Preparing trees and shrubs for winter

Preparing trees and shrubs for winter in Alberta is essential for their health and survival amid freezing temperatures and harsh conditions. Start by giving your plants a deep watering in the fall, as moisture helps them withstand cold weather being sure to water them well until the ground freezes. Additionally, applying a layer of mulch around the base of your trees and shrubs using organic materials like shredded bark, wood chips, or straw is beneficial. Mulch retains soil moisture, insulates the roots from extreme cold, and prevents frost heaving. Late fall is also a good time to prune any dead or damaged branches, but it's important to avoid heavy pruning as it may encourage new growth that won't have time to harden off before winter. Focus on removing crossing branches and diseased parts instead.

For younger or more vulnerable trees, consider wrapping the trunk with tree wrap or burlap to help prevent sunscald and damage from rodents, making sure not to wrap too tightly to avoid restricting growth. Protecting the bark from rodents is also crucial, and this can be achieved using tree guards or wraps, especially for young trees, these barriers deter animals from gnawing on the trunks. If someone has sensitive shrubs or

"I started this group because I saw how many women, especially those over 40, were struggling quietly," Sherrie shares. "So many of us spend our lives taking care of others, and somewhere along the way, we lose touch

with who we are. I wanted to create a safe space where women could rediscover their strength, rebuild confidence, and feel supported every step of the way."

As a Clinical Hypnotherapist, Master Life Coach, Personal Trainer, and Bodybuilder, Sherrie understands that healing and growth come from both inner and outer

strength. Her group brings together women who are ready to work on self-worth, confidence, and setting healthy boundaries and achieving goals. Pillars she believes are essential for lasting change.

Each one-hour session, held bi-weekly at Essentially Balanced in Redwater, is filled with laughter, conversation, and genuine connection. Participants are encouraged to share their stories, reflect, and take part

in mindset coaching and group discussions focused on empowerment and self-care.

“There’s such a sense of belonging that happens in that room,” Sherrie says. “We talk, we laugh, sometimes we cry—but everyone leaves feeling lighter, supported, and more confident. It’s truly about community over competition.”

While many of the participants are women over 40, the group welcomes all ages

and backgrounds. “It doesn’t matter if you’re 25 or 65—what unites us is our desire to grow and support one another,” Sherrie adds. “Every woman brings her own story, and that diversity makes the group so powerful.”

Each session ends with a guided meditation or hypnosis exercise tailored to the evening’s theme. Sherrie describes this closing moment as “a beautiful time of calm and clarity” that helps participants release stress and reconnect with

themselves.

The heart of Women Supporting Women shines through the women who attend. Many describe it as more than just a group—it’s a lifeline of encouragement, understanding, and personal growth.

Donna, who recently moved to Redwater, joined to connect with like-minded women who value self-care. “The support and openness of everyone helps,” she says. “I’ve learned I’m stronger and more resilient than

I give myself credit for. It’s reassuring to know I’m on the right path.”

Nicole shared that she joined because she needed a space to talk and feel understood.

“Women just get it,” she explains. “Every time I come, I learn something new, whether it’s from others’ experiences, new techniques for dealing with life, or simply realizing we all go through tough things. It’s a safe and easy space.”

Joanne, who has known Sherrie for years through personal

training and hypnosis, adds,

“This group helps me stay focused and connected with others who share similar struggles and goals. It keeps me accountable and reminds me I’m not alone.”

As Women Supporting Women enters its second season, Sherrie says she’s deeply grateful for the women who show up and for Essentially Balanced for providing the space that makes these gatherings possible.

Her mission remains

clear: to help women see their worth, find their confidence, and know that they’re never alone on their journey.

“This group isn’t just about self-improvement,” Sherrie reflects. “It’s about self-discovery and community. When women come together with open hearts and lift each other up, incredible things happen.”



Strong but signs of slowing: New residential construction in Alberta

Strong but signs of slowing: New residential construction in Alberta

Despite rising in September, the latest numbers on housing starts point to some moderation in new home construction in Alberta.

Alberta's housing starts averaged almost 51,000** units in the third quarter (July-September), down 22% from the previous quarter and the first significant quarterly drop since 2023.

Starts are, however,

still strong compared to last year with year-to-date (YTD) starts up 22% compared to the same nine months in 2024. The growth was largely fueled by a 29% surge in multi-unit dwellings, with single-unit builds rising 8%.

