to grow their savings for

longer should have the chance. And we will not raise the retirement age. Seniors will keep getting their OAS, GIS and CPP at age 65."

Cooper also criticized the federal Liberal government, stating, "After a lost Liberal decade, Canadian seniors can't afford a fourth Liberal term making Canadians poorer and Canada weaker. They need a new Conservative government that will lower taxes and put Canada first – for a change."

The Conservative Party, now branding itself as the "common sense Conservatives," is pledging to "axe taxes, stop crime, unleash the economy, and stand up to Trump from a position of strength." The party promises to protect seniors' savings, restore the Canadian promise, and ensure a secure retirement "in a safe and affordable home, under a proud flag."

The event at Diamond Spring Lodge gave local seniors a chance to hear and ask questions about how these proposed changes could affect them. Cooper's visit was part of a broader effort to connect directly with voters and discuss the Conservative Party's direction leading into the next federal election.

It's that time of year again

This is an important reminder regarding tax submissions for the upcoming tax season. The deadline for submitting your taxes to the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) is April 30, 2025, for the 2024 tax year. For those who have already completed and submitted their tax returns for the 2024 tax year, congratulations on your proactive approach. Timely filing

can help you avoid penalties and ensure you receive any eligible refunds without delays.

If you haven't yet filed your taxes, it is crucial to take action as soon as possible to avoid last-minute stress and potential penalties. Filing your taxes not only keeps you compliant with Canadian law, but it also allows you to take advantage of benefits and credits that may be available to you.

To assist those in

need of help, the Town of Smoky Lake has highlighted that Smoky Lake Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) in partnership with the CRA Community Volunteer Income Tax Program is available. This program offers free assistance with completing tax returns for eligible individuals, families, and seniors. The service will be available from March 1 to April 29, 2025.

To qualify for this

no-cost assistance, individuals must have a single income of below \$35,000. For households with dual income, the combined income must be below \$45,000. It is important to note that all tax situations handled through

this service must be simple and straightforward, and clients must provide (and have in hand) all necessary tax documents, such as T4 slips and other relevant paperwork, to ensure quick and accurate completion.



PROPERTY ASSESSMENT INSPECTIONS

Assessors from Municipal Assessment Services Group Inc. (MASG) will be conducting annual property assessment re-inspections on behalf of Thorhild County beginning April 2025, and will continue throughout the coming weeks in spring/summer 2025.

Thorhild County conducts re-inspections of properties in different areas of the county each year to ensure the property assessment data is accurate.

The areas this year include townships: 62-18, 63-18, 61-20, 59-21, 58-23, 60-23.

Assessors will be on-site walking the properties involved and taking exterior photos. They will not require access into your home or buildings.

The assessors usually check in with you first to make you aware they are entering your property.

These inspections are essential to ensure fair, accurate and reliable property assessment information; and are authorized by the Municipal Government Act (MGA) (Section 294).

Assessors will be in marked vehicles with the Municipal Assessment Services Group Inc. logo on doors and wearing photo ID under the same name.

Looking to the future, the Radway Agricultural Society is incredibly grateful for its vendors and their ongoing support and presence and aims to build on this amazing vendor list by





PUBLIC HEARING – Bylaw 1676/25 Amendment to Land Use Bylaw 1385/17

Sturgeon County Council requests public input on proposed Bylaw 1676/25.

The property owner would like to operate a carbon sequestration facility within a part of NE-29-57-25-W4M. To better address the development, the Land Use Bylaw is proposed to be amended in two ways:

Change the definition of gas processing plant to a more generic description related to the process while also adding a reference to carbon sequestration, thereby reflecting the approval the facility has received from the Alberta Energy Regulator (AER).

The area which is covered by an existing lease is being proposed to be redistricted from AG – Agriculture to I1 -Rural Industry Support. It was determined that the I1 – Rural Industry Support in this instance would reflect the proposed use and help address any potential co-locating development that may not be subject to the same AER oversight.

The proposed development is subject to regulation by the AER, from whom it has received approval. As the development has been approved by the AER, the County is obligated to issue a development permit and make any necessary amendments to the Land Use Bylaw to facilitate the development. 

If making a written submission, you must include your name, state your interest in the matter (such as a County resident directly impacted by the proposed bylaw), and indicate if you are in favour of or opposed to the proposed bylaw.

I?" poems using information they had researched themselves.

Participation is completely voluntary. Stephanie Young, Chairperson of the Friends group, visits the school each year to speak at an assembly and hand out information to encourage kids to sign up. Notices also go out through posters and the library website to ensure all children in the community have the opportunity to participate.

"It is strictly by choice. The president of the group attends an assembly at Ochre Park School and gives a short presentation to inform the children of the upcoming event," said Young. "An information letter is given to the school as well as the teacher in each participating grade. The children decide if they wish to attend or not."

Budding Authors began in 2005 and has continued annually—except during COVID-related closures. The idea was sparked by the belief that while kids often write in school, they rarely get the chance to

present their work in front of an audience. The event was created to give them that opportunity and build their confidence.

"Budding Authors began in 2005, and has been held each year since except when the library was closed due to COVID," Young explained. "The group knew children had a chance to write in school but didn't necessarily have the opportunity to share their writing with an audience present.

It was decided to hold the Budding Authors Event to give the children a platform to accomplish this."

The Friends group plays a hands-on role—organizing the event, contacting parents, setting up the space, providing childcare for younger siblings, and even emceeing the evening. Every young writer received a certificate, a treat bag, and a writing booklet to inspire future stories.

It was clear from the proud smiles and applause that Budding Authors remains a beloved Redwater tradition—one that celebrates creativity, courage, and community.
