# Redwater Citizens on Patrol stay active in crime prevention efforts

The Redwater Citizens on Patrol Association continues to play an active role in supporting community safety through volunteer patrols, community engagement and crime prevention

initiatives. The Redwater Citizens on Patrol Association is a not-for-profit local chapter of Alberta Citizens on Patrol. Volunteers donate their time to patrol the community, acting as the eyes and ears for the local RCMP by reporting suspicious

activity and helping deter crime through a visible presence in the area.

The group currently has 12 volunteers who conduct patrols throughout Redwater at various times during the day and night depending on their personal schedules. Patrols are carried out

by two volunteers at a time using the Citizens on Patrol vehicle, bicycles or on foot.

Members use the Alberta Citizens on Patrol mobile app to log patrol routes, kilometres and volunteer hours. The app also allows volunteers to record details of suspicious activity and photos, with reports submitted directly to the local RCMP at the end of each patrol.

During the past month alone, volunteers contributed approximately 50 hours of service while completing more than 125 kilometres of patrols in and around Redwater. In addition to patrol work, members also attended several local events and meetings aimed at strengthening communication between residents, community organizations and police.

President Henry Goeckel and vice-president Jan Cosby attended the Redwater town council meeting on Feb. 24 to assist with discussions involving the RCMP and municipal officials regarding policing priorities for the 2026-2027 period.

The organization

also hosts "Coffee with the Cops" gatherings where residents can meet members of the local RCMP detachment, ask questions and discuss concerns affecting the community. Recent sessions were held at the Redwater Pioneer Club and Pembina Place.

Citizens on Patrol volunteers have also been involved in several local crime prevention initiatives. During a recent patrol, members delivered window decals to local businesses that can be displayed to help deter criminal activity. Businesses in the Redwater Industrial Park and the Town of Redwater have also had the opportunity to place gate signs at business entrances and locations leading into town as part of the program's ongoing prevention efforts.

Members of the Redwater group recently attended the Sturgeon Rural Crime Watch Association meeting where consumer protection expert and fraud prevention educator Julie Matthews delivered a presentation on recognizing scams. The session covered topics

such as phone scams, email and text scams, social media fraud, identity theft, catfishing and romance scams.

Volunteers Dave McRae, Sophie Smith and Jan Cosby attended the meeting where community members learned how to recognize warning signs of fraud and better protect themselves.

The Redwater Citizens on Patrol Association is also planning to host an event during Police Week in May and may organize additional educational seminars in the community later this year.

The organization is currently looking for additional volunteers interested in helping support community safety. Individuals wishing to join must complete a criminal record check and obtain RCMP recommendations through the application process. Those wishing to drive the patrol vehicle must also provide a clean driver's abstract.

Volunteer patrols typically require only a few hours per month and offer residents an opportunity to play an active role in helping keep their community safe.



## Smoky Lake RCMP shares tips to protect against fraud

Smoky Lake RCMP reminds residents about the importance of staying vigilant as more of our daily activities take place online and over the phone. With the rise in digital communication, fraudsters are finding new ways to scam unsuspecting victims.

Smoky Lake RCMP offers the following tips on how to protect yourself from online fraud and scams:

- Protect your computer and accounts and be cautious of urgent-looking pop-ups and suspicious emails with spelling or formatting errors.
- Don't click on unknown links or

attachments.

- Use anti-virus software and keep your operating system up to date.
- Secure your online accounts with strong and unique passwords.
- Do not use the same password for numerous accounts.
- Don't be afraid to say no. If a caller pressures you to buy something or send money immediately, hang up. Scammers often create a sense of urgency to manipulate victims.
- Confirm the legitimacy of businesses by checking official websites and contacting them directly before you act. If someone calls about

a family member in trouble, reach out to others before acting.

- Guard your personal information and never share personal details (name, address, birthdate, banking info, etc.) unless you initiated the contact. You never know who's on the other end of an unsolicited call or message.

- Beware of upfront fees. In Canada, legitimate prizes do not require fees or taxes to claim.
- If you didn't enter a contest, you're not a winner.