In urban areas (populations over 50,000), purpose-built rental unit construction posted a 43% YTD increase, mirroring a national trend. Alberta, however, stands out with a 9% YTD increase in starts intended for the owner-occupied market compared to a 5% decline in the rest of Canada.

Although 2025 is projected to set a new record for annual housing starts in Alberta, the momentum is anticipated to slow next year due to cooling population growth.

*A housing start is defined as the beginning of construction work on the building where the dwelling unit will be located. This can be described in two ways: 1) The stage when the concrete has been poured for the whole of the footing around the structure. 2) An equivalent stage where a basement will not be part of the structure.





Keep your money safe from sneaky screen scraping

(NC) Have you ever signed up for an app that promised to simplify your finances, only to wonder why it needs your online banking password? If the request gave you an uneasy feeling, you may have had good reason to distrust it.

Some financial technology, or fintech, apps use a method called screen scraping to log into your bank account. The app asks you for your username and password. Then, it uses that access to pull financial data like

balances, transactions and even investments so that the app can manage them in one place. It may sound convenient, but it's a cybersecurity nightmare.

- Handing over your login information means giving up more than just your username and password:
- You're giving a third party access to all the sensitive information you usually guard safely.
- You risk losing your legal protection

against unauthorised transactions.

- Your bank may not repay your losses if your data gets breached.

The access you give out matters

Some things, like government services, use banks as sign-in partners to access your account. This isn't the same thing as screen scraping because you still sign in through the bank itself, and the bank provides confirmation for the secure

login—your information stays secure.

With screen scraping, you're giving a third-party app your banking login, letting it see and potentially make changes to your account. That includes personal information, transaction history, the products you use and more. And because it's logging in with information you gave, if something goes wrong it can be extremely difficult to prove you're not at fault.

Even if the app markets itself as secure, giving a fintech company this kind of access to your account may go against your bank's terms of use.

That's why experts, as well as the Government of Canada, advise against it.

How to protect yourself:

- Never share your banking credentials with an app, by text or email or over the phone.
- Avoid apps that

ask for your bank password, no matter how helpful they claim to be.

- Use only secure, approved channels to access your financial data.

Fraud is evolving fast, and screen scraping is one of the sneakiest ways bad actors can get to your money. The best defence is always keeping your passwords to yourself.

Three AI-powered scams to watch out for

(NC) One of the biggest transformations artificial intelligence (AI) is driving is in the area of fraud. AI lets fraudsters impersonate more easily, personalize their scams and move faster than ever before. According to Mastercard, here are three scams where it's playing a major role, and ways to keep yourself safe.

The grandparent scam: This is a good example of how fraudsters can use AI to personalize their scams like never before. Fraudsters will target seniors with a phone call when they're off-guard or vulnerable. Using AI they will alter their voice to sound like a family member in distress who needs money right away.

Calls like this are meant to play on your emotions, so listen to your instincts. Ask yourself: Why would money be what they

need, instead of help in some other way? If you are unsure, call them back using the number you have for them. Also, consider having a "secret word" that only family members know, to help verify identity.

The fake order: This is a type of phishing scam, where fraudsters send a message designed to look like it's coming from a legitimate source, in order to get sensitive information or login credentials from you. A common version is sending a fake invoice or confirmation for an online order.

Treat any unexpected messages like this with suspicion. Fraudsters often pose as businesses you trust. Never click on links or use any contact information from this type of message. Reach out to the business yourself through the phone number or contact form on the company's website.

They're victims of the scam, too, and can work with you to get to the truth.

Authorized push payment (APP) fraud: AI tools can let fraudsters ask you for legitimate-seeming fast payments that often go through before your financial institution can react. They usually focus on impersonating quick but necessary payments, such as Canada Revenue Agency back taxes, bank overdraft fees or credit card bills.

Thanks to the speed of AI, all it takes is a moment's lapse in attention

for someone to send what could be an irreversible payment. But, AI is also being used to strengthen fraud prevention. Payment providers, like Mastercard, have developed tools that work in the background while you complete a purchase. These systems are designed to detect this type of fraud automatically, in real-time and stop the fraudulent transaction in its tracks.

It's up to all of us to be more cyber safe—better cybersecurity makes for a safer community.






