



## Thorhild Tradeshow and Family Fair was a day for togetherness



being recorded. Members did an exceptional job caring for their animals this year. After weighing in, everyone enjoyed a lunch of hot dogs and goodies provided by the North Corridor Co-op.

Following lunch, members returned to grooming and prepping their animals for show, with invaluable assistance from alumni 4-H members Justin Turko, Shane Turko, Caleb Hyde, and Jacob Hyde, their support cannot be thanked enough. The show kicked off at 12:30 PM with the heifer class, judged by Cache Schillar and ringmaster Hanna Gregorie. Daniel Kozma took home the Grand Champion Heifer title, while Harper MacMillan secured the Reserve Champion Heifer. Next, in the 2-year-old cow-calf class, Alyssa Ollikka won Grand Champion, and Raelynn Ollikka earned Reserve Champion.

The event then shifted to grooming and showmanship classes, judged by Kord Phillips. In senior showmanship, Gus Shwetz claimed 1st place, with Shelby Dowhan in 2nd. For grooming, Cohen Ollikka took 1st, and Shelby Dowhan again took 2nd. In the intermediate division, Willow Lyons won 1st place in showmanship, with Harper MacMillan in 2nd, while Makenna Ollikka won grooming and Willow Lyons placed 2nd.

In the junior category, Brinell Beatch won 1st place showmanship, and Kenley Nendze took 2nd, with Daniel Kozma and Aria Day winning 1st and 2nd in grooming, respectively.

Following the showmanship and grooming classes, a

poultry health check was included, demonstrating how to assess chickens for vitality. Four members participated in poultry this year, each raising three meat birds for sale.

The swine class followed with four participants. Despite some challenges with growth, the members exhibited their animals. Grand Champion Swine went to Ruby Olah, and Reserve Champion went to Mackenzie Stevens. In senior swine showmanship, Mackenzie Stevens took 1st, with Carter Stevens in 2nd, while Annabelle Stevens won junior showmanship and Ruby Olah placed 2nd.

Members raising carcass animals were also recognized, joining Bon Accord 4-H Beef Club and Golden Sunset 4-H Club with 22 animals in carcass competition. Alyssa Ollikka won overall and Gavin Ollikka finishing second. Alyssa also won for the carcass rate of gain with an impressive 3.15 lbs/day.

The steers consisted of 5 classes, culminating in an overall champion. Denver Lyons achieved the market steer rate of gain with 3.61 lbs/day. The Grand Champion Steer was Willow Lyons with Big Arch at 1465 pounds, sold to Jaynart Drilling for \$8.00/lb, while Raelynn Ollikka's steer Meiko weighed 1490 pounds, fetching \$6.45/lb from JGM Enterprises.

Aggregate winners were also celebrated, with Aria Day as Junior Aggregate winner, Harper MacMillan as Intermediate, and Gus Shwetz as Senior Aggregate. The efficiency award went to Gavin Ollikka.

Before the sale began, 50/50 draw winner, Dylan Mulak, kindly donated his winnings back to the club. The sale

began at 5:00 PM with auctioneer Shawn Gusset, starting with market chickens sold for \$190 to \$625 each, followed by market swine, with prices ranging from \$850 to \$1500 per animal. The market steer sale averaged \$6.06/lb and members had pre-booked butcher spots at Country Quality Meats (or butcher of their choice) for buyers.

4-H Achievement Day is essential part of any 4-H Club, it helps participants show the development in skills in animal husbandry and responsibility while applying their knowledge in a supportive, competitive environment. It promotes community engagement through the support of families and local businesses, provides recognition for hard work that boosts confidence, and offers networking opportunities with peers and industry professionals. Additionally, the event promotes animal welfare and responsible farming practices, educating the community and equipping members with valuable life skills such as leadership and teamwork, making it a vital platform for personal growth and agricultural education.

The Newbrook 4-H Club congratulates all its members on their hard work and offers a huge thank you to Waste Management of Thorhild for their steer purchase that was donated back to the club for resale. 



## RCMP ROYAL CANADIAN MOUNTED POLICE

**Redwater RCMP is encouraging residents to use the province-wide phone line for non-emergency Police reporting.**

The Redwater RCMP is reminding residents that 310-RCMP (310-2767) remains a fully active province-wide phone line dedicated to handling non-emergency police matters. Whether you need to report a suspicious person, property damage, or a minor theft, this number connects you directly to the appropriate RCMP detachment—no area code required. The 310-RCMP line is an important tool that helps streamline the reporting process, ease pressure on 911 services, and support more efficient police responses to non-urgent

incidents.

310-RCMP calls are directed to the Alberta Operational Communication Centre who then dispatch non-emergency calls in the order of their priority. The number is accessible to all Albertans within the province with a phone line or an active mobile phone with a cellular signal.

Non-emergencies:

- Do not pose an immediate or potential threat to life or public safety.
- Include crimes that have already taken place prior to being discovered.
- Often do not require police attendance but do require police response.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Minor motor vehicle collisions.

- Break and enters that already took place.
- Scams in which money or personal information was not transferred or provided.
- Lost property.
- Property damage under \$5,000.
- Theft under \$5,000.

While these types of reports are important, they are not an emergency.

Ways to report non-emergencies:

- Call 310-RCMP (7267)
- To report online, download the Alberta RCMP app through Apple or Google Play. Alternatively, visit [www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/ab](http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/ab) and select Online Crime Reporting under quick links.
