

ing, the bonds formed between fellows cowboys, or the simple joys found in nature.

Smith's storytelling is infused with a sense of nostalgia, transporting his audience to a time when life was slower and more connected to the land. With a blend of humor and reflection, he brings to life the daily struggles and triumphs faced by those living in rural areas. His performances are not just recitals of poetry; they are engaging narratives that resonate with the experiences of his listeners.

Rose Bibby is an enchanting voice in the realm of cowboy poetry, celebrated for her poignant storytelling and evocative imagery. Her work often cap-

tures the heart and soul of rural life, drawing from her own experiences and the rich heritage of the West.

Bibby's poems reflect the beauty of the prairie landscape, the camaraderie of ranch life, and the deep connection to nature that many have come to cherish.

What sets Bibby apart is her unique perspective as a woman in a traditionally male-dominated genre. She infuses her poetry with not only the challenges and triumphs of cowboy life but also the nuanced experiences of women who make significant contributions to ranching and rural communities. Her verses are filled with vivid descriptions that transport her audience to open fields, starlit skies, and the everyday

realities of ranch work.

At the Poetry, Pierogies, and Prairie Pride evening hosted by the Radway Agricultural Society, Rose Bibby captivated her audience with her warm personality and engaging performances.

Through their words, Smith and Bibby had a knack for pulling in their audience and inviting everyone to celebrate what it means to be a part of prairie culture. They told the stories that define it.