## Don't take the bait: spotting AI scams before they spot you

This March, the Alberta RCMP shares a variety of tips and resources in support of the Alberta Community Crime Prevention Association's (ACCPA) Fraud Prevention Month campaign. The campaign seeks to educate Albertans on the many ways that fraudulent activity negatively impacts their communities.

Today's theme is artificial intelligence (AI) scams, which may include any of the following:

- Voice cloning scams
- AI-generated kidnapping calls
- Deepfake video impersonation
- Romance scams enhanced by AI chatbots
- AI-generated investment advisors
- Fake customer

support agents

- Phishing emails and texts written by AI
- AI-assisted job interview scams
- Synthetic identity fraud
- AI-generated rental or marketplace listings

"AI-generated content can look flawless, feel personal, and reach anyone. That is why staying alert is crucial. The more we learn to spot the subtle warning signs, the harder it becomes for scammers to turn powerful tools into targeted traps."



# Sturgeon County inspires future first responders through YES Academy

Sturgeon County is continuing to engage local youth through its Youth Emergency Services (YES) Academy, a dynamic program designed for individuals aged 14 to 17 who are interested in careers in emergency response.

The academy will be held at the Riviere Qui Barre Arena and Hall and runs over three days, with participants given the option to stay overnight for two nights. Throughout the program, recruits are introduced to the realities of emergency services through hands-on learning. Physical training, scenario-based exercises, and presentations from experienced professionals

are combined to create an environment that reflects real-world conditions in the field.

Participants take part in a variety of activities that highlight different emergency response roles. In previous years, these have included live firefighting exercises, demonstrations from police dog units, and presentations from emergency medical personnel and other specialized teams. Recruits may also gain exposure to tactical training techniques and equipment used by law enforcement and military personnel.

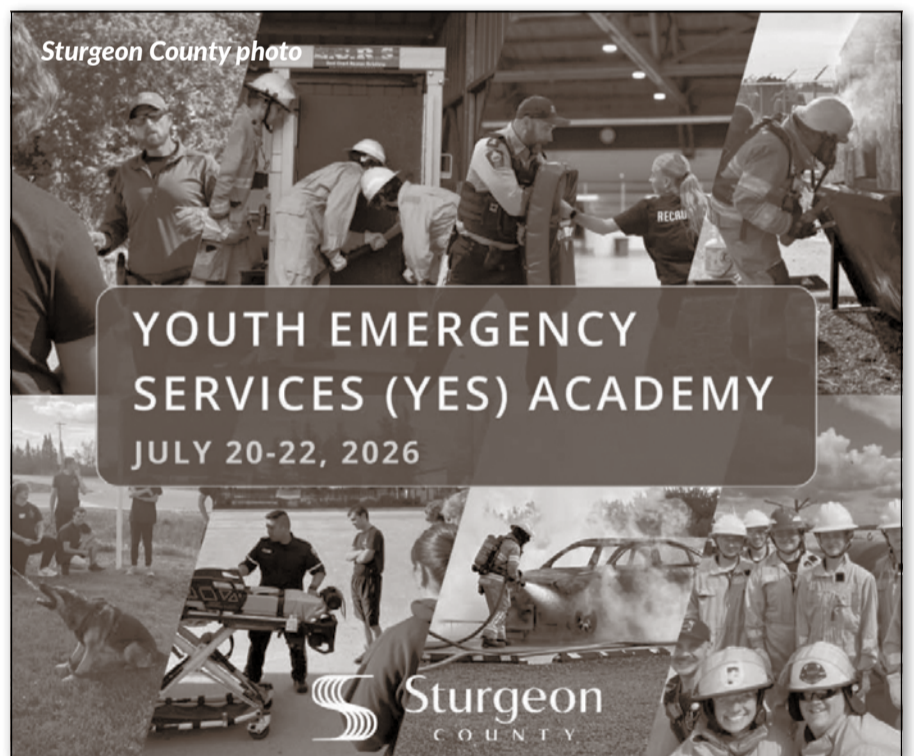
Beyond technical skills, the YES Academy places a strong emphasis on personal



growth. Team-based challenges and structured routines encourage recruits to build confidence, improve communication, and develop leadership abilities. The program is designed to push participants both physically and mentally, while fostering a sense of discipline and cooperation.

building meaningful life skills. By connecting participants with professionals and offering realistic training
