## Eight bicycles given away during Redwater summer cycling event

Local children learned bicycle safety skills, received free helmets and prizes, and some went home with bicycles of their own during the Redwater Family Recreation Association's Gearing Up for

Summer event on June 6.

Held at the Redwater outdoor rink, the event attracted approximately 30 participants, not including volunteers, and focused on promoting safe cycling while helping local families access bicycles and equipment.

The day began with families arriving early in hopes of securing one of the donated

bicycles available through the program. In total, eight bicycles were given away to local children.

Participants took part in a bicycle safety rodeo featuring helmet checks, obstacle courses, figure-eight riding and pylon challenges designed to improve bike-handling skills and rider confidence. Children who

completed the safety activities were entered into prize draws for cycling-related items, including bike pumps, multi-tools, bike spoke covers and under-seat storage packs.

Safety pamphlets were also handed out for children to colour and take home, while Jolly Rancher suckers were distributed during the

event.

Older riders had an opportunity to learn safe trick-riding techniques from Aaron Dobler, who also entertained spectators with a bicycle trick-riding demonstration.

The event relied heavily on community support. North Corridor Co-op provided a

# Smoky Lake RCMP Report

Smoky Lake RCMP members responded to a report of a possible stolen debit card during the reporting period. After locating the complainant, officers determined she was impaired and her account of events changed several times. She was arrested on outstanding warrants, and no evidence was found to indicate a debit card had been stolen or used.

Police received a report involving a suicidal female; however, EMS attended the scene and later advised that police assistance was not required. Members also investigated a driving complaint involving

a vehicle reportedly crossing the centre line but were unable to locate the vehicle. In another traffic-related matter, EMS reported a suspect vehicle passed an ambulance while emergency lights and sirens were activated. That investigation remains ongoing.

RCMP assisted with a domestic dispute to prevent further escalation and responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle near Range Road 141 and Township Road 602. The vehicle was not stolen, and after speaking with the registered owner, members determined there was nothing suspicious.

Police are investigating an attempted break-in at the Vilna Bottle Depot after unknown suspect(s) attempted to gain entry.

Officers also responded to concerns for the well-being of a female near the Esso station in Spedden. The woman was located and EMS was dispatched to provide assistance.

A complaint was received regarding a dark blue Dodge truck pulling a horse trailer that was reportedly stunt driving within the Town of Smoky Lake. Members identified the driver and issued a verbal warning. In a separate incident, a local building in Smoky Lake sustained damage when a glass pane was broken. No access was gained to the building.

RCMP received a complaint involving two individuals who were to be removed from a residence in the Town of Smoky Lake. Following investigation, the matter was

determined to be civil in nature. Members also responded to a report of a semi-truck in the ditch on Highway 855 north of Vic Trail. There was no damage, and the driver advised the vehicle entered the ditch to avoid a collision.

A 911 open-line call led officers to a male in the Town of Smoky Lake who was experiencing heart palpitations and believed he was suffering a heart attack. Medical attention was obtained. Members also investigated a 911 hang-up call involving a female who was upset and wanted her keys returned. The matter was resolved between friends, and the reported theft was determined to be unfounded.

Police continue to investigate a possible

unauthorized possession of a firearm. Members also assisted in resolving a misunderstanding between two parties and responded to a 911 call from H.A. Kostash School, where it was determined that no one required assistance.

A parking complaint within the Town of Smoky Lake was followed up on by members. RCMP also received a report that a vehicle had struck a semi-trailer approximately five kilometres east of Waskatenau. Damage was minimal, although the type of vehicle involved remains unknown. A stolen vehicle was located burned near Township Road 594, and the investigation remains ongoing. Police also received reports of suspicious activity near

McDougall Drive in the Town of Smoky Lake on June 6 at approximately 7:30 p.m.

Members responded to a report of a suicidal female in Smoky Lake County who had a plan to end her life. She was apprehended under the Mental Health Act and transported to St. Paul Hospital for assessment. A Town of Smoky Lake resident reported a cat stranded atop an electrical pole. The owner contacted the Smoky Lake Fire Department for assistance. RCMP also received a complaint regarding an alleged breach of a restraining order. After reviewing the order, police determined the matter was civil in nature and not enforceable by police.

# A spring harvest of spruce tips and pollen

As spring breathes new life into surrounding forests, foragers eagerly await two unique seasonal treasures...spruce tips and spruce pollen. These fleeting delights, harvested

from the iconic spruce tree, are gaining attention for their culinary potential, ecological significance, and nutritional value.

Spruce tips, the tender, bright-green newgrowth at

the end of spruce branches, emerge for just a few weeks in late spring. Their citrusy, slightly resinous flavour has long been appreciated by Indigenous peoples and wild food

enthusiasts. Today, chefs and home cooks are incorporating spruce tips into everything from syrups and teas to

baked goods and pickles. They are prized for their

high vitamin C content and refreshing taste. Harvesting spruce tips is a mindful activity. Foragers are advised to take only a few tips from each tree to ensure the spruce continues to grow healthily. Sustainable harvesting practices help maintain the delicate balance of forest ecosystems, benefiting wildlife and future generations of foragers.

A lesser known but equally intriguing forest product is the spruce pollen. For a brief window (usually a few days to a week in late spring) male spruce cones release clouds of yellow pollen into the air. While often considered a nuisance, this pollen is actually a nutritious superfood, rich in protein, vitamins, and minerals. Foragers gently shake branches or collect fallen pollen from clean surfaces, taking care not to disrupt the tree's reproductive cycle.

Spruce pollen has a mild, earthy flavor and can be used as a flour substitute, thickener, or nutritious addition to smoothies and energy bars (people should always consult professionals before consuming anything in the wild). Its harvesting requires impeccable timing and careful attention to weather conditions, as rain or wind can quickly disperse the powder.

Both spruce tips and pollen represent a connection to the land and the rhythms of the seasons. They

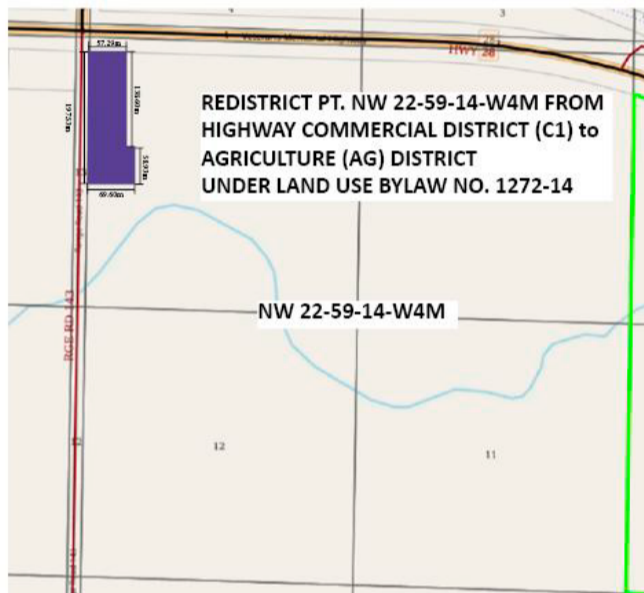

Continued from **page 12** interest in wild foods continues to grow, there is an emphasis on the importance of ethical foraging, seeking permission on private land, respecting local regulations, and always harvesting with sustainability in mind. Spruce tips and pollen are reminders of the gifts provided by forests, and of the responsibility everyone shares in protecting them.


